PROBLEM STATEMENT

Maui Police Department Traffic Data Grant

Grant No: 0

Identify the traffic safety related problem or deficiency that the proposed grant is intended to correct.

2016 Assessments showed the need for updated Crash/Fatality Analysis Reporting and improvements on the timeliness, completeness and accuracy of crash data. The need for additional data including quantifying levels of alcohol and the presence of illicit drugs in patients who are treated in emergency department settings across the state. Having this level of data would provide more in-depth analysis that will lead to multi-component interventions in addressing impaired driving. HDOT and DOH believes that it is imperative to be able to establish baselines to track stats **HIGLS** helps us provides valid geo-locations for all reportable crashes, which is very important for being able to use crash data for safety analyses. This allows:

•The use of safety analysis applications (that need locations in machine readable forms; typically, lat/long or route & milepost) enables analysts to

oFind and quantify areas of crash concentrations (hot spots, etc.)

oSupport safety investments to reduce crashes in those areas (such as improving the intersection, widening shoulders, etc.)

oTrack changes over time of crashes in a particular location

The issuance of citations by patrol sector is still paper. Citations are still being entered manually. Inaccuracies are inevitable as the citations must still be manually entered on the judicary side. Implementation of **TBL** for Traffic Officers and parking enforcement has significantly reduced the amount of time it takes from citation issuance to judiciary acceptance. The need still exists to increase the amount of TBL users which would cut down in the errors and inaccuracies with the judiciary. MPD continues to work with the DOT and **SHACA** project. With The addition of Berla iVe Infotainment system software we are able to download valuable information from a vehicles infotainment system. This information is very uselful in crash investigations.

GRANT GOALS

The goal of this grant is to:

1. Decrease the average time it takes from crash occurrence to entry into HDOT database from 100 days in 2022 to 60 days by September 30, 2023.

2. Continue with the electronic issuance of traffic citations to reduce the errors and timiliness issues that result in citations being dismissed by district courts. Currently MPD using e-citations program has a 90% acceptance rate from Judiciary. The goal is to reduce officer error and increase acceptance rate to closer to 95% with zero officer errors and timiliness issues.

GRANT OBJECTIVES

3. Participate in at least 4 eCitation Subcommittee meetings.

4. Send 2 people to the 2023 International Forum on Traffic Records.

5. Meet with HDOT at least 1 time to work on implementation of HIGLS between MPD and the State of Hawaii Advanced Crash Analysis (SHACA) system.

6. MPD will also incorporate TBL analytics data with HIGLS data to assist in determining best locations to deploy resources for enforcement by September 30, 2023;

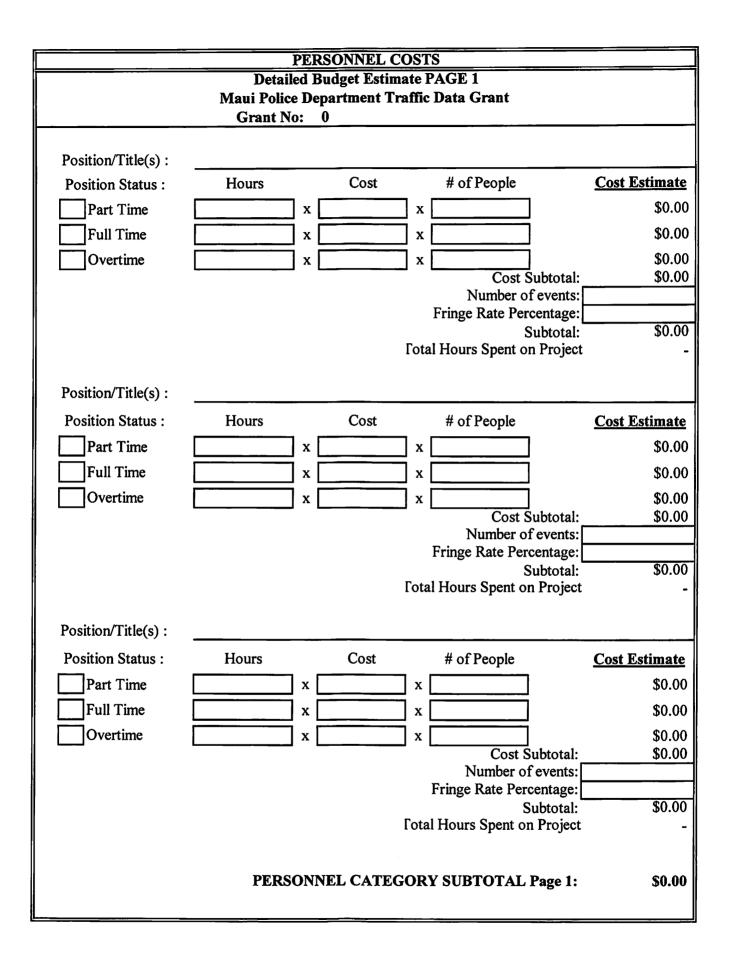
The Maui Police Department will evaluate the progress of the e-Citation pilot program by evaluating the equipment by keeping track of and providing the following information.

