Your Budget, Finance, and Economic Development Committee, having met on March 7, 2023, March 21, 2023, March 30, 2023, March 31, 2023, April 3, 2023, April 4, 2023, April 5, 2023, April 6, 2023, April 10, 2023, April 12, 2023, April 13, 2023, April 14, 2023, April 17, 2023, April 18, 2023, April 19, 2023, April 20, 2023, April 21, 2023, April 24, 2023, April 25, 2023, April 26, 2023, and April 27, 2023, makes reference to the following:

- 1. Correspondence dated March 24, 2023, from Mayor Richard T. Bissen, Jr., relating to the Proposed Fiscal Year ("FY") 2024 Budget for the County of Maui. Included in the Mayor's transmittal are the following:
 - a. Bill 22 (2023) entitled "A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE OPERATING BUDGET FOR THE COUNTY OF MAUI FOR THE FISCAL YEAR JULY 1, 2023 TO JUNE 30, 2024." ("Budget bill")

Bill 22's purpose is to appropriate estimated revenues for the operating and capital improvement budget. Incorporated within the proposed bill are Appendix A, which lists Grants and Restricted Use Revenues and Special Purpose Revenues; Appendix B, which is the Schedule of Revenues - Fees, Rates, Assessments and Taxes; Appendix B-1, which lists the County's concessions, leases, and licenses by department; and Appendix C, which provides project titles and descriptions of Capital Improvement Projects.

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b. Bill 23 (2023) entitled "A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE CAPITAL PROGRAM FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 2024." ("Capital Program bill")

Bill 23's purpose is to set the Capital Program for FYs 2024 through 2029. Incorporated within the proposed bill are: Appendix A-1, a report entitled "COUNTY OF MAUI, CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS REPORT, AS OF DECEMBER 31, 2022," which lists all pending capital improvement projects and appropriations, except for Water Fund projects, as of December 31, 2022; Appendix A-2, a report entitled "County of Maui, Capital Improvement Program by District Job and Index, Fiscal Year Ending 6/30/2023 - as of 12/31/2022," which includes pending Water Fund capital improvement projects and appropriations as of December 31, 2022; and Appendix B, which is the proposed Capital Program for FYs 2024 through 2029.

Bill 24 (2023) entitled "A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE C. AUTHORIZING THE **ISSUANCE** OF SIXTY-FIVE MILLION NINE HUNDRED FORTY-FIVE THOUSAND FORTY-THREE DOLLARS (\$65,945,043) AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING FUNDS TO PAY ALL OR A PART OF THE COST OF APPROPRIATIONS FOR IMPROVEMENTS OF AND FOR THE COUNTY OF MAUI; FIXING THE FORM, DENOMINATIONS AND CERTAIN OTHER FEATURES OF SUCH BONDS AND PROVIDING FOR THEIR SALE; AUTHORIZING THE DIRECTOR OF FINANCE TO DETERMINE CERTAIN DETAILS OF THE BONDS: AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF

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A LIKE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF SUCH BONDS; AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF REFUNDING GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS OF THE COUNTY; AND PROVIDING FOR OTHER ACTIONS RELATED TO THE ISSUANCE, SALE AND DELIVERY OF SAID BONDS." ("Bond Authorization bill")

Bill 24's purpose is to authorize the issuance of \$65,945,043 in general obligation bonds for various capital improvement projects.

d. Bill 25 (2023) entitled "A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE DETERMINING THAT PART OF THE PROCEEDS OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI HERETOFORE ISSUED IS IN EXCESS OF THE AMOUNTS REQUIRED FOR THE PURPOSES FOR WHICH SUCH BONDS WERE INITIALLY ISSUED, OR MAY OR SHOULD NOT BE APPLIED TO THOSE PURPOSES, AND DIRECTING SUCH PROCEEDS TO OTHER PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS OR AUTHORIZED PURPOSES OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI." ("Lapsed Bond bill")

Bill 25's purpose is to reauthorize the use of \$2,349,957 in lapsed bond proceeds for the Department of Management, Wailuku-Kahului Community Plan Area, Government Facilities, 60 South Church Street Building Renovations.

e. Bill 26 (2023) entitled "A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI TO ENTER INTO AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT FOR A LOAN FROM THE STATE OF

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HAWAII'S WATER POLLUTION CONTROL REVOLVING FUND FOR VARIOUS WASTEWATER PROJECTS, FISCAL YEAR 2024 BUDGET ORDINANCE." ("Water Pollution Control Loan bill")

Bill 26's purpose is to authorize the Mayor to enter into intergovernmental agreements to finance the following wastewater projects: (1) Napili Wastewater Pump Station No. 3 Modifications, with funds not to exceed \$600,000; and (2) Kaanapali Resort R-1 Water Distribution System Expansion, with funds not to exceed \$8,500,000.

f. Resolution 23-117 entitled "ADOPTING THE FUEL TAX RATES FOR THE COUNTY OF MAUI, EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2023."

Resolution 23-117's purpose is to adopt the fuel tax rates for the County of Maui, effective July 1, 2023, in accordance with Section 243-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS"), and Section 3.20.010, Maui County Code.

2. Bill 27 (2023) entitled "A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 3.36.100, MAUI COUNTY CODE, RELATING TO THE REIMBURSEMENT OF COUNTY GRANTEES."

Bill 27's purpose is to amend Section 3.36.100, Maui County Code, to authorize the County to reimburse grantees for expenses that pre-date the contract's execution date, if the funds are expended in the same fiscal year that the contract is encumbered.

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3. Bill 36 (2023) entitled "A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 2.08.060, MAUI COUNTY CODE, TO REVISE THE PAY PLAN AND RANGES IN THE OFFICE OF COUNCIL SERVICES."

Bill 36's purpose is to add three new position titles: Senior Council Services Technician, Project Assignment Specialist, and Council Services Assistant (full-time); two new pay ranges; and institute a 5 percent pay increase for all pay ranges and steps.

4. Resolution 23-123 entitled "SUSPENDING THE PROVISIONS OF SUBSECTION 2.08.060(D), MAUI COUNTY CODE, FOR FISCAL YEAR 2024."

Resolution 23-123's purpose is to suspend all provisions of Subsection 2.08.060(D) for FY 2024.

5. Resolution 23-124 entitled "SETTING THE PAY RANGES AND PAY STEPS FOR STAFF OF THE OFFICE OF COUNCIL SERVICES."

Resolution 23-124's purpose is to set the pay ranges and pay steps for two Senior Council Services Technicians, one Council Services Assistant (full-time), and one Senior Accountant.

6. Bill 37 (2023) entitled "A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 3.81, MAUI COUNTY CODE, TO ESTABLISH A DEDICATED FUNDING SOURCE FOR THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND CULTURAL PROGRAMS REVOLVING FUND."

Bill 37's purpose is to amend Section 3.81.030, Maui County Code, to enable the Council to appropriate a minimum of 2

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percent of the certified real property tax ("RPT") revenues, not to exceed \$10,000,000 in any one fiscal year.

7. Bill 38 (2023) entitled "A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 3.34, MAUI COUNTY CODE, TO CREATE AND FUND AN 'OHANA ASSISTANCE PILOT PROGRAM."

Bill 38's purpose is to amend Chapter 3.34, Maui County Code, to create and fund an 'ohana assistance pilot program to offer grants of up to \$50,000 to property owners to build an accessory dwelling or second farm dwelling for permanent long-term occupancy as residential workforce housing units.

Your Committee notes the Council held a public hearing on the Mayor's Proposed FY 2024 Budget and Capital Program bills, in accordance with Section 9-4, Revised Charter of the County of Maui (1983), as amended ("Charter"), and Section 92-41, HRS, on April 14, 2023.

Your Committee notes the Council held a public hearing on Real Property Tax ("RPT") rates, in accordance with Section 3.48.565, Maui County Code, and Section 92-41, HRS, on April 26, 2023, and reconvened on May 12, 2023, to adopt a resolution fixing the RPT rates for FY 2024.

Your Committee notes the Council also held public hearings on Fuel Tax rates, in accordance with Sections 92-41 and 243-5, HRS, and Section 3.20.010, Maui County Code, and Motor Vehicle Weight Tax rates, in accordance with Sections 92-41 and 249-13, HRS, and Chapter 3.24, Maui County Code, on May 12, 2023.

In addition, your Committee notes the Council must pass bills approving the Budget and Capital Program on second and final reading by June 10, 2023, in accordance with Charter Section 9-5.

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Your Committee extensively reviewed the Mayor's Proposed FY 2024 Budget from April 3, 2023, to April 20, 2023. Decision-making began on April 21, 2023, and was completed on April 27, 2023.

GENERAL

Your Committee considered the FY 2024 proposed Budget with the Mayor's five stated priorities in mind: water, housing, infrastructure, economic resilience, and environment. The Committee members' priorities were also considered in conjunction with the best interests of the County of Maui.

