Testimony for New Road Tax Proposal

My name is Sarah Calasa. I was born and raised on the island of Maui.

For more than 30 years, my family and I have owned and operated a small trucking business on the island of Maui. I have several questions for the Maui County Council is regarding the recently proposed road tax that would require everyone who drives a motor vehicle to pay a per-mile tax to use the roads.

- 1. Is this proposed tax intended for everyone including State, County and City employees?
- 2. Is anyone such as State, County or City employees, exempt from paying this tax?
- 3. If there are people who are exempt, are we the tax payers required to pay their portion of the tax?
- 4. Are the 2,744,994* tourists visiting Maui each year required to pay this tax as well? (*according to the Hawai'i Tourism Authority's 2017 Annual Visitor Research Report)
- 5. When will we have clarification about who will have to pay?

As a lifelong Maui resident and established business owner, I do not understand why the County of Maui would need to enforce such a tax as we already pay a lot of money to register our personal and business vehicles. Each year, it seems that the registration fees increase and sometimes new "fees' are added as well. I was under the impression that the money that is being collected from yearly registrations was being applied to road improvement. As a tax paying resident of Maui County, I want to know where that money is being spent.

My concern is that if this tax passes and we have to pay per mile, it will kill small businesses like us who are just trying to make ends meet. In fact, if this new road tax initiative is passed in the state legislature, not only will I have to pay to drive to work, I also have to pay to work. I will have no choice but to charge my customers a higher rate for their haul to cover the cost of a per-mile tax which will damage our business relationships and put my company at risk for losing customers.

In closing, it seems like we are starting to become more and more like the mainland every day. These tactics are not what Hawaii is about. We, the local people are slowly being pushed out of our own home state because the cost of living is already so high. We are basically working to pay bills with little left over to spend on necessities such as rent/mortgage, food, and gas.

Just my mana'o, this tax is going to put many smaller businesses out of business which is sad and is not the Hawaii I know.
