60% of 4.2 MILLION GALLONS of recycled wastewater is injected into underground wells EVERY DAY, which then leads into the ocean affecting our coral reefs. Maui County admitted that yes, the wastewater does lead into the ocean, but it goes via underground injection wells while the Clean Water Act only protects surface water. Maui taxpayers are spending \$4.3 million on legal counsel to fight this lawsuit, more than what it would have cost to accept the settlement. This money could have been used to actually improve our wastewater infrastructure by (1) ensuring no pollutants reach the ocean from our wastewater facilities and (2) invest in expanding our distribution pipelines so that we can increase the use of R1 for irrigation purposes. 13 million gallons of water PER DAY are diverted from potable surface water (stream diversions) for non-potable irrigation uses such as golf courses, parks, and landscaping. I would rather see more use of recycled wastewater and less stream diversion for non-potable uses.

We are wasting millions arguing over semantics--polluting the ocean through groundwater vs. surface water--when it comes down to it, there is a negative impact to our coral reefs. Coral reefs are important for our fish habitat, the economic value of our tourists that visit Maui to enjoy snorkeling, and as protection for our coasts and shorelines from waves and storms.