Your Committee returned to the practice of receiving public testimony in various residency areas (March 30, 2023, West Maui; March 31, 2023, Molokai; April 3, 2023, Makawao-Hāʻiku-Pāʻia; April 6, 2023, East Maui; April 10, 2023, South Maui; April 12, 2023, Upcountry; April 13, 2023, Lānaʻi; and April 14, 2023, Central Maui encompassing Kahului and Wailuku-Waiheʻe-Waikapū) to promote open government and provide for government transparency and public input. Your Committee's meetings and the Council's related public hearings were held in person and by interactive conference technology.

Your Committee prioritized fiscal responsibility by: reducing bond appropriations in light of higher interest rates, paying down debt including Other Post-Employment Benefits or "OPEB," and raising certain rates and fees. Your Committee agreed with the Mayor that paying down unfunded liabilities should be a priority, noting the County earns 7 percent interest by doing so.

Your Committee identified the need to support the labor force by encouraging the filling of vacancies and supporting efforts to retain employees. Your Committee agreed to reduce salary funding for numerous unfilled and expansion positions while maintaining equivalent personnel ("E/P") counts. Your Committee also prioritized appropriations for social services, affordable housing, and open space.

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The Mayor's Proposed Budget estimated County revenue at \$1,080,026,952 for FY 2024. Of that amount, \$931,425,952 was appropriated for operations and \$148,601,000 was appropriated for Capital Improvement Projects ("CIP").

Your Committee's recommendation for the FY 2024 Budget was to decrease the Mayor's Proposed Budget by \$8,591,694, or approximately 0.8 percent, to \$1,071,435,258. Your Committee proposed decreasing operating appropriations by \$11,134,028 and increasing CIP appropriations by \$2,542,334.

Your Committee considered various housekeeping corrections submitted by the Budget Director and voted to incorporate them into the FY 2024 Budget.

Your Committee recommended Appendix A, Part I; Appendix A, Part II; Appendix B; and Appendix C be revised accordingly to incorporate your Committee's suggested revisions.

Your Committee's revisions to the Mayor's Proposed FY 2024 Budget appropriations are identified in a worksheet attached and incorporated as Exhibit "1."

The following is a summary of your Committee's recommendations as they relate to Revenues and Expenditures.

REVENUES

On April 19, 2023, the County Clerk received the certification by the Director of Finance of the net taxable real property within the County of Maui, in accordance with Sections 3.48.135 and 3.48.580, Maui County Code. The certification was distributed to your Committee on April 19, 2023. The Director of Finance certified that for FY 2024, the net taxable real property valuation is \$70,342,064,220, which is expected to

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generate revenue in the amount of \$534,623,681. The certification considers the circuit breaker tax credit and the Mayor's proposed minimum tax, and assumes the tax rates proposed by the Mayor are adopted by the Council. This certification represented a decrease of \$3,077,854 from the Mayor's Proposed Budget of \$537,701,535 in anticipated RPT revenues.

Your Committee agreed with the Mayor's proposed RPT rates, which largely reflected the rates revised and adopted by the Council in FY 2023, with the exception of further reductions to the RPT obligations of owner occupants with homes valued up to \$1,000,000 and \$3,000,000, respectively. The Mayor's proposed RPT rate for owner occupants of homes exceeding \$3,000,000 in valuation was increased.

Your Committee notes the Mayor's proposed RPT rate classifications included decreases to Tier 1 and 2 rates and an increase to Tier 3 rates in the Owner Occupied classification as follows:

- Owner Occupied
 - o Tier 1 up to \$1,000,000, from \$2.00 to \$1.90
 - o Tier 2 \$1,000,001 to \$3,000,000, from \$2.10 to \$2.00
 - o Tier 3 in excess of \$3,000,000, from \$2.71 to \$2.75

The remaining RPT rate classifications remained unchanged:

- Non Owner Occupied
 - o Tier 1 up to \$1,000,000, at \$5.85
 - o Tier 2 \$1,000,001 to \$4,500,000, at \$8.00
 - o Tier 3 in excess of \$4,500,000, at \$12.50
- Apartment, at \$3.50
- Hotel and Resort, at \$11.75

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- Time Share, at \$14.60
- TVR-STRH, at \$11.85
- Long Term Rental
 - o Tier 1 up to \$1,000,000, at \$3.00
 - o Tier 2 \$1,000,001 to \$3,000,000, at \$5.00
 - o Tier 3 in excess of \$3,000,000, at \$8.00
- Agricultural, at \$5.74
- Conservation, at \$6.43
- Commercial, at \$6.05
- Industrial, at \$7.05
- Commercialized Residential, at \$4.40

Your Committee discussed and recommended the Motor Vehicle Weight Tax and Fuel Tax rates for FY 2024 also remain unchanged.

However, your Committee recommended establishing a new water rate category for hotels and resorts at \$8.12 per 1,000 gallons of usage per month to encourage water conservation.

Your Committee also recommended an increase to the electrical permit fees for Swimming Pools, Fountains and Similar Installations, specifically for wiring in or about outdoor commercial and residential swimming pools, hot tubs, spas, fountains and decorative pools from \$46 to \$50.

Your Committee agreed to increase various Planning Department fees as recommended in the Report on the Planning Department Cost of

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Services (User Fee) Study, Maui County, Hawai'i, dated March 2020, prepared in accordance with Section 3.01.030, Maui County Code.

Your Committee recommended deleting all fees related to the Lāna'i Commercial Kitchen as the facility is no longer available for public use.

Your Committee recommended deleting the fee for reduced monthly passes for fixed routes in its entirety beginning January 1, 2024, and amended the eligibility requirements based on financial need.

Your Committee also recommended the following be decreased:

- \$213,600 for Charges for Current Services due to the decrease in the fee for the reduced monthly pass for fixed routes;
- \$10,000,000 for Interfund Transfers to reduce the supplemental transfer to the Highway Fund due to the availability of American Rescue Plan Act ("ARPA") funds for a one-time loss of revenue allowance; and
- \$6,750,000 in Bond/Lapsed Bond appropriations for Capital Improvement Projects.

EXPENDITURES

Your Committee heard testimony from the community who urged support of various appropriations and provided comments and suggestions on the Mayor's Proposed Budget.

Your Committee recommended \$2,498,214 in salary reductions, across all departments, which resulted in a reduction of associated fringe costs, and also reduced funding for various vacant and expansion positions.

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Your Committee diligently reviewed and made thoughtful adjustments to the operations, equipment, and CIP for County departments.

Your Committee recommended the following adjustments to the Office of the County Clerk:

- Decrease operations by \$27,250, which reflects a reduction of \$39,250 in warehouse rental costs and the addition of \$12,000 for a text curing program for two elections;
- Add \$85,000 for legislative tracking software; and
- Decrease of \$315,000 in CIP funds related to renovations for the Clerk's Office and Elections Division Warehouse.

Your Committee agreed to appropriate partial year funding of \$25,000 for an Ambassador position in the Office of Council Services who would assist the public during committee meetings, and \$250,000 for a document scanning project. Your Committee also agreed to fund salary increases for certain personnel and increase the pay plan for the Office of Council Services, except for the Legislative Attorneys, by 8 percent.

Your Committee recommended the following adjustments to the Department of Agriculture:

- Decrease \$3,600 for computer equipment for unfunded positions;
- Decrease \$65,000 for professional services;
- Delete \$238,000 for the Maui County Farm Bureau due to one-time funding in FY 2023;
- Decrease \$250,000 from Agriculture Promotion and Technology;
- Add conditional language for the MEO Agricultural Micro Grants Program, which provides for \$3,000,000 for micro grants in the amount of \$25,000 per grantee for food-producing farmers, with a preference to

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- socially-disadvantaged farming applicants such as women and native Hawaiians;
- Condition \$375,000 for Hawaii Farmers Union United ("HFUU") for the Farmer Apprentice Mentoring Program and HFUU Chapter Outreach and Local Food Hub Support Program;
- Condition \$225,000 for Agriculture Promotion and Technology, of which \$75,000 each may be used for a feasibility study for an agricultural cooperative for equipment, materials, and supplies; and
- Condition an additional \$750,000 for Agriculture Promotion and Technology for infrastructure improvements on established agricultural operations.

Your Committee also agreed with the Administration's request to move feral animal management grants from the Department of Agriculture to the Office of the Mayor. Your Committee also agreed to move the Kula Agricultural Park Phase I Expansion – Upcountry Agricultural Park from the Office of the Mayor to the Department of Agriculture.

Your Committee agreed to various operations-related reductions by \$111,902 in the Department of the Corporation Counsel, while adding 2.6 E/P and appropriating \$27,734 for two law clerk internships.

Your Committee agreed to decrease Repair and Maintenance Services/Contracts and Repairs & Maintenance by a total of \$45,000 as requested by the Department of Environmental Management, Solid Waste Operations Program, and to add \$500,000 for a grant to the West Maui Greencycle for a school waste composting program under the Environmental Protection and Sustainability Program.

