MPD DISTRACTED DRIVING HIGH VISIBILTY ENFORCEMENT

DD22-M-03

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into by and between the STATE OF HAWAII by and through its Director of Transportation, hereinafter referred to as "State," and the Governmental Unit named in this application, hereinafter referred to as "Applicant."

WHEREAS, the National Highway Safety Act of 1966 (Public Law 89-564) provides Federal funds to the STATE for approved highway safety projects, and

WHEREAS, STATE may make said funds available to various state, county or municipal agencies or governments or political subdivisions upon application and approval by STATE and the UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, and

WHEREAS, STATE is obligated to reimburse the UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION out of its funds for any ineligible or unauthorized expenditures for which Federal funds have been claimed and payment received, and

WHEREAS, the above name APPLICANT has submitted an application for Federal funds for highway safety projects.

NOW, THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF MUTUAL PROMISES AND OTHER GOOD AND VALUABLE CONSIDERATION, THE PARTIES AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

The APPLICANT will comply with applicable statutes and regulations, including but not limited to:

- •23 U.S.C. Chapter 4 Highway Safety Act of 1966, as amended
- •Sec. 1906, Pub. L. 109-59, as amended by Sec. 4011, Pub. L. 114-94
- •23 CFR part 1300 Uniform Procedures for State Highway Safety Grant Programs
- •21CFR part 200 Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards
- •2]CFR part 1201 Department of Transportation, Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards

NONDISCRIMINATION

- The APPLICANT will comply with all Federal statutes and implementing regulations relating to nondiscrimination ("Federal Nondiscrimination Authorities"). These include but are not limited to:
- •Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (42 U.S.C. 2000d et seq., 78 stat. 252), (prohibits discrimination on the basis of race, color, national origin) and 49 CFR part 21;
- •The Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970, (42 U.S.C. 4601), (prohibits unfair treatment of persons displaced or whose property has been acquired because of Federal or Federal-aid programs and projects);
- •Federal-Aid Highway Act of 1973, (23 U.S.C. 324 et seq.), and Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, as amended (20 U.S.C. 1681-1683 and 1685-1686) (prohibit discrimination on the basis of sex);
- •Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, (29 U.S.C. 794 et seq.), as amended, (prohibits discrimination on the basis of disability) and 49 CFR part 27;
- •The Age Discrimination Act of 1975, as amended, (42 U.S.C. 6101 et seq.), (prohibits discrimination on the basis of age);
- •The Civil Rights Restoration Act of 1987, (Pub. L. 100-209), (broadens scope, coverage and applicability of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, The Age Discrimination Act of 1975 and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, by expanding the definition of the terms "programs or activities" to include all of the programs or activities of the Federal aid recipients, subrecipients and contractors, whether such programs or activities are Federally-funded or not);
- •Titles II and III of the Americans with Disabilities Act (42 U.S.C. 12131-12189) (prohibits discrimination on the basis of disability in the operation of public entities, public and private transportation systems, places of public accommodation, and certain testing) and 49 CFR parts 37 and 38;
- •Executive Order 12898, Federal Actions to Address Environmental Justice in Minority Populations and Low-Income Populations (prevents discrimination against minority populations by discouraging programs, policies, and activities with disproportionately high and adverse human health or environmental effects on minority and low-income populations); and
- •Executive Order 13166, Improving Access to Services for Persons with Limited English Proficiency (guards against Title VI national origin discrimination/discrimination because of limited English proficiency (LEP) by ensuring that funding recipients take reasonable steps to ensure that LEP persons have meaningful access to programs (70 FR 74087-74100).

