

SUBJECT: FISCAL YEAR 2019 GRANT PERFORMANCE AND EVALUATION REPORT FOR DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND HUMAN CONCERNS (HFC-27)

Thank you for your correspondence of January 17, 2020 requesting additional information pertaining to the evaluation report submitted by the Department of Housing and Human Concerns (DHHC). The questions posed in your letter are listed below in bold and are followed by the Department's responses.

1. Please provide a list of which organization should be considered for a possible three-year funding cycle.

Currently, DHHC grantees are on a 2 year grant cycle. The current cycle is for Fiscal Years 2019 and 2020. All contracts are executed with language making the 2nd year of funding dependent on grantee performance as well as the availability of funding as set in the budget ordinance. Organizations have submitted applications for the next 2-year funding cycle spanning Fiscal Years 2021 and 2022. At this juncture, the Department does not recommend that some grantees receive a different duration of funding than others. The Department has done our best to maintain a high level of accountability for how County funds are granted

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and spent to address human concerns in the community. We want to encourage diversity of funding so that a dependency and expectation of County funding does not become pervasive. A three (3) year funding cycle does not allow for adjustment of priorities based on the changes in community needs.

The Animal Management programs would be the only grants that DHHC would recommend for longer funding periods as these grants implement mandated services the County is legally required to provide.

2. Please provide the Committee with the objective criteria use to determine the score of the grantees and whether or not the grantees receive feedback or suggestions on how they could improve their scores.

The annual evaluation was completed to meet the requirement in Maui County Code, Chapter 3.36.120. Its intent was to inform the Mayor and Council about the performance of the grantees on an annual basis. Grantees were informed that the evaluation would be submitted to the Mayor and Council and were informed of what would be included in the evaluation. The evaluation is a culmination of a year's work with grantees. Over the course of the year, grantees are given on-going feedback and technical assistance on how they can improve in areas DHHC felt they were deficient.

Each evaluation category criteria is objectively quantified to the extent possible. Grant managers are allowed a degree of subjectivity as they adhere to listed standards and points to consider. Applying a rigid matrix to all grantees does not do justice to the diversity of programs and grantees. Funded programs range greatly in their capacity and training of staff, focus of grant (i.e. homelessness vs. performing arts education), size of organization, and access to resources. For example, there are large national organizations like the Boys and Girls Club and the National Kidney Foundation, large local organizations like Mental Health Kokua and Maui Economic Opportunity, and small community organizations like Hui Laulima o Hana and the Lahaina Afterschool Tutoring Program. Simply based on the nature of the organization and the programs implemented, the Department recognizes there are different capacities, access to resources, and training. Below are further instructions provided to grant managers as they conduct the evaluations and items to consider.

General instructions for grant managers to consider in their evaluation included:

- Score between 0-5, using 0.5 increments. (0, 0.5, 1, 1.5, etc...)
 - o 0.5-2.5 is problematic
 - 3-4.5 is satisfactory to expected
 - 5 is exceptional
- If any category is scored 2.5 or lower, please provide note or example in the comments.
- If any category is scored at 5, please provide a note or example in the comments.
- Comments should be brief but meaningful.

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- If the grantee failed to perform, please note in the comments with examples.
- All grants should have a comment.
- Please do not use abbreviations or acronyms in comments.