Your Committee recommended the following adjustments to the Department of Finance, Countywide Costs:

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- Increase the supplemental transfer to the Environmental Protection and Sustainability Fund by \$463,205.
- Decrease the supplemental transfer to the Highway Fund by \$9,979,651.
- Decrease the supplemental transfer to the Solid Waste Fund by \$45,000.
- Decrease the transfer to the Emergency Fund by \$11,286,974.
- Increase the transfer to OPEB by \$9,831,641, further paying down the County's outstanding debt.
- Add a line-item in the amount of \$2,000,000 in the Department of Finance, Countywide Costs, to cover maintenance costs for the anticipated purchase of Haggai Institute.

Your Committee recommended the following adjustments to the Department of Fire and Public Safety:

- Add \$150,000 in professional services for a site selection study for the relocation of the Kīhei Fire Station;
- Increase equipment by \$80,000 for the replacement of rescue boat motors;
- Increase and condition \$300,000 in CIP funds to begin the renovation and rehabilitation of facilities identified in the fire facility condition assessment; and
- Decrease CIP funds by \$3,000,000 for the Administration Building Acquisition project.

Your Committee recommended the following adjustments to the Department of Housing and Human Concerns:

• Delete \$2,000,000 for contractual services for the implementation of Bills 111 and 107;

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- Add and condition \$348,000 for the Women's Reintegration Program for up to \$36,000 per year, per person, for temporary housing for up to eighteen months;
- Condition \$188,550 for mobile water stations and mobile medical services, and rename the grant from "Homeless Programs" to "Houseless Programs";
- Increase by \$21,280 for Hui Laulima O Hāna for Hāna Dialysis Home Program as requested by the Department;
- Add \$350,000 for the Aloha House, Phase 2 construction, and condition that the amount must be used for construction of a residential 12-bed dormitory to provide enhanced access, support services, and increased bed capacity to care for individuals with behavioral health and substance abuse issues;
- Increase Maui Economic Opportunity, Inc. ("MEO") Being Empowered and Safe Together (B.E.S.T.) Reintegration Program by \$150,000;
- Increase Maui Humane Society for Molokai by \$200,000 for improvements and maintenance to the Molokai animal shelter; and
- Add \$150,000 for the Hawai'i Animal Rescue Foundation.

Your Committee recommended the following adjustments to the Department of Management:

- Reduce professional services by \$80,000;
- Increase \$200,000 for a consultant for community-driven engineering, planning, and community engagement regarding conditions in the Palama Drive neighborhood; and
- Increase staffing count by 2.0 E/P, of which 1.0 E/P will be unfunded, increase salaries and fringe costs by \$81,831, and appropriate \$300,000 for software to address the implementation of Bills 111 and 107 related to affordable housing.

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Your Committee recommended the following adjustments to the Office of the Mayor:

- Decrease \$20,000 for office equipment;
- Delete \$25,000 for Hāmākualoa Preserve;
- Condition \$103,240 to be used for the Maui Nui Seabird Recovery Project;
- Condition \$40,000 for Haʿikū Community Association for two independent contractor positions and lab fees, and coordination of the online Natural Resource Data Solutions database;
- Add \$90,000 for Upcountry drought resiliency and storm water reuse:
- Decrease \$200,000 for Sust'āinable Molokai;
- Rename the line-item grant for wetland restoration work from South Maui Wetlands to Maui County Wetlands;
- Add \$200,000 for a grant to establish a safe zone for houseless individuals;
- Add conditions for the Wailuku Economic Development, Environmental, and Cultural Programs to include:
 - o \$40,000 for Ke Kula 'O Pi'ilani Hawaiian language and culture school;
 - \$15,000 for Lōkahi Pacific for Re-tree Hawai'i;
 - o \$25,000 for Maui Food Bank;
 - o \$20,000 for MEO Federal Communications Commission to connect low-income households with subsidized or free internet and tablets;
 - \$35,000 for Maui Academy of Performing Arts Phase I renovations or Phase II housing study; and
 - o \$5,000 for MEO Imi Pono Challenge.
- Add conditions for Kahului Economic Development, Environmental, and Cultural Programs to include:
 - o \$25,000 for Maui Matsuri;

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- o \$10,000 for Paukukalo Hawaiian Homestead Community Association, Prince Jonah Kuhio Kalaniana'ole Celebration;
- o \$10,000 for Na Leo Pulama Punana Leo/La 'Ohana;
- o \$10,000 for the Royal Order of Kamehameha;
- o \$10,000 for Binhi At Ani;
- o \$10,000 for Voices of Micronesia of Maui; and
- o A notice must be provided to Council if funds are to be expended without prior Council notification.
- Add conditions for East Maui Economic Development, Environmental, and Cultural Programs to include:
 - o \$30,000 for Hāna Arts;
 - o \$15,000 for Festivals of Aloha;
 - \$10,000 for Hāna Business Council;
 - o \$5,000 for Holani Hāna;
 - o \$10,000 for Na Mamo O Mu'olea (Ka'ahumanu Statue Blessing);
 - o \$10,000 for National Tropical Botanical Gardens Kahanu Gardens:
 - o \$5,000 for Kipahulu 'Ohana;
 - \$20,000 for Ma Ka Hāna Ka Ike Mahele Farms;
 - o \$6,000 for Na Mamo O Mu'olea Limu Festival;
 - o \$10,000 for Na Moku Aupuni O Koʻolau Hui;
 - o \$3,500 for Na Keiki O Lawai'a;
 - \$5,000 for defibrillator units for MEO buses in Hāna;
 and
 - o A notice must be provided to Council if funds are to be expended without prior Council notification.
- Add conditions for Makawao-Pā'ia-Ha'ikū Economic Development, Environmental, and Cultural Programs to include:
 - \$80,000 for Makawao-Pā'ia-Ha'ikū residency area clean-up efforts, security, beautification, maintenance, community outreach, and educational events;

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- o \$15,000 for Makawao Rodeo Parade;
- \$15,000 for King Kekaulike High School Foundation for fundraising events;
- \$20,000 for Upcountry Strong for food distribution events; and
- o \$10,000 for Kula Kaiapuni o Maui ma Pā'ia.
- Add conditions for Pukalani-Kula-'Ulupalakua Economic Development, Environmental, and Cultural Programs to include:
 - \$10,000 for King Kekaulike High School Foundation for fundraising events;
 - \$8,000 for Pukalani Community Association, Golf Cart Christmas Fair;
 - o \$40,000 for Watershed Protection;
 - o \$20,000 for Keokea Hawaiian Homestead Farm Lots; and
 - o A notice must be provided to Council if funds are to be expended without prior Council notification.
- Add conditions for Lāna'i Economic Development, Environmental, and Cultural Programs to include:
 - \$40,000 for Lāna'i Community Association (Pineapple Festival);
 - o \$35,000 for HFUU Lana'i Chapter;
 - o \$30,000 for Lāna'i Cat Sanctuary;
 - \$10,000 for Lāna'i Academy of Performing Arts;
 - o \$10,000 for Lāna'i Art Center;
 - o \$10,000 for Lāna'i Culture and Heritage Center; and
 - o \$5,000 for Lana'i Community-based Subsistence Fishing Area.
- Add conditions for Molokai Economic Development, Environmental, and Cultural Programs to include:
 - o \$50,000 for Urgent Care Program or Medical Services on Molokai;
 - \$30,000 for Ka Molokai Makahiki;

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o \$30,000 for Ho'aka Mana; and

- o \$30,000 for Sust'āinable Molokai Fiscal Sponsorship for Ahupua'a signage, Boards & Stone in Every Home, and 'Āina Back Initiatives.
- Add conditions for South Maui Economic Development, Environmental, and Cultural Programs to include:
 - \$40,000 for Fourth Friday;
 - o \$50,000 for Youth Sports and Youth Educational Program; and
 - o A notice must be provided to Council if funds are to be expended without prior Council notification.
- Add conditions for West Maui Economic Development, Environmental, and Cultural Programs to include:
 - \$25,000 for Lāhainā Restoration Foundation for Old Lāhainā Prison perimeter wall structural assessment;
 - o \$30,000 for West Maui Community Clean-up events and projects;
 - o \$5,000 for International Indigenous Initiative for Transformative Collaboration; and
 - \$7,500 for Lōkahi Pacific for Re-tree Hawai'i.
- Increase the condition for Maui Economic Development Board, Inc., from \$75,000 to \$100,000, to read:
 - o At least \$100,000 must be for science and technology programs for Molokai schools.
- Make various adjustments to Sports and Events Promotion:
 - Condition \$250,000 for the participation and hosting of sports and events by and for Maui County residents;
 - o Rename Hawai'i Construction Career Day grant to Maui County Engineer and Surveyor Career Day; and
 - o Increase \$200,000 for Molokai, Lāna'i, and Hāna student travel and condition that \$180,000 be used for Molokai and Lāna'i students, and \$20,000 be used for Hāna students.

