MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, made this <u>31st</u> day of <u>August</u>, 2015 by and between the State of Hawaii, acting through its Department of Transportation, by its Director of Transportation, hereinafter called "HDOT," and the County of Maui, whose business address is 200 South High Street, Wailuku, Hawaii 96793, who is a Subrecipient as defined in 49 U.S.C. Chapter 53, hereinafter called the "Subrecipient";

WITNESSETH THAT:

WHEREAS, Public Law 109-59, codifies Federal Transit laws under Title 49, Chapter 53, Section 5311, of the United States Code, August 10, 2005, as amended by Public Law 112-141, October 1, 2012, hereinafter referred to as "Section 5311", provides for nonurbanized area formula program grants including: planning, capital, and operating projects to Subrecipients in nonurbanized areas, for the specific purpose of assisting Subrecipients in providing general public transportation services; and

WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of Hawaii, in accordance with the United States Department of Transportation, Federal Transit Administration, hereinafter referred to as "FTA", has designated the HDOT to administer and manage the Section 5311 grant; and evaluate and select projects proposed by the Subrecipients for nonurbanized areas; and WHEREAS, the HDOT and the Subrecipient desire to secure and utilize grant funds to meet the general public transportation needs of the State of Hawaii, in a continuing, cooperative and comprehensive manner;

AGREEMENT:

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants herein set forth, the HDOT and Subrecipient agree as follows:

1.0 <u>Purpose of Agreement</u>. The purpose of this Agreement is to designate the County of Maui as the Subrecipient of Section 5311 funds in order to enable the Subrecipient to provide public transportation services to the general public, as described in the Subrecipient's application filed for the Federal Fiscal Year 2014, hereinafter referred to as the "Project", and to state the terms, conditions and mutual understandings of the parties as to the manner in which the Project will be undertaken and completed.

2.0 <u>Scope of Project</u>. The Subrecipient shall undertake and complete the Project as described in its Application, separately filed with and approved by the HDOT and FTA, and in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement. The Subrecipient further agrees to comply with applicable policies, procedures and provisions of the Federal Transit Administration Master Agreement, dated October 1, 2014 (available at: "http://www.fta.dot.gov/documents/21-Master.pdf"), HDOT State Management Plan, Chapter 53 of Title 49 of the United States Code, and other related Federal transit laws in the United States Code, as may be amended by any applicable rules and regulations, and/or Federal directives issued subsequent to the execution of this Agreement.

3.0 <u>Period of Performance</u>. The period of performance of the Agreement shall be for the period the Section 5311 funds are available to HDOT.

4.0 <u>Cost of Project</u>. The cost of the Project shall be those amounts indicated in the approved Grant Application, and shall be borne in the manner described therein. The Subrecipient agrees that it will cover all costs of any Project remaining after the contribution of Federal Funds, hereafter referred to as the "local share", and shall be covered in cash from sources other than Federal funds or from Federal sources only when appropriate Federal legislation specifically authorizes its use as part of the local share. The Subrecipient shall initiate and complete all actions necessary to enable the Subrecipient to provide or cause to be provided the local share of any Project at or prior to the time that the local share is needed. The Subrecipient further agrees that there shall be no reduction of the local share to be provided by the Subrecipient unless otherwise authorized in writing by the HDOT.

5.0 Operations and Project Administration Projects. FTA funds used for the operating or project administration efforts shall be for as described in the Grant Application. The Subrecipient shall ensure that design and project administration financed by funds through this Agreement are undertaken in accordance with the Agreement. The Subrecipient shall notify the HDOT immediately concerning the funds used for design or project administration that are not consistent with the use described in the Grant Application.

The Subrecipient shall keep or cause to be kept satisfactory records with regard to the use of all design and project administration Projects and shall submit or cause to be submitted to the HDOT upon request such information as the HDOT may require in order to insure compliance with Section 5311 requirements and this Agreement.

6.0 <u>Capital Project Responsibility</u>. The Subrecipient shall ensure that capital Projects financed by funds through this Agreement are undertaken, completed, operated and maintained in accordance to the Agreement in a timely manner.

7.0 <u>Title to Capital Projects</u>. Title to Projects for capital purchases shall be in the name of the Subrecipient.

8.0 <u>Use of Capital Projects</u>. The Subrecipient shall ensure that all Projects for capital purchases are used for the provision of general public transportation services as described in the Applications. If, at any time, any Project is not used in the manner described in the Applications or are withdrawn from transportation service, the Subrecipient shall ensure that the HDOT is immediately notified and reimbursed for FTA's proportionate share of the fair market value of the Project, in accordance with OMB Circular A-102 and FTA requirements.