The State highway safety agency—

- •Will take all measures necessary to ensure that no person in the United States shall, on the grounds of race, color, national origin, disability, sex, age, limited English proficiency, or membership in any other class protected by Federal Nondiscrimination Authorities, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination under any of its programs or activities, so long as any portion of the program is Federally-assisted;
- •Will administer the program in a manner that reasonably ensures that any of its subrecipients, contractors, subcontractors, and consultants receiving Federal financial assistance under this program will comply with all requirements of the Non-Discrimination Authorities identified in this Assurance;
- •Agrees to comply (and require its subrecipients, contractors, subcontractors, and consultants to comply) with all applicable provisions of law or regulation governing US DOT's or NHTSA's access to records, accounts, documents, information, facilities, and staff, and to cooperate and comply with any program or compliance reviews, and/or complaint investigations conducted by US DOT or NHTSA under any Federal Nondiscrimination Authority;
- •Acknowledges that the United States has a right to seek judicial enforcement with regard to any matter arising under these Non-Discrimination Authorities and this Assurance;
- •Agrees to insert in all contracts and funding agreements with other State or private entities the following clause:
- "During the performance of this contract/funding agreement, the contractor/funding recipient agrees-
- a. To comply with all Federal nondiscrimination laws and regulations, as may be amended from time to time;
- b. Not to participate directly or indirectly in the discrimination prohibited by any Federal nondiscrimination law or regulation, as set forth in appendix B of 49 CFR part 21 and herein;
- c. To permit access to its books, records, accounts, other sources of information, and its facilities as required by the State highway safety office, US DOT or NHTSA;
- d. That, in event a contractor/funding recipient fails to comply with any nondiscrimination provisions in this contract/funding agreement, the State highway safety agency will have the right to impose such contract/agreement sanctions as it or NHTSA determine are appropriate, including but not limited to withholding payments to the contractor/funding recipient under the contract/agreement until the contractor/funding recipient complies; and/or cancelling, terminating, or suspending a contract or funding agreement, in whole or in part; and
- e.To insert this clause, including paragraphs (a) through (e), in every subcontract and subagreement and in every solicitation for a subcontract or sub-agreement, that receives Federal funds under this program.

POLITICAL ACTIVITY (HATCH ACT)

The APPLICANT will comply with provisions of the Hatch Act (5 U.S.C. 1501-1508), which limits the political activities of employees whose principal employment activities are funded in whole or in part with Federal funds.

CERTIFICATION REGARDING FEDERAL LOBBYING

Certification for Contracts, Grants, Loans, and Cooperative Agreements. The undersigned certifies, to the best of his or her knowledge and belief, that:

- 1. No Federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid, by or on behalf of the undersigned, to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with the awarding of any Federal contract, the making of any Federal grant, the making of any Federal loan, the entering into of any cooperative agreement, and the extension, continuation, renewal, amendment, or modification of any Federal contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement;
- 2. If any funds other than Federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with this Federal contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement, the undersigned shall complete and submit Standard Form-LLL, "Disclosure Form to Report Lobbying," in accordance with its instructions;
- 3. The undersigned shall require that the language of this certification be included in the award documents for all sub-award at all tiers (including subcontracts, subgrants, and contracts under grant, loans, and cooperative agreements) and that all subrecipients shall certify and disclose accordingly.

This certification is a material representation of fact upon which reliance was placed when this transaction was made or entered into. Submission of this certification is a prerequisite for making or entering into this transaction imposed by section 1352, title 31, U.S. Code. Any person who fails to file the required certification shall be subject to a civil penalty of not less than \$10,000 and not more than \$100,000 for each such failure.

RESTRICTION ON STATE LOBBYING

None of the funds under this program will be used for any activity specifically designed to urge or influence a State or local legislator to favor or oppose the adoption of any specific legislative proposal pending before any State or local legislative body. Such activities include both direct and indirect (e.g., "grassroots") lobbying activities, with one exception. This does not preclude a State official whose salary is supported with NHTSA funds from engaging in direct communications with State or local legislative officials, in accordance with customary State practice, even if such communications urge legislative officials to favor or oppose the adoption of a specific pending legislative proposal.

CERTIFICATION REGARDING DEBARMENT AND SUSPENSION

Instructions for Lower Tier Participant Certification

- 1. By signing and submitting this proposal, the prospective lower tier participant is providing the certification set out below and agrees to comply with the requirements of 2 CFR parts 180 and 1200.
- 2. The certification in this clause is a material representation of fact upon which reliance was placed when this transaction was entered into. If it is later determined that the prospective lower tier participant knowingly rendered an erroneous certification, in addition to other remedies available to the Federal government, the department or agency with which this transaction originated may pursue available remedies, including suspension or debarment.