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- Condition \$20,000 in Workforce Development Programs for Ka Ipu Kukui Youth Program, provided that travel must be funded for qualified participants from Molokai and Lāna'i.
- Increase by \$300,000 for a grant to University of Hawaii Maui College for clean energy workforce development.
- Add \$300,000 for Maui Epic Swim funded through decreases of \$50,000 each from Cultural and Arts, Tourism Management, Sports & Events, Tech Business Promotion, Workforce Development, and Environmental Protection line-items.
- Increase Festivals of Aloha by \$40,000.
- Decrease \$200,000 for Halau Ke'alaokamaile as County funding is no longer needed.
- Increase Hui No'eau Family Arts Center by \$25,000.
- Condition \$15,000 in Cultural and Arts Program for Nisei Veterans Memorial Center for digitizing the Stan Izumigawa archives.
- Increase \$150,000 for a grant to Hawai'i Land Trust for the planning and permitting to renovate an existing historic home at the Waihe'e Refuge into a cultural learning center.
- Add conditions to Tourism Management Grant Funds as follows:
 - o Funds must not be used for marketing and promotion but for tourism management or education efforts; and
 - o Up to \$300,000 to be used for a socioeconomic and environmental carrying capacity study for Molokai.
- Decrease \$300,000 for Feral Animal Control Lana'i.

Your Committee recommended the following adjustments to the Department of Parks and Recreation:

• Add \$50,000 for a grant to the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands for Paukukalo Park fencing;

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- Increase by \$400,000 for salaries, wages, and fringe costs to increase the minimum wage for PALs aides to \$20 per hour, and raise the pay for other positions accordingly. These salaries were increased due to a lack of applicants for the positions and to bring the hourly wage up to the self-sufficiency wage for a single adult in Maui County, adjusted for inflation;
- Increase and condition \$400,000 in CIP funds for the assessment, design, and planning at Pā'ani Mai Park and Hali'imaile Park, including ADA access into existing parking areas, and planning, design, and permitting for lighting improvements at the Eddie Tam Memorial Park playing fields;
- Increase CIP funds of \$400,000 for the design and construction of the Fraser Avenue dog park in Lāna'i City, and \$80,000 for the Lāna'i Community Field House;
- Reallocate \$4,000,000 in CIP funds for the War Memorial Gym Building Improvements and \$4,750,000 for the Lāhainā Civic Center Rehabilitation from Bond Fund to General Fund; and
- Increase CIP funds by \$1,000,000 in Park Assessment Fund for shade structures and locked dugouts for West Maui Park Playgrounds, including Honokowai Beach Park, Lāhainā Recreation Center, and Wahikuli Terrace Park.

Your Committee added \$500,000 to Category "B" in the Department of Police, Technical and Support Services Program, to maintain the Hexagon platforms, critical to the emergency dispatch system. Your Committee also agreed to increase Emergency Services Dispatcher Retention Pay in the Department of Police by \$50,000, recognizing the critical need to retain the emergency dispatchers. These additional funds will enable the Department to increase the retention pay from \$500 to \$750, as recommended by the Chief of Police.

Your Committee recommended the following adjustments to the Department of Public Works:

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- Decrease \$350,000 in CIP funds already reflected in the Department of Management for the Countywide Facilities Maintenance Program;
- Increase \$500,000 in CIP funds for the Countywide Bridge and Drainage Program for removing debris and silt in the culvert under Waiakoa Bridge;
- Increase \$1,250,000 in CIP funds for the Countywide Bridge and Drainage Program to provide matching funds for an anticipated grant;
- Increase \$77,334 in CIP funds for multi-modal and pedestrian safety improvements in West Maui, including Lower Honoapi'ilani Road, Ainakea Road, Lahainaluna Road, Nāpili Park, and Honokowai Park;
- Increase and condition CIP funds in the amount of \$2,000,000 for East Maui road reconstruction and pavement preservation;
- Increase \$200,000 in CIP funds for the West Maui Greenway; and
- Increase of \$1,250,000 for an anticipated grant from the State of Hawai'i, HB 300, SD1, Flood Prevention and Mitigation.

Your Committee agreed to reduce certain bus fees in the Department of Transportation and add \$300,000 for a feasibility study for the Lāna'i Ferry.

Your Committee agreed to increase operations and services for the Department of Water Supply by \$250,000 for professional services to include a contract to prepare a feasibility study and management or business plan for the new East Maui Water Authority.

Your Committee agreed to reduce \$286,330 in expenses from the Highway Beautification and Disposal of Abandoned or Derelict Vehicles Revolving Fund and remove the \$50,000 condition for the Hāmākualoa Open Space Preserve.

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Your Committee agreed to the following conditions to the Open Space, Natural Resources, Cultural Resources, and Scenic Views Preservation Fund:

- Up to \$5,000,000 must be used to acquire parcels in Kīhei containing wetlands to support the implementation of the Kīhei Drainage Master Plan;
- Up to \$500,000 must be for matching funds to the Molokai Land Trust for the acquisition of land for wetland protection and restoration on Molokai; and
- Up to \$750,000 must be for Nā Mamo Aloha 'Āina o Honokōhau for the purchase of tax map key ("TMK") (2) 4-1-002:008.

Your Committee agreed to the following adjustments to the Affordable Housing Fund:

- Clarify that the funds allocated for the Līloa Housing project and Hale Mahaolu Ke Kahua project are loans;
- Amend project references from "homeless" to "unsheltered";
- Condition \$7,500,000 to Ka Hale A Ke Ola for the purchase and retrofit of TMK (2) 4-5-006:004 located at 222 Papalaua Street;
- Condition up to \$250,000 for a master plan and feasibility study for TMK (2) 4-9-002:058 (por.) located at 5th Street, Lāna'i City, Hawai'i; and
- Condition \$10,650,000 in funding for Waikapū Affordable Housing Development and provide that the release of the funds must be contingent on Resolution 18-150, as amended by Resolution 20-107, being further amended to extend the completion of the construction deadline beyond September 7, 2024.

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Your Committee recommended that the Hawaiian Cultural Restoration Revolving Fund be conditioned to require a semi-annual report to the Council on the use of the fund.

Your Committee recommended that the Disposal of Vehicles Fee Fund increase by 0.5 E/P and \$19,485 for salaries.

Your Committee voted 9-0 to recommend passage on first reading of the revised proposed Budget bill, the revised proposed Capital Program bill, the revised proposed Bond Authorization bill, the proposed Lapsed Bond bill, the proposed Water Pollution Control Revolving Loan bill, and the revised proposed bill to revise the pay plan for the Office of Council Services; to recommend adoption of the proposed resolutions to set the Fuel Tax Rates for the County of Maui, to suspend the provisions of subsection 2.08.060(D), Maui County Code, and the resolution to set the pay ranges and pay steps for staff of the Office of Council Services; and to refer Bills 27 and 37 to your Budget, Finance, and Economic Development Committee, and Bill 38 to your Housing and Land Use Committee for further discussion. Committee Chair Sugimura, Vice-Chair Kama, and members Cook, Johnson, Lee, Paltin, Rawlins-Fernandez, Sinenci, and U'u-Hodgins voted "aye."

Your Committee is in receipt of Bill 22, CD1 (2023), Bill 23, CD1 (2023), Bill 24, CD1 (2023), and Bill 36, CD1 (2023), approved as to form and legality by the Department of the Corporation Counsel, incorporating your Committee's recommended revisions and nonsubstantive revisions.

Your Committee notes that, in accordance with Section 47-5, HRS, an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the Council's membership is required to approve the alternate uses of the lapsed bond proceeds set in the Lapsed Bond bill.

Your Budget, Finance, and Economic Development Committee RECOMMENDS the following:

iv. MEO Agricultural Micro Grants Program

(a) MEO will receive a \$3,000,000 grant from the County to manage and distribute micro grant payments up to \$25,000 per grantee. At the close of the grant period, MEO will transmit a list of grantees to the council, which will include recipient name, district, grantfunded projects, and whether the recipient satisfies kuleana land ownership, native Hawaiian, or female demographics. Upon application approval, MEO will issue grantee vendor payments in full at the front end to vendors. The micro grants must be dispersed with efforts to ensure equitable distribution among applicants in Maui, Molokai, and Lāna'i, with preference given to socially disadvantaged farming applicants, such as women and native Hawaiians, and to farmers who did not receive funding in prior fiscal years from the micro grant funding. An application deadline will be set and grants not dispersed until MEO ensures these preferential guidelines will be met. The micro grants will be exclusively to foodproducing farm businesses that operate on less than an aggregate of 12 acres, or up to an aggregate of 40 usable acres for livestock

GENERAL BUDGET PROVISIONS

SECTION 5. **E/Ps and LTAs.** An "E/P" or equivalent personnel is the decimal equivalent of a full-time position. A full-time position is equal to 2,080 scheduled hours of work during the fiscal year. All positions are computed as an equivalent of 2,080 scheduled hours of work; 1.0 E/P equals 2,080 hours. This method of computing the number of authorized personnel in a department or program must not be construed to grant to an incumbent in a position any rights beyond those provided by law or collective-bargaining agreement. All positions must be identified by an E/P designation. Disbursement must be limited to the total number of E/Ps identified in a program appropriation. Any transfer of E/Ps from one program to another must be approved by ordinance.

