Gary Passon moved to Maui in 2010 with his wife, Charlene Schulenburg, after a 40+ year career within the high-tech industry. During this time, he served in Executive and Senior management, finance, and operations and held positions as President/COO, CFO, CMO, CTO as well as holding several Vice President and other management positions.

After coming home regularly for 20+ years and visiting family Gary and Char have “come home to Maui” and live full time in Kihei. They own & run a local Bed & Breakfast called - Aloha Aku Inn & Suites. They welcome people from around the world to have a small intimate local ‘lifestyle experience’, exploring and enjoying Maui and its ‘ohana.

Since moving to Maui both Gary and Char have been highly active in the Maui and Kihei community. Their busy lives include participation in the building of low-income affordable homes with Habitat for Humanity as well as contributing to the Kihei Community Association volunteering for various committees, being on the local Catholic St. Anthony School Board and Foundation as well as being engaged in and supporting local homeless and saving wetlands activities and supporting other non-profit agendas.

Gary also was the Chair of the Hawaii Habitat for Humanity Statewide board for 6 years and helped to significantly grow and expand the HfH footprint in Hawaii. He has also been on the Habit-for-Humanity-Maui Board as Vice Chair, the Maui United Way Board as well as leading a local Homeowner Association Board.

Gary remains excited about continuing their local small business, giving back through their local philanthropic contributions, and remaining active members of the community.

Under Gary’s leadership the State organization more than tripled the amount of financial support from the State and Honolulu governments to assist the Habitat affordable housing efforts.

Gary is also a past Vice President / Vice Chair and board member of Habitat for Humanity of Maui. In this position he worked closely with the Executive Director to set objectives and strategies to expand and enhance Maui Habitat’s effort to create low-income housing on Maui. He was active in the discussions with the Maui governmental agencies to support low-income housing opportunities on Maui. He worked closely with the Executive

Director and the Board on supporting the Maui Habitat's 201H, DHHL and Community building efforts as well as creating strategic private/non-profit development partnerships.

In addition to these organizations Gary has been active with the Kihei Community Association (KCA) serving on the KCA Planning Committee as well as the KCA Design Review Committee. The KCA Development Scorecard was created to provide developers with a simple but effective guideline of the community goals, objectives, and desired development direction. Developers can get pre and post design reviews of their projects and are motivated to get community input before getting too far into the design cycle.

Gary has also been personally and professionally active in development and construction of Single Family, Multi-family, and Commercial projects both from ground-up to major/minor remodels in California and in Hawaii.

Over the years Gary has supported multiple local community organizations. One of his most engaged community efforts have been through his and Char's effort to support the local Catholic School system. Though his efforts on the St. Anthony Parish Education committee the Parish agreed to consolidate the St. Anthony's school divisions into a single entity with a new Head-of-School in 2017. Gary helped form and currently chairs the Uluniu Beachfront Reserve Association (UBRA) a Community Homeowner Association. He helped organize a nightly community safety

patrol and maintenance of the greenway Reserve lands along the beachfront that spans over 40 TMK's and approximately 175 property owners.

He has been active in helping preserve the wetlands and has contributed and been involved with local Homeless groups.

I learned from California state biologists to recognize species of riparian vegetation that stabilized stream banks to protect against erosion.

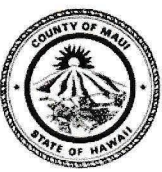

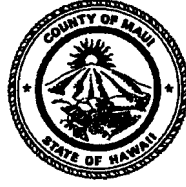