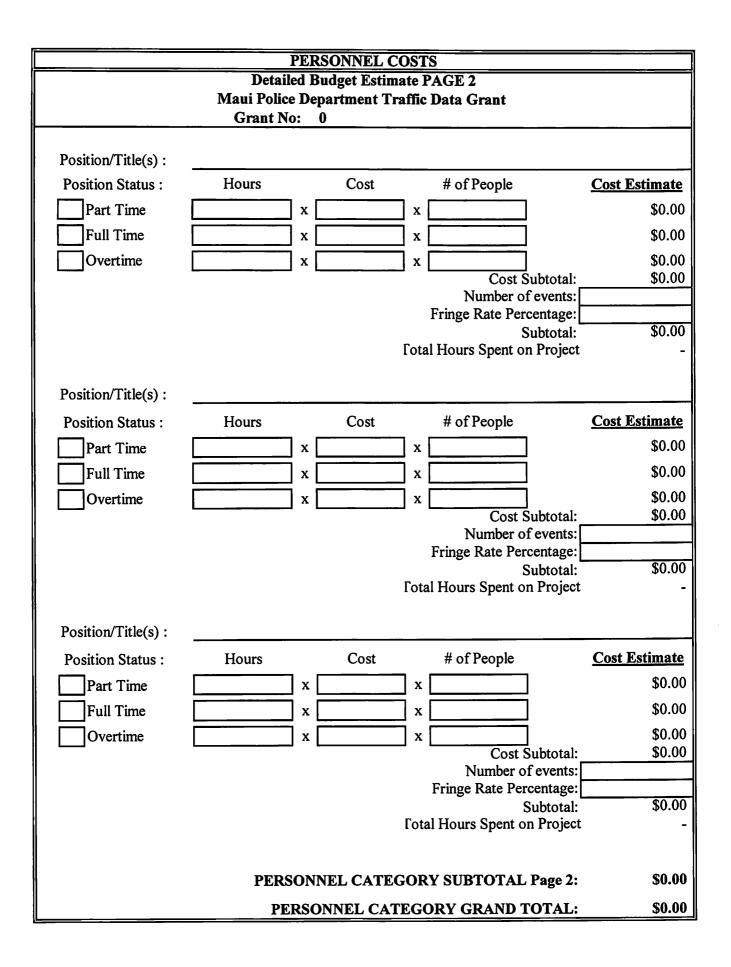
1. How much time is saved by issuing an electronic citation vs. writing one. Time saved when issuing a traffic infraction and traffic crime upon one violator/data transfer.

2. How safety is improved for the officers utilizing this equipment. Daytime vs. nighttime.

3. How accurate is the information that is being sent to Judiciary/Traffic Violations Bureau. Including the amount of errors being added or reduced by using this technology. (illegible, missing data, missed deadlines)

In addition, MPD will evaluate the progress of the grant activities and include the progress in the quarterly reports to the Highway Safety Office.

Certifications and Assurances for Fiscal Year 2023 Hawaii Highway Safety Grants (23 U.S.C. Chapter 4; Sec. 1906, Pub. L. 109-59, As Amended) Maui Police Department Traffic Data Grant

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THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into by and between the STATE OF HAWAII by and through its Director of Transportation, hereinafter referred to as "State," and the Governmental Unit named in this application, hereinafter referred to as "Applicant."

