Your approval is respectfully requested, pursuant to EM 20-05, to enter into contracts to provide the following services:

1. Staffing Resource Service to be Provided:

The Office of Solid Waste Management (OSWM) is required according to Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), Chapter 342G, Part VII, "Glass Container Recovery" to annually distribute moneys from an account in the environmental management special fund (EMSF) to the counties to operate glass recovery programs. Pursuant to §342G-84, HRS, the OSWM hopes to award up to four contracts per fiscal year, one to each county (contractor) via a procurement expenditure of public funds for services that are exempt from public bidding as set forth in section 103D-102(b)(2)(G), HRS and to fulfill the mandate to fund glass container recovery programs in each county.

2. Description of Functions and Responsibilities:

The contractor shall operate a non-deposit glass recovery program. This contracted service includes the following tasks:

a. Operate glass recovery programs which shall include:

I.

A glass incentive or "buy back" program providing a means of encouraging participation by the public or private collectors; and

- ii. The paving of the equivalent of one mile of two-lane asphalt roadway as part of a research and demonstration program utilizing glassphalt or glass within any other portion of the pavement section; or any demonstration project approved by the State.
- b. May operate glass recovery programs that include, but shall not be limited to, the following:
 - I. Funding of the collection and processing of glass containers either through existing county agencies or through external contracts for services;
 - .li. Subsidizing the transportation of processed material to end-users or markets;
 - Development of collection facilities or the provision of containers for glass recycling, or the incremental portions of multi-material programs;
 - iv. Additional research and development programs, including grants to private sector entrepreneurs, especially those activities developing higher value uses for glass; and
 - v. Public education and awareness programs focusing on glass recovery, or the incremental portions of multi-material programs.
 - Provide a statement along with sufficient documentation to justify each glass incentive and "buy back" rate used to pay permitted recyclers during the time of performance;
- d. Obtain documentation from permitted recyclers participating in "buy back" or other glass incentive programs to verify that glass collected through these programs was reused or recycled;
- e. Submit quarterly reports to the State, on a form supplied by the State, to document the volume of glass collected through "buy back" and other glass incentive programs; and
- f. Submit an annual written report to the State in a format supplied by the State, that describes activities completed, an evaluation of successes, and recommendations on areas for Improvement.

3. Justification for the Procurement of the Staffing Resource:

The OSWM is mandated by statute (HRS §342G-84) to fund glass recovery programs at the county level each year. The contractors are responsible to develop glass incentives to maximize collection of non-deposit glass containers, which include a wide assortment of (1) food items such as wine or liquor bottles, sauces and condiments, oils and extracts, jelly and pickle jars; and (2) non-food items such as perfumers, nall pollshes, paints, herbal supplements and cleaning supplies. The OSWM lacks the in-house resources to staff these glass recovery programs in every county, so the proposed agreements with each county are essential for the OSWM to conduct its fiduciary duty to administer the glass advance disposal fee (ADF) account of the EMSF.

In March of each year, the OSWM will determine the contract amounts for each county based primarily on (1) previous calendar year's collections from glass container importers who remit an ADF of 1.5 cents for each glass container imported or manufactured in Hawaii; (2) a deduction of ten percent of annual collections for the OSWM to administer the glass ADF program; and (3) a distribution to each county via direct contracts with each county based proportionally on the latest county de facto population, as required by §342G-84(B), HRS. Your approval is respectfully requested to proceed with these contracts to fund county non-deposit glass recovery services for FY22-24.

4. Impact of Not Contracting for this Service:

If this service is not provided, Hawaii residents and visitors will not be able to send their non-deposit glass containers for recycling. Counties rely on these funds to provide glass incentives for local processors who would otherwise be unwilling to collect non-deposit glass containers. Not contracting for this service means the OSWM will also not be able to fulfill its legislative mandate to distribute glass funds to the counties via direct contracts.
