

Overall Sentiment






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Overall Sentiment

We request \$400,000, an increase of \$65,473. Justifications are:

- Need to hire additional high quality staff (full time) to address the highest membership in PYCC history. This is a safety program quality concern.
- · Cost of living increases to retain long term staff.
- Increase in general operating expenses.


As the costs of living on Maui have significantly increased in recent years, so have the costs of providing such an incredible sanctuary for our youth and their families.

We would like to request that a task force be initiated within the clean and safe program to take care of safety issues. Budget testimony:

I am an avid park user. I would like a majority of growth tax dollars to be used to improve park access for residents.

I would like beach parks to open just prior to sunrise to accommodate "dawn patrol" users. In the past, gates were open around 5:15 am daily. After COVID, beach parks were locked until 7:00 am. As of April 1, the COM has agreed to open Hookipa at 5:30 am. We are very grateful to this administration for accommodating us dawn patrollers. However, there are other beach parks that need to open at that time (or earlier). These parks include Baldwin, Lower Paia Beach, Kuau Cove (AKA Tavares Bay), Kanaha and the Launiupoko mauka lot.

In addition, the Launiupoko parking lot needs nightly monitoring as people living in the parking lot leave no parking for beach users.

The playground at the Lahaina Civic center needs to be repaired and updated. My grandsons live nearby. The matting is falling apart.

Hookipa needs additional parking. The upper parking lot can be expanded into the unused curbed area.

Lower Paia Beach lost over 1,000 linear feet of parking in 2020 when no parking signs were put up along Hana Highway. Please expand parking into the adjacent county lot.

I am concerned about numerous things, and would like to see the Maui County 2024 Budget address these issues concerning our Long term residents, Kapuna, families with children, and those being squeezed by high rents.
I'd like to see in the 2024 general fund budget:
*That all non union employees of agencies that contract with the County be paid a liveable wage, like \$20 hour. That the county include in its 2024 budget funding so these agencies can pay their employees that liveable wage.
*Rent vouchers for Long Term residents, Kapuna, families with children, those on fixed income (Like they have in the State of Alaska)
Increase the Housing fund to \$100 million .
Property tax exemptions for pet friendly rentals.
Higher taxes for vacant and abandoned homes, ie 336 Naniloa Drive, Wailuku
Tax at a higher rate 2 nd and 3 rd homes.
Relocation Assistance, for those evicted from their homes.
Down payment and monthly mortgage assistance for those long term residents who want to purchase a home.
Rental Assistance, that is only qualified by, proportion of income, capped at \$100,000 income.