WHEREAS, the National Highway Safety Act of 1966 (Public Law 89-564) provides Federal funds to the STATE for approved highway safety projects, and

WHEREAS, STATE may make said funds available to various state, county or municipal agencies or governments or political subdivisions upon application and approval by STATE and the UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, and

WHEREAS, STATE is obligated to reimburse the UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION out of its funds for any ineligible or unauthorized expenditures for which Federal funds have been claimed and payment received, and

WHEREAS, the above name APPLICANT has submitted an application for Federal funds for highway safety projects.

NOW, THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF MUTUAL PROMISES AND OTHER GOOD AND VALUABLE CONSIDERATION, THE PARTIES AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

The APPLICANT will comply with applicable statutes and regulations, including but not limited to:

•2B U.S.C. Chapter 4 – Highway Safety Act of 1966, as amended

•Sec. 1906, Pub. L. 109-59, as amended by Sec. 4011, Pub. L. 114-94

•2B CFR part 1300 – Uniform Procedures for State Highway Safety Grant Programs

•21CFR part 200 – Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards

•27CFR part 1201 – Department of Transportation, Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards

NONDISCRIMINATION

The APPLICANT will comply with all Federal statutes and implementing regulations relating to nondiscrimination ("Federal Nondiscrimination Authorities"). These include but are not limited to:

•Will administer the program in a manner that reasonably ensures that any of its subrecipients, contractors, subcontractors, and consultants receiving Federal financial assistance under this program will comply with all requirements of the Non-Discrimination Authorities identified in this Assurance;

•Agrees to comply (and require its subrecipients, contractors, subcontractors, and consultants to comply) with all applicable provisions of law or regulation governing US DOT's or NHTSA's access to records, accounts, documents, information, facilities, and staff, and to cooperate and comply with any program or compliance reviews, and/or complaint investigations conducted by US DOT or NHTSA under any Federal Nondiscrimination Authority;

•Acknowledges that the United States has a right to seek judicial enforcement with regard to any matter arising under these Non-Discrimination Authorities and this Assurance;

•Agrees to insert in all contracts and funding agreements with other State or private entities the following clause:

"During the performance of this contract/funding agreement, the contractor/funding recipient agrees—

a. To comply with all Federal nondiscrimination laws and regulations, as may be amended from time to time;

b.Not to participate directly or indirectly in the discrimination prohibited by any Federal nondiscrimination law or regulation, as set forth in appendix B of 49 CFR part 21 and herein;

c. To permit access to its books, records, accounts, other sources of information, and its facilities as required by the State highway safety office, US DOT or NHTSA;

d. That, in event a contractor/funding recipient fails to comply with any nondiscrimination provisions in this contract/funding agreement, the State highway safety agency will have the right to impose such contract/agreement sanctions as it or NHTSA determine are appropriate, including but not limited to withholding payments to the contractor/funding recipient under the contract/agreement until the contractor/funding recipient complies; and/or cancelling, terminating, or suspending a contract or funding agreement, in whole or in part; and

e. To insert this clause, including paragraphs (a) through (e), in every subcontract and subagreement and in every solicitation for a subcontract or sub-agreement, that receives Federal funds under this program.

POLITICAL ACTIVITY (HATCH ACT)

The APPLICANT will comply with provisions of the Hatch Act (5 U.S.C. 1501-1508), which limits the political activities of employees whose principal employment activities are funded in whole or in part with Federal funds.

Buy America requires a State, or Applicant, to purchase with Federal funds only steel, iron and manufactured products produced in the United States, unless the Secretary of Transportation determines that such domestically produced items would be inconsistent with the public interest, that such materials are not reasonably available and of a satisfactory quality, or that inclusion of domestic materials will increase the cost of the overall project contract by more than 25 percent. In order to use Federal funds to purchase foreign produced items, the State must submit a waiver request that provides an adequate basis and justification for approval by the Secretary of Transportation.

PROHIBITION ON USING GRANT FUNDS TO CHECK FOR HELMET USAGE

The APPLICANT will not use 23 U.S.C. Chapter 4 grant funds for programs to check helmet usage or to create checkpoints that specifically target motorcyclists.
