Legislation: Bill 22, CD1 (2023), entitled "A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE OPERATING BUDGET FOR THE COUNTY OF MAUI FOR THE FISCAL YEAR JULY 1, 2023, TO JUNE 30, 2024."

Proposer: Council Chair Alice L. Lee.

Description: Amend pages 16, 24, 58, and 59 of Bill 22, CD1 (2023). These amendments will:

- 1) Reallocate funding for a grant to Department of Hawaiian Home Lands for fencing at Paukukalo Park from the Department of Parks and Recreation to the Office of the Mayor, Economic Development Program;
- 2) Add a new condition to the Economic Development and Cultural Programs Revolving fund for Na 'Aikane o Maui for the reinterment of iwi kūpuna at Puamana; and
- 3) Add a new condition to the Hawaiian Cultural Restoration Revolving Fund for Na 'Aikane o Maui to conduct public meetings and develop and implement a plan for Moku'ula and Mokuhinia.

Motion: Move to amend the following:

- 1) On page 16, amend Section 3.B.10.c.(1), Office of the Mayor, Economic Development Program, by increasing the amount in Category "B" to \$554,627, revising the total accordingly, and adding conditional language to read: "Up to \$50,000 must be for a grant to the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands for Paukukalo Park fencing."
- 2) On page 24, amend Section 3.B.11.c, Department of Parks and Recreation, Recreation and Support Services Program, by decreasing the amount in Category "B" to \$13,825,489, revising the total accordingly, and deleting the conditional language related to the Paukukalo Park fencing.
- 3) On page 58, amend Appendix A, Part II, Special Purpose Revenues, Economic Development and Cultural Programs

Revolving Fund, to add condition to read: "Up to \$100,000 must be for Na 'Aikane o Maui for the appropriate reinterment of iwi kūpuna, including informational and code of conduct signage at the former Puamana Beach Park, subject to required approvals."

4) On page 59, amend Appendix A, Part II, Special Purpose Revenues, Hawaiian Cultural Restoration Revolving Fund, to add a condition to read: "Up to \$250,000 must be for Na 'Aikane o Maui to conduct public meetings and to develop and implement a plan for the cleaning and caring for Moku'ula and Mokuhinia, to include informational and code of conduct signage, provide appropriate curation or display of cultural and historic artifacts, and the appropriate reinterment of iwi kūpuna, subject to required approvals."