Certification Regarding Debarment, Suspension, Ineligibility and Voluntary Exclusion — Lower Tier Covered Transactions:

PROBLEM STATEMENT

MPD DISTRACTED DRIVING HIGH VISIBILTY ENFORCEMENT

Grant No: DD22-M-03

Identify the traffic safety related problem or deficiency that the proposed grant is intended to correct.

PROBLEM STATEMENT - Driving is a multi-tasking operation that involves manual, visual, and cognitive tasks. Distracted driving is defined as any non-driving activity a person engages in that has the potential to distract him or her from the primary task of driving and increases the risk of crashing.

The percentage of passenger vehicle drivers talking on handheld phones increased from 2.9 percent in 2017 to 3.2 percent in 2018. The percentage of drivers speaking with visible headsets while driving decreased from 0.45 percent in 2017 to 0.35 percent in 2018. Drivers' visible manipulation of handheld devices increased from 2.0 percent in 2017 to 2.1 percent in 2018. Each of these year-to-year changes are not statistically significant. These results are from the National Occupant Protection Use Survey (NOPUS), which provides the only nationwide probability-based observed data on driver electronic device use in the United States. The NOPUS is conducted annually by the National Center for Statistics and Analysis of the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.

The percentage of drivers visibly manipulating handheld devices while driving increased from 2.0 percent in 2017 to 2.1 percent in 2018. The 2018 NOPUS observed a significant decrease in visible manipulation of handheld electronic devices among drivers in the northeast region, from 2.8 percent in 2017 to 2.0 percent in 2018. Driver manipulation of handheld device continued to be higher among 16- to 24-year-olds than other age groups.

Drivers who use hand-held devices are four times more likely to be involved in a crash serious enough to injure them. (Source: Insurance Institute for Highway Safety). Using a cell phone while driving, whether it is hand held or hands-free, delays a driver's reaction as much as having blood alcohol concentration at the legal limit of .08 percent (Source: University of Utah).

The 2019 Hawaii Seat Belt Survey, conducted by the University of Hawaii at Manoa during winter 2019, showed that the statewide daytime cell phone use rate decreased from .98 % from the summer 2018 observations to .92 % in January 2019.

Maui Police Department's (MPD) goals in FFY 2022 are to achieve the following:

- 1. Increase voluntary compliance of distracted driving laws by making 1,250 Mobile Electronic Device (MED) related contacts, which includes MED related citations and/or educational contacts "teaching moments," issued by September 30, 2021, as compared to 1,599 citations for FFY 2021;
- 2. Enhance electronic mobile device use enforcement by maintaining 560 hours (same as FFY 2021) for officer's overtime to make 1,250 Mobile Electronic Device (MED) related contacts which include MED related citations and/or educational contacts "teaching moments;" by September 30, 2022;
- 3. Continue with electronic mobile device use enforcement activities on state and county roadways where there is a high volume of vehicular traffic in FFY 2022; and
- 4. Conduct 60 hours of in person Community Education at traffic safety events to promote voluntary compliance of MED related laws by September 30, 2022, compared to 56 hours for 2020.

Personnel Costs - The Maui Police Department (MPD) will conduct active and aggressive enforcement of the Distracted Driving law using grant funds for after-hours (overtime) funding of officers (560 hours). Cost is based on an average overtime rate using a Police Officer 9/L3 at the overtime rate of \$67.91 plus an estimated fringe rate of 44.41%. Total OT rate is about \$98.07 per hour. This rate of pay is based on the average officer participating and that some officers will have a lower/higher pay rate. MPD will participate in the National Distracted Driving Awareness Month in April 2022. MPD officers will conduct two or more traffic safety events using 60 hours of overtime. They will distribute flyers, pamphlets, or participate in Educational Community Engagement events regarding the prohibited use of electronic mobile devices, Seatbelt usage, or impaired driving awareness. Hand out materials will be provided by HDOT.
