SUBJECT: AMENDMENTS TO THE FISCAL YEAR 2017 BUDGET

On behalf of the Department of Environmental Management, I am transmitting the attached proposed bills to address budgetary insufficiencies within the Environmental Protection and Sustainability (EP&S) Program as a result of cuts to the program's FY 2017 budget.

After reviewing the budget passed by the Council, the department is estimating an operating shortfall of \$644,873 for FY 2017. As described in the attached correspondence dated July 6, 2016, to address the shortfall, the department is proposing to adjust rates and fees as follows:

The department is also requesting a supplemental transfer from the General Fund in the amount of \$400,000 as the Solid Waste Division currently has no carryover savings. Attached is a Certification of Additional Revenues for Fiscal Year 2017 to certify the availability of General Fund Carryover/Savings.

In addition, the department is proposing additional revisions to Appendix B, Rates and Fees as it relates to the Interim Fee Schedule, applicable at county landfills where there are no scales or when scales are inoperable, to coincide with the new scaled tip fee of \$81/per ton for municipal solid waste.

The Department of Environmental Management is requesting that the proposed bills be considered as soon as possible. I respectfully request this matter be referred to the appropriate Council committee for expeditious review, discussion and appropriate action.

SUBJECT: FISCAL YEAR ("FY") 2017 BUDGET

The Department of Environmental Management (Department) appreciates your support in working with the Council to reevaluate the budget for the Environmental Protection and Sustainability (EP&S) Division. The funding will allow the Department to properly address recycling and other landfill diversion programs in Maui County.

The Department would like to propose to the Council how the EP&S Division will work with the Fiscal Year (FY) 2017 budget. Several landfill diversion contracts in the EP&S Division that end in FY 2016 or are not being extended by the contractor for FY 2017, were put out for bid. Based upon the bid unit prices and estimated quantity of material to be diverted, the budget for FY 2017 will be insufficient to continue to fully fund all diversion programs for FY 2017.

The Department has revisited its numbers for FY 2017 and has identified a budget shortfall of \$644,873 for FY 2017 in the EP&S Division. The shortfall is mostly due to an increase in cost of services for FY 2017, namely the composting contract and the used motor oil grant that increased by approximately \$600,000 and \$45,000, respectively. The Department has identified the following approaches to address this budget shortfall for your consideration:

1. Please consider increasing/decreasing the Rates and Fees (R&F) for the following:

2. In addition to #1 above, the Department will make funding available for EP&S's contractual services by discontinuing Household Hazardous Waste Collection Events for FY 2017. This will produce a savings in FY 2017 of \$100,000 in contractual services.

If implemented, the total of these changes for FY 2017 will be \$248,585. This would leave the EP&S budget short by approximately \$400,000. The Department is requesting to cover this shortfall with a supplemental budget request for FY 2017.

We would also like to propose a budget amendment to the FY 2017 budget to update the Rates and Fees for unscaled landfills based on Council's increase of the landfill tipping fee of \$80 per ton to \$81 per ton for scaled landfills. The amendment is to have the rates and fees for the unscaled landfills be comparable to the scaled landfills.

Also, if the proposed changes to the rates and fees for Greenwaste, Biosolids and Fats, Oils and Grease (above) are approved, the unscaled landfill rates for those commodities would need to be updated as well.

Below are the proposed amended Rates and Fees for the unscaled landfills that reflects all of the proposed changes above:

**Category I:** Light trucks or other vehicles with a gross vehicle weight of less than 10,000 pounds: \$69 per truck load; \$32 for uncontaminated green waste

Category II: Medium trucks or other vehicles with a gross vehicle weight from 10,000 to 19,999 pounds: \$137 per truck load; \$53 for uncontaminated green waste

**Category III:** Large trucks or other vehicles with a gross vehicle weight from 20,000 to 25,999 pounds: \$200 per truck load; \$78 for uncontaminated green waste

**Category IV:** Large trucks or other vehicles with a 12 cubic yard capacity: \$222 per truck load; \$86 for uncontaminated green waste

Category V: Large trucks or other vehicles with a 20 cubic yard capacity: \$382 per truck load; \$138 for uncontaminated green waste

Category VI: Commercial refuse hauling trucks:

- 1. Roll off (not compacted): \$546 per truck load; \$203 for uncontaminated green waste
- 2. Roll off (compacted): \$843 per truck load; \$308 for uncontaminated green waste
- 3. 42 cubic yard front end loader: \$965 per truck load; \$351 for uncontaminated green waste
- 4. 20 cubic yard front end loader: \$455 per truck load; \$164 for uncontaminated green waste

Categories I through VI: Half-truck loads shall be charged one-half the appropriate truck load fees
