Description: Amend Bill 22, CD1 (2023) by:

- 1. In condition (a) under MEO Agricultural Micro Grants Program, delete the requirement for MEO to issue grantee vendor payments in full at the front end to vendors and to instead require MEO to not limit the number of grantee vendors, to pay equipment vendors in full at the time the order is placed, and to pay service vendors 50% of the total cost of the service at the time the contract for services is executed and the balance upon completion of the service;
- 2. Add a condition to Youth Programs to require up to \$280,000 to be used for the Boys and Girls Club Molokai; and
- 3. Grant \$140,000 for Kohala Coast Urgent Care in place of Sust'āinable Molokai.

Motion: Move to amend by:

- 1. On page 3, Section 3.B.1.a.(2)(iv), MEO Agricultural Micro Grants Program, striking in condition (a) "issue grantee vendor payments in full at the front end to vendors." and inserting in its place the following: "not limit the number of grantee vendors. MEO will pay equipment vendors in full at the time the order is placed. MEO will pay service vendors 50% of the total cost of the service at the time the contract for services is executed and will pay the balance upon completion of the service;"
- 2. On page 13, Section 3.B.7.c.(6)(xi), Youth Programs, inserting a new condition (a) to read as follows: "Up to

280,000 must be for the Boys and Girls Club – Molokai;" and

- 3. On page 16, Section 3.B.10.a.(10), striking "Sust'āinable Molokai" and inserting in its place "Kohala Coast Urgent Care"

Upon application approval, MEO will lissue grantee vendor payments in full at the front end to vendors.] not limit the number of grantee vendors.
