DLNR AUCTION – To permit the harvesting and distribution of water **Dick Mayer Jan., 22, 2020** from Four (4) East Maui water lease areas.

The Maui Board of Water Supply requests that the Hawai'i Department of Land and Natural Resources (DLNR) come to the 1:30pm, Thursday, February 20, 2020 Maui County Board of Water Supply meeting to discuss the <u>auction format and conditions</u> with regard to the auction of the four lease areas in the East Maui watershed.

Questions for DLNR: Auction of Four (4) East Maui Water Leases

What exactly will be auctioned?

- 1. What will be the conditions placed on the auction "winner"?
- 2. Will there be one lease or four leases?
- 3. What will be the lease?
- 4. How often will there be <u>reviews of the lease</u>, its operations and its conditions during the long lease period? Every 5 years? 10 years?
- 5. Who will have <u>responsibility for enforcing the lease</u> conditions? Someone on Maui? DLNR? Maui Department of Water Supply? CWRM?

7. In the auction agreement what are the **penalties for non-compliance** with the auction conditions? For example: If too much water is taken from a stream? Or if some of the water is sold for non-agricultural uses? Or the watershed is not being properly maintained?

8. What conditions, restrictions and limits are in place regarding the ability of a leaseholder to transfer their entire lease to someone else? Or to sub-lease part of it to a third party?

Sale of Water

- 9. Will the auction winner be **allowed to sell water** to whomever they wish?
- 10. What prices will they be allowed to charge for that water?
- 11. Who will regulate the rates over the lease's long-term period? PUC? DLNR? BLNR?
- 12. Will they be required to sell the water at the same price to anyone who buys the water?
- 13. Will the water that is sold be allowed to be used for any other uses <u>besides:</u> <u>a) agriculture</u>; <u>b) Hawaiian Homelands</u>; <u>and c) the Maui County Department of Water Supply</u> (for distribution to UpCountry residents?
- 14. Are there strict prohibitions on the use and sale of the water for **non-agricultural uses**?

15. Will the auction winner be <u>required to supply adequate water to UpCountry residents</u> and farmers, even in times of drought?

16. What will be the obligation of whomever wins the auction <u>to supply water to the Hawaiian</u> <u>Homelands</u>, both in the UpCountry Maui area, and in the Pulehunui area of Central Maui?

17. What requirements will be placed on the winner of the auction to **maintain and improve the East Maui watershed**?

18. What legal obligations will the winner of the auction have t<u>o provide access for hikers and or hunters</u> within the watershed area?

19. How will the **Maui Water Resource and Development Plan** dovetail with the conditions in the auction requirements?

20. What will be the relationship between the **auction winner and the Maui County Department of Water Supply**?

21. <u>Who will be allowed to bid at the auction</u>? What requirements must any bidder have to be able to bid and to win the auction?

22. Will the winner of the auction be required to **<u>improve and line the many reservoirs</u>** on the Mahi Pono owned land?
