- Addresses litter control issues through interdepartmental partnerships and education
- Through public awareness campaigns, fiscal incentive programs as well as punitive enforcement, and collection-disposal systems, we strive to prevent and mitigate environmental hazards and solid waste pollution

Beyond Landfill Diversion: Zero Waste

What is "Zero Waste?"

Zero Waste is a *pathway* towards significant overall waste reduction, high percentage of landfill diversion, and positive behavioral change.

It's a *framework* of philosophy and practices that succeed through planning, public education and engagement, legislation, and shifts in infrastructure.

Zero Waste is...

"A comprehensive and integrated approach that manages materials throughout their lifecycles and encourages stakeholders to take their share of responsibility, through smartly designed incentives." (dMass)

Focus on:

- Reducing the production of waste;
- Promoting more efficient use of materials;
- Increasing the recycling of materials that have served their useful purpose;
- Reducing the amount of waste requiring disposal;
- Reducing the toxicity of the waste requiring disposal;
- Improving the environmental performance of solid waste management facilities (Massachusetts 2010-2020 Master Waste Plan; Pathway to Zero Waste)

Moving toward Zero Waste

Recycling Section is already moving toward Zero Waste:

- County ISWMP and State mandates leading us in this direction
- Zero Waste Oahu, Zero Waste Hawai`i and Zero Waste Kauai... Maui next?
- Refocusing: Landfill Diversion --> Source Reduction
- 2 FY20 Recycling Grants for Zero Waste education and implementation of Zero Waste events services
- "BYO! Bring Your Own..." Waste Reduction and Reuse Campaign
- Advocating for more comprehensive single-use disposable plastic bans
- 3 Can Plan curbside recycling is ready to be expanded island-wide over 3 years, with appropriate staffing and funding

Budget & Finance

EP&S Fund: Maui County Code 3.55

- Ordinance establishing the EP&S Fund as distinct from the Solid Waste Fund
- New division, new fund
- Recycling and Abandoned Vehicles Revenues
 - \$10 recycling surcharge for each ton of trash from landfill accounts, shared with SWD
 - State Grants for e-waste and non-deposit glass
 - HBF registration fees of \$10 (\$8/2 split with DPW Highways program, plus \$25 fee for disposal of vehicles established in FY2019. (Can be used only for AV's and vehicle disposal)
- EP&S Focus programs possible revenues:
 - General fund to fund programs that will protect the environment for all residents
 - State and Federal Grants
 - Increase property or sales taxes

Budgetary Considerations

- Fixed costs: ~70%
- Discretionary costs: = ~30%
- Unencumbered funds from FY2019
 - 0-2% anticipated
- Vacancies
 - 1 AVM section Program Assistant, developing new DPS classification and redescribing PD,
 then plan to emergency hire
- CIP: N/A
- Cost-saving measures
 - Recover more costs from AV owners through collections systems and punitive measures to compel owners to pay on open accounts
 - Leveraging community resources through grants programs
 - Reducing services to remain within budget

Future Needs

Laying the foundation for the new EP&S division:

- Expand Staffing by 2 crucial positions
 - Office Assistant
 - Environmental Program Specialist new classification
- Expand Office Space to accommodate new staff (One Main Plaza)
- Expand Programming (Green Grants, Website, Community Engagement)
