A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING APPENDIX A OF THE FISCAL YEAR 2023 BUDGET FOR THE COUNTY OF MAUI AS IT PERTAINS TO PART II, SPECIAL PURPOSE REVENUES -SCHEDULE OF REVOLVING/SPECIAL FUNDS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2023, HIGHWAY BEAUTIFICATION AND DISPOSAL OF ABANDONED OR DERELICT VEHICLES REVOLVING FUND, EMERGENCY FUND

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI:

SECTION 1. Ordinance No. 5392, Bill No. 69, CD1, FD2 (2022), "Fiscal Year 2023 Budget", Appendix A, Part II, Special Purpose Revenues – Schedule of Revolving/Special Funds for Fiscal Year 2023, is hereby amended as it pertains to 1) Highway Beautification and Disposal of Abandoned or Derelict Vehicles Revolving Fund, by adding an appropriation for equipment in the amount of \$115,000, and 2) Emergency Fund, by decreasing the Anticipated Revenues for FY 2023 by \$105,372, to read as follows:
