PROVISOS:

Office of the Mayor:

Economic Development Program:

- Grants and disbursements for business development and technology
 - o Maui Economic Development Board

Provided, that \$15,000 shall be for technology programs for Molokai schools

Assist with travel and support for our award winning robotics program. FY16 Council stipulated \$10,000 which has barely covered costs. MEDB is aware of the request to proviso an additional \$5,000. They do not object.

Molokai Economic Development and Cultural Programs

Provided that disbursements shall include, but are not limited to, Molokai Ka Hula Piko, Ka Molokai Makahiki, Kulaia Canoe Festivals, and Molokai 4-H Program.

o Maui Economic Opportunity, Inc., for Microenterprise

Provided, that funds shall be made available to provide a full-time position for a Molokai Loan Fund Manager

Proviso to insure the funding is available for Molokai's full-time position.

o Small Business Promotion

Provided that \$40,000 shall be for a study to determine economic alternatives for Molokai Comprehensive study to identify economic alternatives to assist Molokai with economic development. This assistance has been sorely needed to get us out of the doldrums.

- Grants and disbursements for early childhood
 - o Early Childhood Programs: Homeless & At-Risk Family Education Program \$245,000 With the increasing occurrence of homelessness the children have become the collateral damage through no fault of their own. When you see the homeless encampments and the keiki patiently waiting for the bus at Kanaha, something is sorely wrong if we don't assist them.
