Liquor Control Officer IV - 7 years, funding reinstated in FY23

Liquor Control Officer Trainee (Previously LCO I) - 1.5 years

Liquor Control Officer Trainee (Previously LCO I) - 9 months

We anticipate filling all positions within the next 4 months.

We urgently look to fill our vacancies to assure we can continue to protect the health, safety and welfare of the general public by regulating and controlling the liquor industry in the importation, manufacture, sale, and service of alcoholic beverages, and to provide a safe and healthy environment for the people of Maui County as we emerge from the depths of the Covid-19 Pandemic.

We did not have expansion positions in FY 2023.
