- ► Four grant workshops presented last year
 - ▶ June 19 Molokai 15 attendees

 - ▶ July 2 Maui Arts & Cultural Center 67 attendees
 - ► August 19 Lanai 14 attendees
 - ▶ 121 attendees total

 - ► County worked and continues to work with neighboring counties, the State, and federal officers through the transition process
- Executed contracts for WIOA Dislocated Worker program to provide much needed funding to assist displaced HC&S employees
 - Assisting with the Mayor's Sugar Operators Support Task Force

2nd Annual Made in Maui County Festival

- ► Final Numbers:
 - ▶ 140 participating local vendors
 - ► Over 10,000 attendees (30% visitors)
 - ► More than \$416,000 in total product sales
 - ▶ 1,620 wholesale leads
 - Over 250 new accounts and wholesale orders






