I am writing this to vehemently oppose HHT-43 which is scheduled for public testimony on Monday, November 19, 2018. Frankly I am appalled that attempting to repeal basic animal welfare rights for livestock and common farm animals is even being considered in this day and age.

As the former Director of Animal Control with the Maui Humane Society (1987-2008), I among many others worked tirelessly to create new legislation and improve existing legislation that would provide ALL animals with basic humane protections. What you are attempting to do here is to strip these animal species of the right to basic humane requirements such as adequate food, access to water, shelter and clean confinement areas to name a few. What in the world are you thinking? Does A&B have your ear perhaps? I am well aware from previous meetings with the Maui Cattleman's Association that A&B has expressed concerns with these existing animal welfare laws now that they are leasing old cane lands to ranchers and the like.

Why are you proposing to go backwards with regards to basic humane care? Maui County has progressed so far in the animal welfare arena since by beginning days with the Maui Humane Society and this absurd piece of proposed legislation flies in the face of every person who has given their blood, sweat and tears in making Maui County a more humane place for all living creatures.

Please don't be a sell-out to business interests at the expense of animals that need and deserve basic necessities and legal protections. Please don't make me regret voting for you because right now, I am supremely disappointed and quite frankly disgusted in your decision to introduce this preposterous bill.

If approved, this bill will exempt:

Persons engaged in animal husbandry or the livestock industry with the intention of harvesting livestock for human consumption or other commodities." Of which I am working to become. I consider the raising of livestock an honorable endeavor. My name is David Dorn, I oppose this Bill, and you should too.

A vote to support this Bill is a vote against animals:

Any vote to support this Bill is a vote against animals. It is a vote that undermines the basic protections regarding the humane treatment of livestock animals, and it is a vote to allow senseless suffering.

Basic Protections for livestock that would be exempted in this Bill:

Basic Protections for livestock that would be exempted in this bill include, Access to water, access to shelter, food of sufficient quantity/quality, necessary Veterinary care, adequate space necessary for health, access to shelter, adequate bedding, clean confinement area free from excess waste or contaminants, and more.

Animal Abuse:

Under MCC 6.04 If you treated a dog the way that this Bill is proposing you treat livestock, you would be arrested and jailed. It is not pono for any animals to be treated badly, neglected, and abused. Therefore there is no merit in this bill, and no benefit whatsoever to the wider community.

Betraying community trust and animal trust:

Any politician who supports this cruel bill will be betraying the community and betraying the trust of innocent animals.

The powerful must protect the weak:

The powerful must protect the weak, and you elected politicians have the power and the kuleana to speak up for those who cannot speak for themselves.

Why even propose something so unkind and uncivilized?

It is disgusting to think that elected representatives in a modern society could even consider something so unkind and uncivilized. Our livestock breathe the same air, see the same sky, and feel the same feelings as we do when standing in the rain and the harsh sun. They do feel pain, they do feel fear, and they do remember kindness and cruelty. Livestock can and do suffer physically and mentally just like any other living being. Any company that sells a product that results from intentional cruelty and deprivation of animals, will undoubtedly also suffer economically:

Any company that manufactures or sells a product that results from cruelty and deprivation of animals, will undoubtedly also suffer economically when the poor conditions and abuses of the livestock become known to the wider public. Any Maui producer of livestock/beef that supports this bill will sully their reputation with the public and in particular their end-consumer. Any company that supports this bill or profits by it is not only heartless, but short-sighted. They will be held accountable by the court of public opinion. Premium Grass-fed, and grass-finished Maui Beef will become irrevocably associated with "deprived, neglected, and abused" livestock, and who would want to eat that? Supporting this bill or passing this bill could become economic suicide for the Maui Cattle industry.

Maui Ranchers already have a reputation for cruelty to animals:

A Maui Rancher was convicted of numerous charges of cruelty spanning several years and was ultimately sentenced to jail for cruelty to animals. Horrendous conditions, neglect, lack of adequate water, caused starvation, suffering, and eventually the horrific death of many cows.
