SUBJECT: FISCAL YEAR ("FY") 2020 BUDGET (PL-4) (EDB-1)

Thank you for your letter dated April 1, 2019 about the Special Management Area Revolving Fund (SMA Fund) as provided by Chapter 3.49, Maui County Code. In response to your questions, please consider the following:

1. Applications for Special Management Area assessments, minor permits, major permits and emergency permits, and for shoreline setback determinations, permits and variances, will be deposited into the SMA Fund. Looking at the average number of applications received over the past four fiscal years, we estimate the permit application fees to total approximately \$165,000 per year under the current fee schedule and the current rules.

Fines collected for SMA and shoreline violations will also be deposited into the SMA Fund. We estimate fines to total approximately \$250,000 annually.

- 2. Our understanding is that any deposits into the SMA Fund would have otherwise been deposited in their entirety into the General Fund. Therefore, any deposits would offset the General Fund's revenues by the same amount.
- 3. At this time, the Planning Department has not requested any funding from the SMA Fund. Should such a request be submitted to the Council in the future, it would have to meet the purposes established, and be an expenditure authorized, by Chapter 3.49.
