SUPPORTING THE UNDIVIDED INTEREST AWARDS POLICY OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HAWAIIAN HOME LANDS' HOMESTEADING PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act of 1920, enacted in 1921, set aside approximately 200,000 acres of Hawaiian home lands in trust for a homesteading program of residential, agricultural, and pastoral lands; and

WHEREAS, those lands are administered through the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands for the benefit of Native Hawaiians, persons with 50 percent Hawaiian blood quantum; and

WHEREAS, this year marks the 100th year celebration of the Act; and

WHEREAS, as of December 31, 2020, the DHHL applicant waiting list showed 28,792 statewide applications; and

WHEREAS, as of December 31, 2020, the DHHL applicant waiting list showed 3,860 residential, 4,727 agricultural, and 635 pastoral applications for a total: 9,222 for the Island of Maui; and

WHEREAS, the average age of a beneficiary on a DHHL waitlist is reportedly 57 years old, and many beneficiaries on the waitlist died before receiving homestead parcels; and

WHEREAS, the Undivided Interest Awards policy of the DHHL homesteading program allows beneficiaries to receive a paper lease to an unspecified lot, with a guarantee that their successor beneficiaries of less than 50 percent Hawaiian blood quantum will eventually receive a homestead parcel; and

WHEREAS, according to a news story by *Hawaii Business Magazine*, dated September 4, 2019, Undivided Interest Awards provide "beneficiaries time to prepare for homeownership while their homes are built"; and

WHEREAS, according to this same story, about "28,500 adults who are at least 50 percent Native Hawaiian are waiting for residential, farming, or ranching homesteads from DHHL," and this "backlog exacerbates Hawaii's overall housing shortage and contributes to a homeless crisis that disproportionately affects Native Hawaiians"; and

WHEREAS, Maui has an estimated 28,000 acres of Hawaiian home lands available for future residential, agricultural, and pastoral homesteading, which has the potential to mitigate Maui's affordable-housing crisis; and

WHEREAS, DHHL is allowing beneficiaries on Maui waitlists with an undivided interest the right of first refusal to all available future Maui homestead lots; and

WHEREAS, on June 7, 2021, during the Council's Affordable Housing Committee meeting, DHHL officials announced plans to award 250 one- or two-acre agricultural lots in Honokowai within the next few years; and

WHEREAS, during the same meeting, a number of DHHL waitlist beneficiaries testified of 'ohana members on the waitlist who have since died; and

WHEREAS, while the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act permits DHHL to develop Hawaiian home lands without regard to County requirements, the DHHL has followed the practice of conforming to County standards to provide access, water, wastewater disposal, storm drains, and utilities within the lands being subdivided for homesteads; and

WHEREAS, the DHHL will inform its lessees of any substandard infrastructure improvements by providing full disclosure in the lease document and will require all homestead lessees to obtain building permits for any structures or improvements to be placed or erected within the homestead subdivision; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the County of Maui:

1. That it expresses its support and urges the Mayor's support of the Undivided Interest Awards policy of the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands' homesteading program;

- 2. That it requests the Department of Public Works to expedite the review of construction plans submitted by homestead lessees and issue the necessary building permits if the plans meet applicable County Code requirements;
- 3. That it requests the Department of Environmental Management to expedite the connection and provision of plans submitted by DHHL for water sources for homestead lots;
- 4. That it requests the Department of Water Supply to expedite the review of plans to accelerate the awarding of homestead lots to Native Hawaiians; and
- 5. That certified copies of this Resolution be transmitted to William J. Ailā, Jr., Chairman, Hawaiian Home Lands Commission, Department of Hawaiian Home Lands, State of Hawai'i; Randy K. Awo, Member, Hawaiian Home Lands Commission, Department of Hawaiian Home Lands, State of Hawai'i; Zachary Z.