"LTA" or Limited Term Appointment means an appointment that is made from an eligible list or through a non-competitive promotion, transfer, or demotion for a specified temporary period.

- SECTION 6. **Salaries and premium pay.** Appropriations for salaries and premium pay may be disbursed within the pertinent office, department, agency, or program for the following:
- (A) a temporary position to functionally replace a permanent employee who is on long-term leave or who has been temporarily assigned to replace a permanent employee who is on long-term leave; disbursement must be limited in duration to the leave of the permanent employee who is on long-term leave; and
- (B) trainee positions for which there is an existing or anticipated vacancy and for which hiring and replacing is critical to continued operations, if funds are available.
- SECTION 7. **A and B accounts.** Unless otherwise provided in this ordinance, appropriations for each program may be disbursed for the following categories of use, if the disbursement is within the program and category of use for which it was appropriated:
 - (A) salaries, premium pay, or reallocation pay; and
 - (B) operations or services, and equipment.

Furthermore, the Budget Director must submit to the Council a quarterly report on all unbudgeted equipment purchased during the Fiscal Year.

Disbursement for salaries, premium pay, and reallocation pay must include temporary assignment pay, overtime pay, night differential pay, hazard pay, standby pay, emergency call back pay, reallocations, and reclassifications. Funds must not be disbursed for reallocations and reclassifications that involve a change in supervisory duties and responsibilities until the County Council receives written notice setting forth:

- (A) an explanation of the reasons for the change; and
- (B) organizational charts showing the existing organization and the proposed organization of the department.

The Administration must notify the County Council of any reallocation or reclassification when a position is transferred from the blue-collar compensation plan, white-collar non-professional compensation plan, whitecollar professional compensation plan, uniformed fire compensation plan, or uniformed police compensation plan to a different compensation plan. An explanation of any temporary assignment, temporary transfer, and temporary allocation that is expected to be in effect for more than 30 days must be provided to the County Council. Receipt of written notice by the County Clerk constitutes receipt by the County Council. Any amounts appropriated as County matching funds may be encumbered and disbursed for operations, services, or equipment. Furthermore, funds from the Countywide Self Insurance Program may be encumbered and disbursed for the replacement of motor vehicles and other equipment relating to insurance reimbursements.

Appropriations may be disbursed by a department to reimburse another department for work performed.

SECTION 8. **General obligation bonds.** General obligation bonds appropriated in this ordinance need not be authorized contemporaneously with this ordinance to be included as estimated revenues. Any increase or decrease in revenues or any increase or decrease in appropriations to any department or program, any transfer of funds from one department to another, or any transfer of funds within a department must be made in accordance with law.

SECTION 9. **County and State laws.** All provisions of law contained in the Maui County Code and Hawaii Revised Statutes that affect the expenditure of the revenues from the rates, fees, assessments, and taxes in this ordinance are incorporated into this ordinance. All provisions of law limiting the expenditure of fund revenues are incorporated into this ordinance.

SECTION 10. **Capital improvement projects.** Project descriptions for each capital improvement project is described in Appendix C.

SECTION 11. Grant revenues.

- (A) The grant revenues itemized in Part I of Appendix A that include revenues from grants and revenues with restricted uses, are expected to be derived by the County from Federal, State, or private sources during Fiscal Year 2024. These grant revenues are appropriated in the amounts set forth in Part I of Appendix A to the programs and uses identified in this ordinance, subject to the following conditions:
 - (1) The Administration must be in receipt of notification from the grantor:
 - (a) providing a grant award or a statement that the grant award will be forthcoming; and
 - (b) that the County is authorized to incur costs in accordance with the grant award; and
 - (2) The Administration must provide written notice to the County Council, attaching a copy of the notification from the grantor.

Salaries and premium pay for equivalent personnel are compensated based on the terms or rules and regulations of the grant. Limited term personnel are deemed appropriated for the entire duration of the grant. Unless specifically authorized, grant revenues must not be used for salaries and personnel services for a County position.

(B) Subject to the requirements of this section, the Mayor is authorized to execute any documents to receive and expend the funds for the grants and programs identified in Part I of Appendix A.

- (C) Grant revenues derived during Fiscal Year 2024 that are not included in Part I of Appendix A are subject to Sections 12 and 13, as may be appropriate.
- SECTION 12. **Additional grant revenues.** Whenever the County is notified that grant revenues are available from Federal or State sources for programs other than those identified in Part I of Appendix A, the County Council may authorize the acceptance of the revenues by adding the revenues to Part I of Appendix A. The following procedure must apply:
- (A) These grant revenues are deemed appropriated upon enactment of an ordinance adding the estimated revenues to Part I of Appendix A; provided, that disbursement is conditioned on:
 - (1) receipt of a notification of grant award from the grantor, or receipt of notification from the grantor that the grant award will be forthcoming and that the County is authorized to incur costs in accordance with the grant award; and
 - (2) written notice to the County Council, to which a copy of the notification from the grantor is attached.
- (B) Subject to the requirements of this section, the Mayor is authorized to execute any documents to receive and expend the funds for the programs identified in the grant award.
- SECTION 13. **Donations.** Whenever the County receives a donation of money from private sources not provided for in Part I of Appendix A, the County Council may approve its acceptance and authorize its expenditure in accordance with Chapter 3.56, Maui County Code.
- SECTION 14. **Special purpose revenues.** The special purpose revenues set forth in Part II of Appendix A are expected to be on hand as of June 30, 2023, or derived by the County during Fiscal Year 2024, from the programs or activities described in the Revised Charter of the County of Maui (1983), as amended, Maui County Code, or Hawaii Revised Statutes at the references set forth under A through BB in this ordinance. The balance remaining in each of the revolving or special funds as of June 30, 2023, is reappropriated to the particular fund. Revenues derived from the particular program or activities during the fiscal year must be deposited into the applicable special purpose

revenue fund. Expenditures from a fund must be through appropriations set forth in Part II of Appendix A.

SECTION 15. **Fees, rates, assessments, and taxes.** The fees, rates, assessments, and taxes in Appendix B are adopted.

SECTION 16. **Schedule of concessions, leases, and licenses.** The schedule of concessions, leases, and licenses in Appendix B-1 is adopted.

SECTION 17. **Estimated funds.** The several amounts listed below are declared to be the estimated encumbered County funds as of June 30, 2023, and unencumbered County funds on hand as of July 1, 2023. The estimated amounts set forth in this section are shown in accordance with Section 9-3 of the Revised Charter of the County of Maui (1983), as amended. The actual amounts of any encumbered and unencumbered funds that the County will have on hand as of June 30, 2023, will be set forth in the Annual Comprehensive Financial Report.

Encumbered funds: \$342,939,962 Unencumbered funds (carryover/savings) \$74,531,064

SECTION 18. Transfers and loans. For the purpose of this section, "County fund" excludes pension or retirement funds, funds under the control of any independent board or commission, funds set aside for the redemption of bonds or the payment of interest thereon, park dedication funds, or special purpose funds. If there is money in any County fund that the Director of Finance determines to be in excess of the amount necessary for the fund's immediate requirements, the Director of Finance may make a temporary transfer or interest-free loan from the fund to the Bond Fund or the Housing Interim Financing and Buy-Back Revolving Fund, if the transfer or loan will not impede the County's necessary or desirable financial operation. The amount of temporary transfers or loans must not exceed the amount of general obligation bonds, state loans, or notes authorized but not issued. At any time, the aggregate amount of transfers and loans that must be unreimbursed must not exceed \$55,000,000. Money transferred or loaned must be expended only for appropriations from the Bond Fund or the Housing Interim Financing and Buy-Back Revolving Fund, which appropriations are specified to be financed from the sale of general obligation bonds or notes. The fund from which transfers or loans are made must be reimbursed from time to time, in whole or in part, as determined by the Director of Finance, and must be reimbursed from the proceeds of the sale of general obligation bonds, notes, or state loans, when issued. Within 30 days after the date each transfer or loan is made, the

Director of Finance must provide the following information to the County Council:

- (A) the amount of each transfer or loan made to date and the accumulated total;
- (B) the budgetary bonding authorization for each transfer or loan made to date; and
- (C) the time schedule for the sale of proposed general obligation bonds, notes, or state loans proposed for reimbursement or repayment of each transfer or loan made to date.

