Thank you for your correspondence of July 13, 2016 regarding the above subject. The questions posed in your letter are listed below in bold and are followed by the Department's responses.

 Page 19 of your presentation lists the membership of the Maui Homeless Alliance. Briefly describe the role or services each member provides the Maui Homeless Alliance or the homeless population generally.

The requested information is attached as Exhibit 1.

2. In addition to the resources noted above, briefly describe other resources available to address the issues our County's homeless individuals face. Please advise whether it would be feasible to produce a homeless resource directory of services, providers, and contact information. The Committee also noted it would be helpful to make sure a directory available online.

The requested information is attached as Exhibit 2 and the Department is in the process of adding the Maui Resource Guide to its County webpage.

Provide cost estimates for each of the considerations to reduce homelessness
provided by Mayor Arakawa in his correspondence dated July 5, 2016. Identify
whether County funding would be the exclusive source and if not, identify other
potential funding sources for each project.

- a. Where new facilities are suggested, advise whether County-owned land has been identified for the project, and if not, provide land costs in your estimate.
- b. The Mayor encourages expeditious review of the proposals and states, "Many of these projects can be done quickly with the Governor's proclamation in place." Identify which of the listed projects can benefit from the Governor's proclamation and in what specific way, and cite specific exemptions and, if available, funding that would be relied upon to achieve quick completion of the project.
- c. As the Committee's consideration progresses, it will be important to know the projected cost of not only facility planning, design, and construction, but also of long-term maintenance and staffing costs. Please be prepared to provide this type of information in the near future.

The Department respectfully requests an extension until Wednesday, August 3, 2016 to provide a response to this question.

4. The Committee noted a recent event on the Big Island called the Convoy of Hope appeared to be a type of event worth exploring. The event offered an array of services, including dental services and groceries, to assist the community. The Committee also discussed a similar event held by the County with support from the military in the past. Please advise whether this type of event is something your Department and the Maui Homeless Alliance are willing to explore.

Veterans' Affairs


