

#### Kupu 'Āina Corps

Transitions early-career adults into sustainability careers through paid work and training

- Launched in 2020 at height of unemployment crisis, employed over 360 Covid-impacted individuals in first year
- Relaunched in 2022 through the State of Hawai'i's Green Job Youth Corps
- Placed over 140 individuals in sustainability jobs in 2022
- Increasing pay to remain competitive in tight labor market
- Expanding public awareness of program as part of long-term, economic change

#### **Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islander** participation across all Kupu programs Native Hawaiian Participants




- Across all Kupu programs, more than 50 percent are Native Hawaiian or other Pacific Islander
- 2020 2021: Record breaking numbers for Native Hawaiian participants
- Nearly half of all Kupu 'Āina Corps participants are either Native Hawaiian or other Pacific Islander (see more via graphics on the right)

#### **Program Snapshot: Kupu 'Āina Corps** (18.6 percent based in Maui County)

### **EQUITABLE, DIVERSE, AND FAR REACHING**

Beyond its immediate benefits to the entire state, the Green Job Youth Corps is reaching less advantaged communities who sometimes struggle to access state programs equitably. While kama'āina of all background can participate, the program enjoys high participation from lower-income households, neighbor island communities, and Native Hawaiians and other Pacific Islanders.