Proceeds of tax-exempt general obligation bonds, state loans, or notes may be applied to reimburse or repay a transfer or loan that was used to fund public improvement costs paid before the issuance date, if the expenditure was:

- (A) not made prior to 60 days before the County's adoption of a declaration of official intent to finance the public improvement or the approval by ordinance authorizing the projects to be funded with general obligation bonds, notes or state loans,
- (B) not made more than 18 months prior to the issuance date or the date the public improvement funded by the transfer or loan was placed-in-service, whichever is later, and
- (C) not made more than three years prior to the issuance date, unless the cost is attributable to a "preliminary expenditure." For this purpose, preliminary expenditure means architectural, engineering, surveying, soil testing and similar costs incurred prior to the commencement of construction or rehabilitation of the public improvement funded by the transfer or loan, but does not include land acquisition, site preparation and similar costs incident to the commencement of acquisition, construction or rehabilitation of the public improvement funded by the transfer or loan. Preliminary expenditures funded with proceeds of tax-exempt general obligation bonds or notes may not exceed 20 percent of the issue of tax-exempt general obligation bonds or notes.

The Budget Director must consult with the Director of Finance from time to time as to the timing and eligibility of accrued expenditures eligible for reimbursement by tax-exempt general obligation bonds or notes. The Budget Director must annually provide the Director of Finance with a list of capital expenditures to be financed from the proceeds of tax-exempt general obligation bonds, notes, or state loans prior to their final inclusion in the County's annual budget.

Nothing in this ordinance precludes the County from reimbursing temporary transfers or loans from taxable bonds or notes.

At the close of each quarter, the Director of Finance must submit to the County Council a Combined Statement of Cash Receipts and Disbursements showing for each month for each individual fund the cash balance at the start of the accounting period, the cash receipts and disbursements during the period, and the cash balance at the end of the period. Within 45 days after the close of each quarter, the Director of Finance must submit a separate report showing the accumulated balance of any fund or account that exceeds \$100,000, and which would be available for appropriation upon certification by the Mayor.

Within 45 days after the end of each quarter, the Director of Finance must submit to the County Council a report of the Countywide capital improvement projects for which an appropriation has been made, that includes a breakdown of all expenditures made the preceding quarter and a brief description of each expenditure, by CBS number and project title.

Furthermore, the Managing Director must submit to the County Council a report of all capital improvement projects for which an appropriation has been made, that includes a brief description of the status of each project, and the estimated start and completion date of the project.

SECTION 19. **Establishment of accounts.** The Director of Finance is authorized to establish appropriate individual and separate accounts for receipts and expenditures except as otherwise provided in this ordinance. The Director of Finance is authorized to establish accounts for items of receipt and expenditures for the departments, agencies, or divisions as required by law to establish accounting and financial procedures under utility and other enterprise fund accounting.

SECTION 20. **Transfer of appropriations from countywide costs to a department.** The Director of Finance is authorized to transfer appropriations from programs under countywide costs to a department if:

(A) generally accepted accounting principles require the transfer to properly reflect the financial accounting of the department;

(B) the total appropriation transferred must not exceed the appropriation of the respective program in countywide costs; and

(C) the County Council is notified of the transfer with an explanation of the action. Receipt of written notice by the County Clerk constitutes receipt by the

County Council.

SECTION 21. **Penalties.** Whoever intentionally or knowingly violates this ordinance may, upon conviction, be fined not more than \$1,000 or imprisoned

not more than 30 days, or both.

SECTION 22. **Self-insurance coverage adjustment.** If a court of competent jurisdiction holds any appropriation in this ordinance invalid, the appropriation for the County's self-insurance coverage must be adjusted to the

extent necessary to maintain the equality of estimated revenues, proposed expenditures, and total appropriations, as required by Section 9-5 of the

Revised Charter of the County of Maui (1983), as amended.

SECTION 23. **Severability.** If a court of competent jurisdiction holds any appropriation in this ordinance invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or applications of the ordinance that can be given effect without the

invalid provision or application.

SECTION 24. Effective date. This ordinance takes effect on July 1, 2023.

There is a minimum real property tax of \$300 per year except for tracts leased under Section 207 of the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act, those portions of real property designated as kuleana land and granted an exemption pursuant to MCC 3.48.554, MCC 3.48.475, and any parcel used for farming taro where the assessed value times the current Agricultural rate is less than the minimum real property tax. Homes or portions thereof granted an exemption under MCC 3.48.475 are to be levied a real property tax of \$150 per year. 3108 Public Service Company Tax

A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE CAPTIAL PROGRAM FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 2024

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI:

SECTION 1. This ordinance may be referred to as the "Fiscal Year 2024 Capital Program".

SECTION 2. <u>Pending Capital Improvement Projects.</u> The Capital Improvement Projects Report as of March 31, 2023, is set forth in Appendices A-1 and A-2 (attached hereto and made a part hereof).

SECTION 3. <u>Proposed Capital Program for Fiscal Years 2024 through 2029</u>. The proposed Capital Program for Fiscal Years 2024 through 2029 is set forth in Appendix B (attached hereto and made a part hereof).

SECTION 4. If any provision of this ordinance, or the application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held invalid by a count of competent jurisdiction, the invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid provision or applications, and to this end, the provisions of this ordinance are severable.

SECTION 5. This ordinance takes effect on July 1, 2023.

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#### BILL NO. 24, CD1 (2023)

A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF FIFTY-NINE MILLION ONE HUNDRED NINETY-FIVE THOUSAND FORTY-THREE DOLLARS (\$59,195,043) AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING FUNDS TO PAY ALL OR A PART OF THE COST OF APPROPRIATIONS FOR PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS OF AND FOR THE COUNTY OF MAUI; FIXING THE FORM, DENOMINATIONS AND CERTAIN OTHER FEATURES OF SUCH BONDS AND PROVIDING FOR THEIR SALE; AUTHORIZING THE DIRECTOR OF FINANCE TO DETERMINE CERTAIN DETAILS OF THE BONDS; AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF A LIKE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF SUCH BONDS; AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF REFUNDING GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS OF THE COUNTY; AND PROVIDING FOR OTHER ACTIONS RELATED TO THE ISSUANCE, SALE AND DELIVERY OF SAID BONDS

#### BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI:

SECTION 1. <u>Authorization of General Obligation Bonds</u>. Pursuant to Chapter 47, Hawai'i Revised Statutes, as amended, and particularly Part I thereof, there are hereby authorized to be issued and sold from time to time general obligation bonds of the County of Maui, State of Hawai'i (the "County") in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$59,195,043 (the "Bonds"), the proceeds derived from the sale of which shall be used to pay all or part of the cost of appropriations for the public improvements of the County described in Section 2 hereof.

SECTION 2. <u>Disposition of Bond Proceeds</u>. All or any portion of the proceeds derived from the sale of the Bonds or any notes issued in anticipation of the Bonds shall be used to pay all or part of the cost of any of the public improvements listed below in accordance with appropriations contained in the Fiscal Year 2024 Budget, including amendments and supplements thereto, duly approved by the Council of the County (the "Council") for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2024 (the "Fiscal Year 2024 Budget"); provided, however, that pursuant to Section 47-5, Hawai'i Revised Statutes, the part of such proceeds which is in excess of the amounts required for the purposes for which the Bonds are initially issued from time to time, or which may not be applied to such purposes, or which the Council deems should not be applied to such purposes, may be applied to finance such other public improvements of the County as the Council shall, by ordinance approved by an affirmative vote of two-thirds of all of its members, determine; and provided further that the actual use and application of the

proceeds of Bonds issued pursuant to this ordinance shall not in any way affect the validity or legality of such Bonds. No proceeds of the Bonds shall be applied to any public improvement listed in this section unless and until there shall be a valid appropriation of general obligation bond proceeds in effect for such public improvement. The public improvements provided for or to be provided for in the Fiscal Year 2024 Budget, to be financed with proceeds from the sale of the Bonds, are as follows:

The cost of issuance of the Bonds or any series thereof, including without limitation, the initial fee of paying agents and registrars, the fees of financial consultants and bond counsel, the cost of preparation of any Official Statement relating to the Bonds, any notices of sale and forms of bid and the definitive Bonds, and the costs of publication of any notices of sale, may be paid from the proceeds of the Bonds or any series thereof and such costs shall be allocated pro rata to each of the foregoing projects financed from such proceeds.