The Subrecipient shall keep or cause to be kept satisfactory records with regard to the use of all capital Projects and shall submit or cause to be submitted to the HDOT upon request such information as the HDOT may require in order to assure compliance with Section 5311 requirements and this Agreement. The Subrecipient shall provide or cause to be provided, in amount and form satisfactory to HDOT, such insurance or self-insurance as will be adequate to protect the federal interest in the capital Project throughout the period of required use.

The Subrecipient shall also submit or cause to be submitted to the HDOT at the beginning of each calendar year or as otherwise specified by the HDOT, a certification that all capital Projects comply with Section 5311 requirements and the terms of this Agreement.

The Subrecipient shall maintain or cause to be maintained all capital Projects at a high level of operational soundness, safety and cleanliness acceptable to the HDOT. The HDOT and FTA shall have the right to conduct periodic inspections for the purpose of confirming proper Project usage and maintenance pursuant to this Agreement and Section 5311 requirements.

9.0 Agreements and Contracts under this Agreement. Agreements and contracts between the Subrecipients and second tier ultimate Subrecipients are subject to all applicable federal, state, and local requirements/regulations governing the receipt and use of FTA funds. Further, the Subrecipient shall not assign any portion of the work to be performed under this Agreement, or execute any agreement or contract, or obligate itself in any manner to, any third party with respect to the Subrecipient's rights and responsibilities under this Agreement without the prior review and approval of the HDOT.

In the event that the Subrecipient obtains project services from other than itself, then the following requirements a) through g) shall apply, and the Subrecipient must obtain approval from the HDOT prior to the solicitation of project services:

- a) <u>Federal Requirements</u>. Each Subrecipient must include all clauses required by Federal statutes and executive orders and related implementing regulations, and obtain the required Federal certifications.
- b) <u>State Law Compliance</u>. Each Subrecipient shall follow state law and procedures when awarding and administering agreements and contracts.
- c) <u>Contract Period of Performance Limitation</u>. Each Subrecipient shall not enter into any agreement or contract with a period of performance exceeding two (2) years, inclusive of options, without prior written HDOT approval.
- <u>Full and Open Competition</u>. All project services from other than the Subrecipient under this Agreement will be conducted in a manner providing full and open competition. Some of the situations considered to be restrictive of competition include, but are not limited to:
 - Unreasonable requirements placed on firms in order for them to qualify to do business;
 - 2) Unnecessary experience and excessive bonding requirements;
 - Noncompetitive pricing practices between firms or affiliated companies;
 - 4) Noncompetitive awards to any person or firm on retainer contracts;

- 5) Organizational conflicts of interest which means that because of activities, relationships, agreements, or contracts: (a) a Subrecipient is unable, or potentially unable, to render impartial assistance or advice to the prospective assignee or any beneficiary of the services to be provided by the Subrecipient under this Agreement, (b) a Subrecipient's objectivity in performing the contract work is or might be otherwise impaired, or (c) the Subrecipient has an unfair competitive advantage; and
- 6) Any arbitrary action in the procurement process.
- e) Prohibition Against Geographic Preferences. Each Subrecipient shall conduct procurements in a manner that prohibits the use of statutorily or administratively imposed in-State or local geographical preferences in the evaluation of bids or proposals, except in those cases where applicable Federal statutes, rules, orders or requirements expressly mandate or encourage geographic preference. This does not preempt State licensing laws. However, geographic location may be used as a selection criterion in procurements for architectural and engineering services provided that such use leaves an appropriate numbers of qualified firms, given the nature and size of the project, to compete for the contract or agreement.
- f) <u>Procurement By Competitive Bid</u>. If this procurement method is used, the following requirements shall apply:

- Requests for proposals will be publicized. All evaluation factors will be identified along with their relative importance.
- 2) The proposals shall be submitted by sealed bid.
- Awards will be made to the responsible and qualified firm whose proposal is the lowest amount.
- g) <u>Procurement By Request for Proposal (RFP)</u>. If this procurement method is used, the following requirements shall apply:
 - Requests for proposals will be publicized. All evaluation factors will be identified along with their relative importance.
 - Proposals will be solicited from an adequate number of qualified sources.
 - Subrecipients will have a method in place for conducting technical evaluations of the proposals received and for selecting awardees.
 - Awards will be made to the responsible firm whose proposal is most advantageous to the Subrecipient's program with price and other factors considered.

10.0 <u>Records and Reports</u>. The Subrecipient shall advise the HDOT regarding the progress of the Project at such times and in such manner as the HDOT and FTA may deem necessary by, including, but not limited to, the submission of interim, periodic, quarterly and/or annual reports and/or the holding of meetings.

