This is to inform you that we have received preliminary approval of our FY2022-2023 Coastal Zone Management (CZM) federal grant-in-aid award. Subject to availability of funds, we intend to commit to the County of Maui, via twelve (12)-month supplemental contract, an increased sum of \$463,697.00 for its participation in the FY2022-2023 work program. The County of Maui FY2022-2023 increased budget is as follows:

Personnel	\$458,612.00
Travel	\$1,005.00
Supplies	\$1,020.00
Equipment	\$2,040.00
Other	\$1,020.00
Total	\$463,697.00

The increased contract budget reflects the requested FY2022-2023 budget scenario with a 2% salary increase and is made possible with available federal funding from the unique circumstances with COVID-19 extended awards. It is important that we inform the County that we are aware of both the possibility of future funding restrictions and additional collective bargaining costs and, to the extent possible, CZM will work with the County to address any contractual impacts these changes may impose.

The execution of the twelve-month contract extension has proven to be more efficient than execution of a multi-year contract, beginning July 1, 2022. Additional twelve-month extensions for future fiscal years will be subject to the availability of funds.

The twelve (12)-month supplemental contract will require the County to provide at least \$420,299.00 worth of matching non-federal funds or services-in-kind for FY2022-2023, and time sheets and other eligible documentation must be prepared and filed with us for credit.

## A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE OPERATING BUDGET FOR THE COUNTY OF MAUI FOR THE FISCAL YEAR JULY 1, 2022 TO JUNE 30, 2023

## BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI:

SECTION 1. This Ordinance may be referred to as the "Fiscal Year 2023 Budget."
