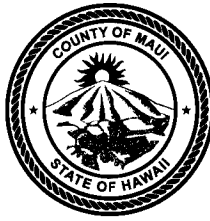

SUBJECT: FISCAL YEAR ("FY") 2017 BUDGET (PR-2) (BF-1)

This is in response to your letter dated March 30, 2016 requesting the Department to provide information relating to the fees, rates, assessments, and taxes for the Department as set forth in Appendix B to the FY 2017 Budget bill.

1. *Page 21. Permits: Aquatic Life Operations. Is there a separate permit fee, apart from the application fee, pursuant to Section 5.26.040(E), Maui County Code? If so, please state the fee in your response.*

Questions pertaining to Permits: Aquatic Life Operations would need to be addressed to the Department of Finance as they are the administering department.

2. *Page 21 – 24. You have assumed the passage of Bill 30 (2016), establishing Code Chapter 13.04A and repealing Chapter 13.04. The Committee will revise Code citations throughout these pages if the bill is enacted. However, the Committee requests clarification on the proposed schedule of fees and deposits in Tables 13.04A.100 and 13.04A.130, as follows:*

- a. *Proposed Code Section 13.04A.090(B) prioritizes permit by type. The list identifies a "department sponsored general use." Should there be a separate permit fee in Table 13.04A.100 for this? If not, which permit fee would apply?*

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Department sponsored general use permits would be for the functions, activities, programs or events organized by senior citizen, adult-supervised youth, or persons with disabilities. These permits are not assessed rental fees or deposits, as indicated in the reference with the asterisk (*).

- b. *Currently, Table 13.04A.100 provides that your Department will charge itself a permit fee for Department sponsored, revenue generating, special events it conducts on its own. The Table also provides for custodial deposits for Department sponsored special events it conducts on its own. Table 13.04A.130 provides for permit fees and custodial deposits for Department sponsored events, which again include events your Department conducts on its own. Are these fees consistent with your intention? Please explain.*

The schedule of fees and deposits for Department sponsored special events that are reflected in Table 13.04A.100 were intended to be the fees and deposits for Department sponsored special events that are organized by another person or organization. It is now evident after reviewing this question, the definition of Department sponsored, and the verbiage on Table 13.04A.100 it would include the Department being assessed these fees. We would request for this clarification to be included on Table 13.04A.100 and Table 13.04A.130 with three asterisks (***) located next to the Department sponsored title portion of the two respective tables with the footnote to read as follows: *** *Any Department sponsored events primarily sponsored by the department shall not be assessed any fees or deposits.* Additionally, it was noticed the definition that is restated under Fee - Use of Park Facilities "Department sponsored" is not a direct reflection of the definition that was approved in the Code Chapter 13.04A and should read as follows: *"Department sponsored" means functions, activities, programs, or events solely sponsored by the department, or together with a person or organization.* These two clarifications have additionally been noted in the attached Schedule of Fees and Deposits.

- c. *Proposed Code Section 13.04A.130 provides that the director may rent large department equipment or small department equipment. The two types of equipment may be rented to the same entities, except that small department equipment may also be rented to "any nonprofit organization which serves the community." Fees and custodial deposits are as set forth in the annual budget ordinance.*

- i. *Please revise Table 13.04A.130 in a manner that separates large department equipment from small department equipment.*

See attached Schedule of Fees and Deposits to reflect the changes as requested.

- ii. *Please indicate in the Table what the applicable charges would be for County co-sponsored functions, activities, program, or events, as authorized by Section 13.04A.130(A).*

County co-sponsored would only impact equipment rental fees for use off of county property. All other events on Parks property would be referenced as Department sponsored.

See attached Schedule of Fees and Deposits to reflect the changes as requested.

- d. *May I confirm that the new fee structure will apply starting July 1, 2016, even if a facility reservation was made prior to the change in your Department's permitting scheme? Bill 30 (2016) does not suggest otherwise. Does your Department plan to inform people holding reservations of increased fees for facilities they have already reserved? Please explain.*

The implementation of the Code Chapter 13.04A and the new schedule of fees and deposits would go into effect July 1, 2016. The schedule of rates and fees does not change or impact the amounts being assessed for the actual fee or deposit being collected for the different permit types. The only exceptions are listed below and these users would be notified upon approval of the FY17 Budget:

- Partnership leagues would not be assessed fees or deposits, only an annual custodial and key deposit of \$500.
- General Use Permits that are issued for permits organized by the senior citizens, adult-supervised youth, or persons with disabilities would not be assessed fees or deposits. We would request to make the change in language to read "fees and deposits" where the word "charge" is used to be consistent with definitions.

3. *Please explain the rationale for deleting the monthly golf rates for students.*

The monthly golf rate for students was deleted based on the input of parents of these students. As listed in the current rates and fees, a student who wants to golf on the weekends and holidays must pay the monthly rate. There is currently no fee schedule for student play on the weekends and holidays. Additionally, the monthly rate is collected regardless of the date of payment.


This sometimes meant that a student would pay the \$20 fee for only half a month's use. If the monthly rate were to remain, the rates and fees should reflect a golf rate for students on the weekends and holidays.

4. *What is the golf card referenced on page 26? Where is the "Lost/Replacement Card Fee" for golf authorized?*

The golf card referenced on page 25 is the Maui County resident card defined in Chapter 10-103-8 of the Rules for the Waiehu Municipal Golf Course. Although there is no specific language for a lost or replacement card fee in these rules, the fee has historically been included in the Golf Fund rates and fees.

“Type II activity” means an activity open to the public and co-sponsored by the County which does not generate revenue by charges or donations for admission to attend the activity or from other revenue-generating sources related to the activity such as registration or participation fees, but excluding revenues generated from temporary refreshment concessions as defined in section 13.04.150(C).

“Type II (CC) (community class) activity” means an activity open to the public, organized and conducted by an instructor approved by the community class program for the County of Maui, Department of Parks and Recreation, which generates revenues by charging for admission to attend the activity.

“Type II (R) activity” means an activity open to the public and co-sponsored by the County of Maui which generates revenues by charges or donations for admission to attend the activity or from other revenue-generating sources related to the activity such as registration or participation fees and concessions.

“Type III activity” means an activity organized and sponsored by a person, registered political candidate, political organization, or nonprofit entity which does not generate revenue by charges or donations for admission to attend the activity such as
