Subject: MORATORIUM ON EXPORTING SAND, THE MAUI ISLAND SAND
RESOURCE QUANTIFICATION STUDY AND SAND MINING REGULATION
(IEM-33)

The Maui Chapter of the Hawaii Society of Professional Engineers is opposed to the sand mining moratorium bill. The moratorium will hinder construction for the following reasons.

1. Export of materials: The majority of construction projects that involve grading or utility installation require materials including dirt and sand to be exported from the project site. Affected projects include development of subdivisions and infrastructure projects including road pavements, sidewalks, bike lanes, bus stops, water lines, sewer lines, drain lines, and underground electrical and communication lines. The moratorium would prohibit these projects from disposing of the excess materials off-site if it includes sand.
2. Ingredient in concrete and grout: Portland Cement Concrete, or concrete, has three main ingredients; water, aggregate, and Portland cement. Aggregate is a mixture of various sizes of rock and sand. Grout is similar to concrete with the exception that the aggregate is strictly sand. Limiting the source of sand, which is a key ingredient in these construction materials, could prohibit many projects from addressing the community's needs.

We are concerned with the negative impacts to Maui's economy and infrastructure that this sand mining moratorium would create. We recommend that the proposed bill not be passed.