The Subrecipient shall collect and submit or cause to be collected and submitted to the HDOT, at such time as the HDOT may require, such financial statements, data,

records, contracts, agreements and other documents related to each Project as may be deemed necessary by the HDOT and FTA.

11.0 <u>Audit and Inspection</u>. The Subrecipient shall ensure that the HDOT, the Comptroller General of the United States and the Secretary of the United States Department of Transportation, or their authorized representatives, are permitted to inspect all vessels, facilities and equipment purchased and/or operated by the Subrecipient as part of any Project, all transportation services rendered by the Subrecipient by the use of such vessels, facilities and equipment, and all relevant Project records and documents. The Subrecipient shall also ensure that the above named parties are permitted to audit the books, records, and accounts of the Subrecipient pertaining to the Project.

12.0 Termination.

- (a) For Convenience. The HDOT may, with the concurrence of FTA, terminate any Project and cancel this Agreement should HDOT determine, at its sole discretion, that continuation of the Project will not produce sufficient beneficial results to justify the further expenditure of funds.
- (b) For Cause. The HDOT may, by giving a 30-day written notice to the Subrecipient, terminate any Project and cancel this Agreement for any of the following reasons:
 - The Subrecipient fails to provide the required general public transportation services as described in the Applications;
 - (2) The Subrecipient fails to obtain the approval of the HDOT in the manner and at the time required under this Agreement;

- (3) The commencement, prosecution or timely completion of any Project by the Subrecipient is, for any reason, rendered improbable, impossible or illegal; or
- (4) The Subrecipient shall be in default under any provision of this Agreement.
- (c) <u>Action Upon Termination</u>. Upon termination of any Project and cancellation of this Agreement under the provisions of paragraph (a) or (b) of this Section, the Subrecipient agrees to dispose of the Project equipment, vehicles and facilities in accordance with State and FTA procedures.

13.0 <u>Agreement Changes</u>. Any amendments to this Agreement shall be made in writing signed by the HDOT and the Subrecipient.

14.0 Interest of Members of or Delegates to Congress. No member of or delegate to the Congress of the United States shall be admitted to any share or part of this agreement or to any benefit arising there from.

15.0 <u>Prohibited Interest</u>. No member, officer, or employee of the Subrecipient during his/her tenure, and for one year thereafter, shall have any monetary interest, direct or indirect, in this Agreement or the proceeds thereof.

16.0 Equal Employment Opportunity. In connection with the performance of this Agreement, the Subrecipient shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, religion, color, sex, or national origin. Such actions shall include, but not be limited to the following: employment, upgrading, demotion, transfer,

recruitment or advertisement; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship.

17.0 <u>Title VI - Civil Rights Act of 1964</u>. The Subrecipient will comply with all requirements imposed by Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (42 U.S.C. §§ 2000d – 2000d-7), the regulations of the United States Department of Transportation issued thereunder (49 C.F.R. Part 21), and the HDOT Title VI assurance required pursuant to 49 C.F.R. Part 21.7.

18.0 Disadvantaged Business Enterprise. In connection with the performance of this Agreement and for annualized projected expenditures of \$250,000 or more, the Subrecipient will cooperate with the HDOT in meeting the HDOT's commitments and goals with regard to the maximum utilization of disadvantaged business enterprises; and will use its best efforts to ensure that these business enterprises shall have the maximum practicable opportunity to compete for subcontract work under this Agreement.

19.0 <u>Americans With Disabilities Act</u>. In connection with the performance of this Agreement, the Subrecipient must comply with 49 CFR Parts 27, 37, and 38 implementing the Americans With Disabilities Act (ADA) and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, 2 U.S.C. 794, which prohibits discrimination on the basis of handicap.

20.0 <u>Drug and Alcohol Program</u>. The Subrecipient and/or Subrecipient contractors that directly operate the transit operation or component parts of the transit operation that utilize the Project must have a drug and alcohol testing program for safety sensitive employees. The drug and alcohol program is a requirement of the Omnibus Transportation Employee Testing Act of 1991. The Subrecipient shall submit to the HDOT their drug and alcohol program, and their contractor's drug and alcohol program, if applicable.

21.0 <u>Financial Audit Report or Single Audit Report Requirements</u>. In connection with the performance of this Agreement, the Subrecipient shall submit to the HDOT within nine (9) months of the end of the county fiscal year, two (2) copies of its Annual Single Audit Report in accordance with the 2 CFR Part 200 - Uniform Guidance, effective December 26, 2014.

22.0 Conflict. In case of conflict, the stricter requirement shall prevail.

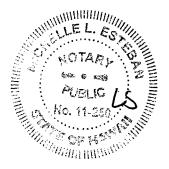

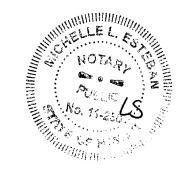
