APPROVING FOR INCLUSION IN THE 2017 HAWAII STATE ASSOCIATION OF COUNTIES LEGISLATIVE PACKAGE A STATE BILL TO INCLUDE AUTOMATIC VOTER REGISTRATION FOR APPLICANTS FOR DRIVER'S LICENSES AND STATE IDENTIFICATION CARDS

WHEREAS, voter registration is low in Hawaiii compared to other states; and

WHEREAS, enactment of State legislation to include automatic voter registration for those applying for driver's licenses and State identification cards would promote civic engagement; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the County of Maui:

- 1. That the proposed State bill, attached as Exhibit "A," to include automatic voter registration for applicants for driver's licenses and State identification cards, is approved for inclusion in the 2017 Hawaii State Assocaition of Counties Legislative Package; and
- 2. That a copy of this resolution be transmitted to the Hawaii State Association of Counties Executive Committee.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VOTING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
2	by adding a new section to part II to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"§11-A Automatic voter registration for eligible driver's
5	license or civil identification card applications. (a) An
6	applicant for a driver's license or civil identification card
7	shall be automatically registered to vote, if the applicant is
8	qualified to vote under this chapter and is not already
9	registered to vote.
10	(b) The examiner of drivers in each county shall establish a
11	schedule by which the county clerk shall be provided electronic
12	records containing the legal name, age, residence, and
13	citizenship information for, and the electronic signature of,
14	each person who meets voter requirement qualifications pursuant
15	to section 11-15.

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1	(c) Upon receipt of the electronic information, the county
2	clerk shall treat the information as constituting an application
3	to register to vote under section 11-15.
4	(d) The county clerk shall notify each eligible applicant by
5	postal or electronic mail of the option to decline being
6	registered to vote.
7	(e) A county clerk may not send a ballot to or add to the
/	
8	registered voters list a person who meets eligibility
9	requirements until at least twenty-one calendar days after county
10	clerk provides notification to the applicant.
11	(f) Each county clerk shall adopt rules required to
11	
12	implement this section.
13	SECTION 2. Section 286-109, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
14	amended to read as follows:
1.7	"5286 100 General evenining the ignored of
15	"§286-109 General provision governing the issuance of
16	licenses. (a) Upon payment of the required fee and upon
17	demonstrating the ability to operate a certain category or
18	categories of motor vehicles to the satisfaction of the examiner
19	of drivers, an applicant for a driver's license shall be issued a
20	single license of a design approved by the director of
21	transportation upon which is made a notation of:

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The category or categories of motor vehicles the applicant may operate; Any restrictive provisions to which the license is subject; Veteran status, if desired by the applicant; provided that the notation shall be on the front of the license and shall not include any designation other than the term "veteran"; and When the license is issued to a person under twenty-one

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10 years of age, a statement, in clearly legible print that shall contrast with the other information 11 appearing on the license, which indicates the date on 12 which the person will attain the age of twenty-one 13 14 years. As used in this subsection, "veteran" means any person who served in any of the uniformed services of 15 the United States and was discharged under conditions 16 other than dishonorable. 17

(b) The examiner of drivers shall not issue or renew any
driver's license using the driver's social security number on the
driver's license.

1 (C) Statutes of limitations and other provisions of this chapter notwithstanding, no driver's license or instruction 2 permit shall be issued or renewed under this section, where the 3 4 examiner of drivers is notified by the district judge, traffic violations bureaus of the district courts, or the judge of the 5 circuit court that the applicant has failed to respond to a 6 traffic citation or summons, or failed to appear in court after 7 an arrest for the violation of any traffic laws of a county, this 8 chapter or chapter 286G, 287, 290, 291, or 291C, or of any motor 9 vehicle insurance laws under article 10C of chapter 431, or of 10 11 any motorcycle or motor scooter insurance laws under article 10G of chapter 431, and the same remains delinquent and outstanding, 12 or the applicant, has as of the time of the application, failed 13 to comply in full with all orders of the court; provided that the 14 district court with whose order an applicant has failed to comply 15 in full, may approve the issuance or renewal of a driver's 16 license or instruction permit other than a commercial driver's 17 license upon conditions imposed by the court for the satisfaction 18 of the outstanding court order and any other conditions as may be 19 20 imposed by the court, if one or more of the following conditions 21 are met:

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1	(1) The applicant is gainfully employed in a position that
2	requires driving and will be discharged if the
3	applicant is unable to drive; or
4	(2) The applicant has no access to alternative
5	transportation and therefore must drive to work;
6	provided further that if the applicant has failed to comply in
7	full with orders of the district court of more than one circuit,
8	the applicant shall obtain the approval of the district court of
9	each circuit in which the applicant has an outstanding court
10	order before a driver's license or instruction permit may be
11	issued or renewed under this subsection.
12	A driver's license or instruction permit issued or renewed
13	under this subsection shall be subject to immediate suspension by
14	the court upon the applicant's failure to remain in full
15	compliance with all conditions imposed by the court for the
16	issuance or renewal of the driver's license or instruction
17	permit. The examiner of drivers may place an indication of
18	restriction upon a driver's license or instruction permit issued
19	or renewed under this subsection. Proof of financial

20 responsibility under section 287-20 shall not apply to the

issuance or renewal of driver's licenses or instruction permits
 under this subsection.

3 (d) An application for a driver's license shall include the
4 information required under section 11-A."

5 SECTION 3. Section 286-301, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is6 amended to read as follows:

7 "[[]§286-301[]] Issuance of identification card or
8 temporary card. (a) To obtain an identification card from the
9 examiner of drivers, an individual shall complete an application
10 pursuant to section 286-303.

(b) The examiner of drivers, upon receipt of the application by any individual who is a resident or a temporary resident of this State, shall issue an identification card to that individual upon receipt of any appropriate fee established pursuant to section 286-309.

(c) The identification card shall be similar in size,
shape, and design to a driver's license, but shall not entitle
the individual to whom it is issued to operate a motor vehicle.

(d) The issuance of an identification card pursuant to thissection shall not place upon the State of Hawaii or any agency

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any liability for the misuse or the acceptance of the
 identification card as valid identification, which shall be left
 entirely to the discretion of any individual to whom such card is
 presented.

(e) An application for an identification card from the
examiner of drivers shall include the information required under
section 11-A."

8 SECTION 4. Section 286-311, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
9 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

"(a) [All] Except for purposes of sections 286-109 and 286-10 11 301, information and records acquired by the examiner of drivers under this part shall be confidential. All information and 12 records shall be maintained in an appropriate form and in an 13 appropriate office in the custody and under the control of the 14 examiner. The information shall be available only to authorized 15 16 individuals under such restrictions as the director shall prescribe. The examiner may dispose of any application or 17 identification card, or information or record relating to the 18 application or identification card, which does not include a 19 social security number, without regard to chapter 94, whenever, 20

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in the examiner's discretion, retention of the information or 1 record is no longer required or practicable." 2 SECTION 5. In codifying the new sections added by section 1 3 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute appropriate 4 section numbers for the letters used in designating the new 5 6 sections in this Act. SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 7 and in strikethrough. New statutory material is underscored. 8

9 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2018.
