Chair and Members:

Your Budget and Finance Committee, having met on November 13, 2018, makes reference to County Communication 18-247, from Councilmember Riki Hokama, relating to amendments to Appendix A, Grant Revenue – Schedule of Grants and Restricted Use Revenues by Departments and Programs for Fiscal Year 2019.

By correspondence dated November 1, 2018, the Budget Director transmitted a proposed bill entitled "A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE FISCAL YEAR 2019 BUDGET FOR THE COUNTY OF MAUI AS IT PERTAINS TO APPENDIX A, PART I, GRANTS AND RESTRICTED USE REVENUES – SCHEDULE OF GRANTS AND RESTRICTED USE REVENUES BY DEPARTMENTS AND PROGRAMS, OFFICE OF THE MAYOR (HAWAII STATE COMMISSION ON THE STATUS OF WOMEN)."

The purpose of the proposed bill is to amend Appendix A, Part I, Grants and Restricted Use Revenues - Schedule of Grants and Restricted Use Revenues by Departments and Programs, Fiscal Year 2019 Budget, for the Office of the Mayor, by adding a new grant entitled "Hawaii State Commission on the Status of Women" ("State Commission"), in the amount of \$6,000. The funds will support the Maui County Committee on the Status of Women ("County Committee") Domestic Violence Fair and the Committee's advocacy and education efforts.

Your Committee notes the County Committee is a seven-member volunteer group of mayoral appointees that advocates for social justice, educates women on their rights, educates women to vote, engages in political processes, gathers information on women's issues, promotes women's equality, and serves as a resource for women through programming, public education, and citizen participation.

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Your Committee further notes the County Committee develops information as the State Commission requires or as the County Committee deems advisable concerning the status of women within the County.
The Budget Director said the County Committee has received funds from the State Commission in previous years to support their endeavors.
Your Committee voted 7-0 to recommend passage of the proposed bill on first reading. Committee Chair Hokama and members Atay, Carroll, Cochran, Crivello, King, and Sugimura voted "aye." Committee Vice-Chair White and member Guzman were excused.
Your Budget and Finance Committee RECOMMENDS that Bill (2018), attached hereto, entitled "A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE FISCAL YEAR 2019 BUDGET FOR THE COUNTY OF MAUI AS IT PERTAINS TO APPENDIX A, PART I, GRANTS AND RESTRICTED USE REVENUES – SCHEDULE OF GRANTS AND RESTRICTED USE REVENUES BY DEPARTMENTS AND PROGRAMS, OFFICE OF THE MAYOR (HAWAII STATE COMMISSION ON THE STATUS OF WOMEN)," be PASSED ON FIRST READING and be ORDERED TO PRINT.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI:

SECTION 1. Ordinance No. 4861, Bill No. 57 (2018), as amended, "Fiscal Year 2019 Budget", Appendix A, Part I, Grants and Restricted Use Revenues – Schedule of Grants and Restricted Use Revenues by Departments and Programs for Fiscal Year 2019, is hereby amended as it pertains to the Office of the Mayor, by adding an appropriation entitled, "Hawaii State Commission on the Status of Women", in the amount of \$6,000, to read as follows:
