

Department Overview: Increase in Water Services



Cash and Investments as of June 30, 2018: Total Cash \$85.3 million



Long Term Debt at June 30, 2018: \$67.8 million > Bonds Payable of \$22.1 million

SDWLF Notes Payable of \$46.1 million

The Debt service ratio with investment income is 3.1

- Debt service ratio of 1.10 to 1.20 is a minimum threshold for an "A" rated entity
- Moody's median for municipal water utilities is 2.1
