Aloha Chair and members,

Regarding the recent report of an EPA assistant administrator saying "homeowner backyard septic systems" could require NPDES permits if the county loses the Lahaina wastewater case appeal:

To put things in more simple language, if someone has a septic or cesspool on the beach, or a stream, yes, they could and should be cited for pollution. That is already the law.

However, backyard septic systems would not come under NPDES and Clean Water Act unless they were getting into "streams and rivers, wetlands, and coastal and marine waters". If by poor location they were, it would be a GOOD thing to regulate them.

It would take a rather large, leaky sewage system that was away from the beach or waters to have some impact. With the Lahaina system, it is the injection wells that are causing leakage to the ocean.

The water being injected into the wells is safe and can be used for irrigation and agriculture under the Underground Injection and Safe Drinking Water standards. This water could be very welcome on ag lands by updating distribution systems.

The problem with that same water getting to the waters is that marine and aquatic life is 2000 times more sensitive to nitrates than we are. There is documented die off of reef and marine life, along with a history of nuisance micro algae blooms in areas where elevated nitrates from the wells are detected. This is the kind of pollution regulated more strictly by NPDES standards of the Clean Water Act.

The problem with losing this appeal is not that the county needs to avoid a settlement, but that some large petroleum and chemical and mining and farming companies appear to see this appeal as creating a loophole that would allow them to resume the dangerous polluting they indulged in before the EPA and Clean Water Act.

Unfortunately, the current national administration appears to be making it clear they stand with polluters against regulations that protect the environment.

This is evident in the president's appointments of industry lobbyists to head regulatory agencies and cabinet posts.

This also makes it difficult to get unbiased information from agencies whose loyalty now is to profits and business and industry, instead of to the people or the aina.
