## Feral Cats That Are Fed Still Kill

## Native Wildlife and Birds


Kanahā Pond Wildlife Sanctuary - A Case Study: Seven cat colonies are maintained within 1/4 mile of the Kanahā Pond Wildlife Sanctuary, home to 40% of the endangered ae 'o on Maui.

A study of 22 feral cat stomach contents showed:

- 50% contained native and endangered birds, with only 13 % containing cat foods/bait.
- 12 % of those bird remains in these cats' stomaches were endangerd bird species.
- 28 mongoose stomach samples were examined in the same study: only 24% contained bird remains, and only 6 of those were endangerd.



Native Hawaiian species are unaccustomed to cats and do not avoid them





- forest birds (6 of Maui's original 11 species remain 2 are endangered)
- water birds (geese, ducks, stilts, coots all 4 endangered)
- sea birds (petrels, shearwaters, terns, noddies, tropic birds 2 are endangered)
- · hatchling sea turtles
- bats (our endangerd native bat roosts in trees)




Most seabirds, like these shearwaters, partner for life and lay only one egg per season - and it takes both parents to raise a chick

Department of Land and Natural Resources (DLNR)

Division of Forestry and Wildlife (DOFAW) manages 25% of lands across Hawai'i, in all habitats

Responsible for protection of all native and Threatened and Endangered wildlife, on all lands, statewide under Chapters 183D & 195D Hawai'i Revised Statutes (prohibiting the 'take' of birds and native species)

- 300,000 to 400,000 feral cats on Maui
  - 2 Feral cats per human resident
- ~413 feral cats per square mile





Jocelyn Bouchard, CEO of the Maui Humane Society was quoted in a Maui Weekly article (9/3/2009) "Feral cats are everywhere on Maui ...there are hundreds of colonies across the island..."

• Throughout an avearage of seven reproductive years, one pair of fertile cats can produce 2,905 kittens, who will mature and reach reproproduction age themselves.
