In response to the letter submitted to you on October 24<sup>th</sup>, 2018 from Councilman Riki Hokama, Chair, Budget and Finance Committee regarding the above subject, we would like to offer our explanation and further clarification to the questions he raises in his letter.

- 1. Map of parcels included in the proposed appraisal: see attached document.
- 2. Explanation for why additional lots are being added to the proposed appraisal:
  - A) The original request for eight parcels: TMK (2) 1-4-012-002, 021, 022, 001, (2) 1-4-010-017, 027, 028 & 029 was submitted in April 2018 to meet County Budget deadline and was within a month of a buyer's decision to back out of their purchase deal, leaving the land available for Ke Ao Hali'i (KAH) to begin negations with the seller. At the time their where lengthy email communication between KAH board members and the Mayor's staff regarding broadening the scope of the appraisals and due diligence to cover additional parcels TMK (2) 1-4-010-030, 032, 033, 014 and 034.
  - B) Adding these additional five parcels (1-4-010-030, 032, 033, 014 and 034) shortly after the original submission would give KAH flexibility to choose which lots of the group we could afford to purchase, since all of them were within our goals.
  - C) By late August, we had further negotiated with the seller to include an additional contiguous six parcels designated as "Mokae Lands": TMK (2) 1-4-010:012, 010, 009, 008, 004 & (2)-4-007-001 for appraisals as part of our submission to the State of Hawaii Legacy Land Conservation Program (submitted Sept. 2018).
  - D) All 19 of these parcels are included in KAH's scope of lands to acquire. They are all contiguous and very similar in character, so appraising them all together would be the most economical approach because the Appraiser, having completed one parcel, can apply much of his research and knowledge to appraising all of the other parcels.

- E) The parcel TMK (2) 1-3-07-024 which is not contiguous to the other sites, is no longer included in the scope of work for the appraisal and should be removed.
- 3. A summary of the organization's (KAH) efforts to source other funds to acquire the parcels:
  - A) KAH submitted a grant application to the State of Hawaii Legacy Land Conservation Program in September 2018 for \$3M.
  - B) KAH is working on a fund raising campaign with private donors.
  - C) We are also setting everything in place for on-line donations through our website, Facebook page and gofundme site.
  - D) KAH is also researching other private foundations that support conservation land acquisitions like the Doris Duke Foundation.
  - E) KAH is also working with public organizations like OHA who fund conservation land purchases.
  - F) Contingent on the completion of the sale, the seller has committed to donating the parcels under conservation easement as well as one or two additional parcels, depending on the number of parcels purchased.