SECTION 3. Details of Bonds. The Bonds authorized for issuance and sale in Section 1 hereof shall be issued and sold in their entirety at one time, as a separate issue or as part of an issue of general obligation bonds of the County, or from time to time in part in series, as shall be determined by the Director of Finance to be in the best interest of the County; provided, however, nothing herein shall prohibit or be deemed to prohibit the issuance and sale of all or part of the Bonds contemporaneously with the issuance and sale of other authorized general obligation bonds either as part of the same series or as separate series. The Bonds shall be issued in fully registered form without coupons and in the denomination of \$5,000 or any integral multiple thereof. The Bonds of a given series shall be numbered in any manner as the Director of Finance shall The Director of Finance is hereby authorized to determine, in accordance with and subject to the provisions of the Constitution of the State of Hawai'i, Chapter 47, Hawai'i Revised Statutes, as amended or other applicable law and this ordinance, the series designation of the Bonds; the date of the Bonds; the principal and interest payment dates of the Bonds and the record dates of holders of the Bonds entitled to receive such interest payments; the maturity dates of the Bonds; the amount of principal of the Bonds maturing on each maturity date; the place or places at which the Bonds may be paid or registered, which may include the office of the Director of Finance; whether the Bonds shall be in book-entry form; and whether or not the Bonds shall be subject to redemption prior to their stated maturities and, if subject to such prior redemption, the provisions for such prior redemption, the premiums (if any) payable upon such redemption and the respective periods in which such premiums are payable.

SECTION 4. Redemption of Bonds. If any Bond (or portion thereof in installments of \$5,000 or any integral multiple thereof) is to be redeemed, notice of redemption shall be given in such manner as the Director of Finance shall determine. If any Bond shall have been duly called for redemption and notice of such redemption duly given as aforesaid, and if moneys for the payment of such Bond at the then applicable redemption price and the interest accrued on the principal amount thereof to the date of redemption are made or duly provided for by the County, interest on such Bond shall cease to accrue and become payable from and after the date fixed for redemption.

SECTION 5. Registration, Exchange and Transfer of Bonds. At all times during which any Bond of any series remains outstanding and unpaid, the registrar for such series shall keep or cause to be kept at its designated office bond registration books for the registration, exchange and transfer of such series of Bonds. Upon presentation at its designated office for such purpose the registrar, under such reasonable provisions as it may prescribe, shall register, exchange or transfer, or cause to be registered, exchanged or transferred, on the bond registration books the Bonds of such series as hereinbefore set forth. The bond registration books shall at all times be open for inspection by the County or any duly authorized officer thereof.

Any Bond of any series may be exchanged at the designated office of the registrar for such series of Bonds for a like aggregate principal amount of such Bonds in other authorized principal sums of the same series, interest rate and maturity. Any Bond of any series may, in accordance with its terms, be transferred upon the bond registration books by the person in whose name it is registered, in person or by such person's duly authorized agent, upon surrender of such Bond to the registrar for such series for cancellation, accompanied by a written instrument of transfer duly executed by the registered owner in person or by such owner's duly authorized agent, in form satisfactory to the registrar.

All transfers or exchanges pursuant to this Section shall be made without expense to the holder of such Bonds, except as otherwise herein provided, and except that the registrar for such series of Bonds shall require the payment by the holder of the Bond requesting such transfer or exchange of any tax or other governmental charges required to be paid with respect to such transfer or exchange. All Bonds surrendered pursuant to this Section shall be canceled.

No transfer or exchange of Bonds shall be required to be made during the fifteen (15) days next preceding an interest payment date for such series of Bonds, nor during the forty-five (45) days next preceding the date fixed for redemption of such Bonds.

Whenever any Bond of a series shall be surrendered for transfer or exchange, the County shall execute and deliver at the designated office of the registrar for such series, and the registrar shall prepare and authenticate, and send by registered mail to the owner or new owner thereof at such owner's request, risk and expense, a new duly executed Bond or Bonds of the same series, interest rate and maturity and for the like aggregate principal sum registered on the bond registration books in such manner as the owner or transferee, as the case may be, may request.

SECTION 6. Execution and Form of Fully Registered Bonds. The Bonds shall bear the manual or facsimile signatures of the Director of Finance or the Deputy Director of Finance and the Mayor of the County and shall be sealed with the seal or a facsimile seal of the County. The Director of Finance may, at the Director's election, sign or direct the Deputy Director of Finance to sign such number of Bonds of any series as the Director of Finance shall determine and deliver such signed Bonds to the registrar for such series for safekeeping prior to the time such Bonds are actually issued, exchanged or transferred. Unless the Director of Finance is the registrar, the Director of Finance shall direct the

registrar for the Bonds of a given series to authenticate such Bonds and no such Bond shall be valid or obligatory for any purpose unless and until the certificate of authentication endorsed on each Bond shall have been manually executed by any authorized officer of the registrar. It shall not be necessary that any Bonds which are manually signed by the Director of Finance, and for which the Director of Finance is the registrar, bear any such certificate of authentication. Upon the registration of any Bonds the registrar shall insert on such Bonds the date as of which such Bonds are registered.

Bonds may be printed, typewritten or otherwise produced. SECTION 7. Sale of Bonds. Without any further authorization from or action by the Council, but subject to the provisions hereof including in particular those limitations set forth in Section 3 and of applicable law, the Director of Finance is hereby authorized to issue and sell the Bonds at one time or from time to time in series at competitive sale or at negotiated sale in accordance with Section 47-8, Hawai'i Revised Statutes, as amended, in each case at such price or prices and upon such terms and conditions as the Director of Finance shall approve and determine to be in the best interest of the County. The proceeds derived from the sale of any notes issued in anticipation of the Bonds shall be used to pay all or part of the cost of any appropriation for the various public improvements set forth in Section 2.

SECTION 9. Security for the Bonds. The full faith and credit of the County are hereby pledged to the payment of the principal of and interest on the Bonds and the principal and interest payments shall be a first charge on the General Fund of the County. Pursuant to Chapter 47, Hawai'i Revised Statutes, as amended, particularly Part I thereof, the County shall levy ad valorem taxes without limitation as to rate or amount on real property subject to taxation by the County, sufficient to pay principal of and interest on the Bonds as they become due. This ordinance shall constitute an agreement by the County with the holders of the Bonds authorized pursuant to this ordinance; provided that amendments may be made to this ordinance as may be necessary to correct errors, comply with the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, to otherwise

protect the security for the bonds, or such other amendment that does not materially and adversely affect the interests of the holders of the Bonds.

SECTION 10. Tax Covenant and Approval of Issuance of Bonds as Tax-Exempt or Taxable Bonds. The Bonds (and any previously authorized but unissued general obligation bonds) (the "Authorized Bonds") are hereby authorized to be issued, in whole or in part, and in any combination, including one or more separate issues or series, as either tax-exempt bonds ("Tax-Exempt Bonds") or federally taxable bonds ("Taxable Bonds"). The Director of Finance shall determine and elect, based on the best interests of the County, which portions of the Authorized Bonds (including any previously authorized but unissued general obligation bonds) shall be designated and issued as Tax-Exempt Bonds or Taxable Bonds. Previously authorized but unissued general obligation bonds are hereby expressly authorized to be issued as Tax-Exempt Bonds or Taxable Bonds and in this regard any portion of any ordinance or resolution of the County in conflict with this Section is hereby amended.

For Authorized Bonds (including any previously authorized but unissued general obligation bonds) that are designated and issued as Tax-Exempt Bonds, the County hereby covenants and agrees to comply with the provisions of Sections 103 and 141-150 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended ("Code"), and the applicable Treasury Regulations if and to the extent required to maintain the exclusion from gross income of interest on the Tax-Exempt Bonds for federal income tax purposes for so long as any Tax-Exempt Bond shall be outstanding.

For Authorized Bonds (including any previously authorized but unissued general obligation bonds) that are designated and issued as Taxable Bonds, the interest on such Taxable Bonds shall not be excluded from gross income for federal income tax purposes.

SECTION 11. Reimbursement of Expenditures. The County expects that it will pay certain capital expenditures in connection with the public improvements of the County described in Section 2 hereof prior to the issuance of the Bonds, and reasonably expects to reimburse such expenditures from the proceeds of such Bonds. The County hereby declares its official intent to use proceeds of the Bonds to reimburse itself for future expenditures in connection with such public improvements. This ordinance is adopted in part for purposes of establishing compliance with the requirements of Section 1.150-2 of the Treasury Regulations.

This ordinance shall be reasonably available for inspection by the general public during normal business hours at the offices of the County Clerk, located at 200 South High Street, Wailuku, Maui, Hawai'i, commencing within fifteen (15) days after the approval hereof by the Council.

SECTION 12. <u>CUSIP Identification Numbers</u>. The Director of Finance may authorize the printing of CUSIP identification numbers upon the Bonds. Such numbers and the printing thereof shall be subject in all respects to the provisions of Section 47-10, Hawai'i Revised Statutes, as amended.

