Chair and Members:

Your Budget and Finance Committee, having met on September 12, 2017, makes reference to County Communication 17-254, from Councilmember Riki Hokama, relating to amendments to Appendix A, Grant Revenue – Schedule of Grants by Departments and Programs for Fiscal Year 2018.

By correspondence dated August 25, 2017, the Budget Director transmitted a proposed bill entitled "A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE FISCAL YEAR 2018 BUDGET FOR THE COUNTY OF MAUI AS IT PERTAINS TO APPENDIX A, PART I, GRANT REVENUE – SCHEDULE OF GRANTS BY DEPARTMENTS AND PROGRAMS, DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND HUMAN CONCERNS (STRATEGIC PREVENTION FRAMEWORK PARTNERSHIPS FOR SUCCESS)."

The purpose of the proposed bill is to amend Appendix A, Part I, Grant Revenue – Schedule of Grants by Departments and Programs of the Fiscal Year 2018 Budget by increasing the grant for the Department of Housing and Human Concerns, Strategic Prevention Framework Partnerships for Success, by \$100,000. The funds will be used for the continued development and coordination of the substance abuse prevention system for the County.

The Deputy Director of Housing and Human Concerns said the funds would be used to implement a countywide comprehensive substance abuse prevention system. The target population is substance abuse providers throughout the County. Alcohol abuse and treatment agencies are documenting information to be shared with the other three counties and state agencies.

She said the State Department of Health, Alcohol and Drug Abuse Division, will use data gathered from the four counties to develop a comprehensive strategic framework for a substance abuse prevention plan. The plan will be implemented statewide.

The Deputy Director said the Department will use grant funds to subcontract with Maui Youth and Family Services to gather information from various service providers such as Aloha House, Coalition for a Drug Free Lanai, and Maui Family Support Services, along with other agencies and the community. The grant period ends September 29, 2018.

She informed your Committee the focus of alcohol and drug abuse has shifted from treatment to prevention.

Your Committee voted 6-0 to recommend passage of the proposed bill on first reading. Committee Chair Hokama, Vice-Chair White, and members Atay, Cochran, Crivello, and Sugimura voted "aye." Committee members Carroll, Guzman, and King were excused.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI:

SECTION 1. Ordinance No. 4456, Bill No. 65 (2017), Draft 1, as amended, "Fiscal Year 2018 Budget", Appendix A, Part I, Grant Revenue - Schedule of Grants by Departments and Programs for Fiscal Year 2018, is hereby amended as it pertains to the Department of Housing and Human Concerns, by increasing the appropriation for Strategic Prevention Framework Partnerships for Success by \$100,000, to read as follows:
