Chair and Members:

Your Policy and Intergovernmental Affairs Committee, having met on July 11, 2016, makes reference to County Communication 16-86, from the Chief of Police, transmitting a proposed resolution entitled "AUTHORIZING ACCEPTANCE OF A DONATION OF THREE MORPHO TRAK LIVESCAN MACHINES FOR THE WAILUKU DISTRICT RECEIVING DESK AND THE LAHAINA DISTRICT PRISONER PROCESSING AREA FROM THE HAWAII CRIMINAL JUSTICE DATA CENTER TO THE COUNTY OF MAUI, DEPARTMENT OF POLICE, PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 3.56, MAUI COUNTY CODE."

The purpose of the proposed resolution is to authorize the acceptance of three MorphoTrack LiveScan digital fingerprinting, photographing, and imaging machines, each valued at \$26,000, and one year of maintenance, valued at \$4,000, from the Hawaii Criminal Justice Data Center to the Department of Police. Two of the machines will be used at the Wailuku Police Station and one at the Lahaina Police Station.

Your Committee notes Section 3.56.030, Maui County Code, requires Council approval by resolution of any gift.

A Police Sergeant said the machines are able to photograph an entire palm. After an image is entered into the State of Hawaii and the Federal Bureau of Investigation databases, an identity can be determined within three seconds.

An Assistant Police Chief said forfeiture funds can be used for future maintenance of the machines. He further explained each machine should have a lifespan of about six years.

WHEREAS, Chapter 3.56, Maui County Code, authorizes the Council to accept gifts and donations on behalf of the County; now, therefore,


BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the County of Maui:

Dear Chief Faaumu:

The Hawaii Criminal Justice Data Center (HCJDC) has been awarded Federal grant funding from the National Criminal History Improvement Program (NCHIP) to purchase two replacement livescans for the Maui Police Department (MPD). With your concurrence, we would like to replace the livescans at the Wailuku and Lahaina Stations. These new livescans will be able to capture the entire palm print image including the upper palm portion which the older livescan is unable to do. Being able to submit the entire palm print image will enable the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) to accept our palm print images and add them to the national database for latent searching.

Once these livescans are purchased, delivered and installed, there will be a one year of warranty on the livescans. Typically after the warranty period, the State vendor, MorphoTrak, will contact MPD to establish the maintenance contract for the newly installed livescans. However, for these livescans, HCJDC will also purchase the first year of maintenance. After the first year of maintenance, MorphoTrak will contact your department to continue the contract. The maintenance cost for these livescans will be approximately \$4,000 each.

The Hawaii Criminal Justice Data Center (HCJDC) has been awarded Federal grant funding from the Adam Walsh Act Implementation Grant Program (AWA) to purchase a replacement livescan for the Maui Police Department (MPD). The AWA grant program is intended to assist states with implementing the requirements of the Sex Offender Registration and Notification Act. With your concurrence, we would like to replace the livescan used for Sex Offender Registration and Firearm Permits purposes. This new livescan will be able to capture the entire palm print image including the upper palm portion of registered sex offenders which the older livescan is unable to do. Being able to submit the entire palm print image will enable the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) to accept our palm print images and add them to the national database for latent searching.

Once this livescan is purchased, delivered and installed, there will be one year of warranty on the livescan. After the warranty period, State vendor, MorphoTrak, will contact MPD to establish the maintenance contract for the newly installed livescan. The maintenance cost for this livescan will be approximately \$4,000 starting one year after the installation date.