SECTION 13. Bond Insurance. If the original purchaser of the Bonds, or any portion thereof, shall procure insurance for the payment of the principal of and interest on such Bonds and desires that a statement with respect to such insurance shall be printed upon such Bonds, space shall be provided on the backs of the printed Bonds for the printing of such statement. The cost, if any, of the printing of any such statement upon the Bonds shall be at the expense of such original purchaser, and the County shall not have any liability with respect thereto. Should the procuring of such insurance or the printing of a statement of such insurance upon the back of the Bonds cause a delay either in the printing of the Bonds or in the delivery of and payment therefor, the County, after notifying the original purchaser of the same, shall proceed with the printing of such Bonds without a copy of such statement thereon, or shall proceed with the delivery of such Bonds without such insurance having been obtained, as the case may be, unless an agreement is reached between the County and the original purchaser of such Bonds extending the date of delivery of and payment for such Bonds. Neither the failure by the original purchaser of the Bonds to obtain any such insurance nor the failure to print on any Bonds a copy of a statement of insurance or any error with respect thereto shall constitute cause for failure or refusal by the original purchaser of the bonds to accept delivery of and pay for such Bonds. If any such insurance on the Bonds shall be obtained by the original purchaser of such Bonds, (a) such insurance shall not constitute a part of the contract by and with the County evidenced by a particular Bond or constitute a part of the proceedings providing for the issuance thereof, and (b) no liability or responsibility shall attach to the County or any officer or agent thereof in any way by reason of any such insurance, including, without limiting the foregoing, with respect to the procuring, maintenance, enforcement or collection thereof. Without limiting the effect of the provisions of the preceding sentence, the County shall be under no obligation to take or refrain from taking any action by reason of the existence of such insurance or any of the provisions thereof, even though the taking or refraining from taking of such action may result in or be cause for cancellation or cessation of such insurance.

SECTION 14. Refunding Bonds. Pursuant to Chapter 47, Hawai'i Revised Statutes, as amended, and particularly Section 47-17, there are hereby authorized for issuance and sale at one time or from time to time general obligation refunding bonds of the County (the "Refunding Bonds") in one or more series for the purpose of refunding in advance of their maturity all or part of any outstanding general obligation bonds of the County, loans, notes or other instruments of indebtedness secured by the full faith and credit of the County, as the Director of Finance shall determine to be in the best interest of the County, and to pay all costs incurred in the issuance thereof and the refunding of such outstanding bonds, loans, notes or other instruments of indebtedness, and shall be in any amount necessary for such purposes. The proceeds of the Refunding Bonds of any particular series shall be applied to the payment of the principal of, and redemption premium, if any, and interest on the bonds, loans, notes or other instruments of indebtedness, to be refunded and to the payment of all costs incurred in the issuance of such Refunding Bonds and the interest accrued on the Refunding Bonds to the date of delivery thereof and payment therefor, all as determined by the Director of Finance. Such Refunding Bonds shall be issued as Bonds under this ordinance.

SECTION 15. <u>Effect of Section Headings</u>. The headings or titles of the several Sections hereof shall be solely for convenience of reference and shall not affect the meaning, construction, interpretation or effect of this ordinance.

SECTION 16. Repeal of Inconsistent Ordinance and Resolution. Any ordinance or resolution of the County, or any portion thereof, in conflict or inconsistent with this ordinance is hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict or inconsistency.

#### BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI:

SECTION 1. The Council of the County of Maui hereby finds and determines that: (i) the County of Maui (the "County") has previously issued its general obligation bond (the "Bond") pursuant to Ordinance No. 5203 (the 'Ordinance"); (ii) certain of the purposes for which the Bond was issued as set forth in the Ordinance have been completed or will be completed at a cost that is less than the amount of Bond proceeds appropriated for such purposes, resulting in \$2,349,957 in excess of the amount required for the purposes provided in the Ordinance; (iii) there is a total of \$2,349,957 of the proceeds of the Bond issued pursuant to the Ordinance which are in excess of the amounts required for the purposes provided in the Ordinance or which should not be applied to purposes provided in the Ordinance; (iv) pursuant to Section 47-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS"), and the Ordinance, the amount of the proceeds of the Bond which are in excess of the amounts required for the purposes provided in the Ordinance and the amounts of the proceeds of the Bond which should not be applied for the purposes provided in the Ordinance may be applied to finance such other public improvements of the County as the Council of the County shall, by ordinance approved by an affirmative vote of two-thirds of all of its members, determine; (v) the Fiscal Year 2024 Budget for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2024 (the "Fiscal Year 2024 Budget"), includes appropriations for public improvements to be financed from the proceeds of general obligation bonds; and (vi) it is in the best interests of the County to apply the proceeds of the Bond issued pursuant to the Ordinance which are in excess of, or should not be applied to, purposes provided in the Ordinance to pay the cost of appropriations for the public improvements set forth herein.

SECTION 2. Expansion \$8,500,000

Total \$9,100,000

(collectively, "Projects").

Under the terms and conditions anticipated with regard to each such SRF loan, the County shall repay, over a term of twenty years, the principal amount, which shall not exceed the amount of each such loan stated above, at a fixed rate of interest that shall not exceed the Bond Buyer's 20-year general obligation bond issue.

SECTION 2. Council Authorization. An appropriation for a grant or loan [shall] <u>must</u> not be expended unless a contract is entered into between the County and the recipient. <u>Once the County and the recipient enter into a contract, the County may expend funds for expenses under the contract that pre-date the contract's execution date, if the funds are expended in the same fiscal year that the contract is encumbered."</u>

A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 3.81, MAUI COUNTY CODE, TO ESTABLISH A DEDICATED FUNDING SOURCE FOR THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND CULTURAL PROGRAMS REVOLVING FUND

#### BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI:

SECTION 1. Section 3.81.030, Maui County Code, is amended to read as follows:

- **"3.81.030 Administration.** A. The director of finance [shall] will establish a separate account to record all revenues and expenses as a result of the economic development and cultural programs established in the County.
- B. There [shall] will be deposited into the economic development and cultural revolving fund any council appropriations to the fund and all moneys donated to the County for economic development and cultural programs.
- C. Any proposed appropriation [shall] will be submitted to the council for approval as a budget appropriation in either the annual budget or a proposed amendment to the budget ordinance. In adopting each fiscal year's budget and capital program, the council may make appropriations to the fund, including appropriating a minimum of two percent of the certified real property tax revenues, not to exceed \$10 million in any one fiscal year.
- D. The director of finance with the coordinator for the office of economic development and the department of agriculture may adopt administrative rules necessary to carry out the purpose of this chapter. Prior to the adoption of any administrative rules, [pursuant to] <u>under</u> section 91-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the council [shall] <u>may</u> [have an opportunity for] review [of] the proposed administrative rules.
- E. A request for use of the fund [shall] <u>may</u> be initiated by filing an application with the director of economic development <u>or</u> the director of agriculture, as applicable. Applications may include a non-refundable application processing fee as set forth in the annual budget ordinance. The fees collected [pursuant to] <u>under</u> this section are deemed appropriated upon receipt and are authorized to be expended for processing of the application."

A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 3.34, MAUI COUNTY CODE, TO CREATE AND FUND AN 'OHANA ASSISTANCE PILOT PROGRAM

#### BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI:

SECTION 1. Chapter 3.34, Maui County Code, is amended to read as follows:

### "Chapter 3.34 HOME ACQUISITION, PROVISION, AND OWNERSHIP PROGRAMS REVOLVING FUND

- **3.34.010 Fund establishment.** A fund [shall] will be established and created to be known as the "home acquisition, provision, and ownership programs revolving fund."
- **3.34.020 Purpose.** The home acquisition, provision, and ownership programs revolving fund will enable the department of housing and human concerns to continue to maintain and expand existing programs and create new programs to meet the needs of Maui County residents qualified to participate in the first-time homebuyers down payment assistance program, the individual development account program, the 'ohana assistance pilot program, and similar future programs to be named in this paragraph upon establishment and approval by council.

#### 3.34.030 Administration.

- A. The director of finance [shall] will establish a separate account to record all revenues and expenses as a result of the home acquisition, provision, and ownership programs established in the County.
- B. There [shall] will be deposited into the home [ownership and] acquisition, provision, and ownership programs revolving fund any council appropriations to the first-time homebuyers program or the 'ohana assistance pilot program, all moneys granted or donated to the County in the future for home acquisition, provision, and ownership programs, and all moneys repaid to the County by previous recipients of home acquisition, provision, and ownership

programs. Funds deposited into the home acquisition, provision, and ownership programs revolving fund will not lapse at the end of the fiscal year.

C. Any proposed appropriation from the fund [shall] <u>will</u> be submitted to the council for approval as a budget appropriation in either the annual budget or a proposed amendment to the budget ordinance. In adopting each fiscal year's budget and capital program, the council may make appropriations to the fund.

#### 3.34.040 Use of fund.

- A. Council appropriations from the home acquisition, <u>provision</u>, and ownership programs revolving fund [shall] <u>may</u> be for the public purposes set forth in section 3.34.020.
- B. The department of housing and human concerns, by itself, with, or through a grantee, must create an 'ohana assistance pilot program to offer grants of up to \$50,000 to property owners to build an accessory dwelling or second farm dwelling for permanent long-term occupancy as residential workforce housing units.
- **3.34.050 Term of fund.** The ordinance codified in this chapter [shall] will automatically expire on June 30, 2031, unless reenacted by the council as provided by law."
