
## Why DWS Funds Watershed Protection

- Forested watersheds face major threats that alter the ability to provide many ecosystem services, including reliable groundwater recharge and stream flow.
- Feral ungulates (hogs, deer, cows, goats) damage forests by browsing, rooting and trampling vegetation, leaving the ground bare and exposed to erosion.
- Invasive weed species can overtake native forest covers needed to capture rain and fog and hold soils.
- Watershed Partnerships provide on the ground management to keep feral ungulates and invasive weeds out of critical watersheds.

Key watershed management measures protect drinking water supplies


#### **East Maui Watershed Protection**

- Waikamoi Preserve, 9,000 acres ungulate free
- Protect major stream headwaters and groundwater for DWS customers
- Weed control and fence maintenance, public outreach
