#### Chair and Members:

This report recommends passage of a budget that:

- Confirms the worth and dignity of every person in Maui County;
- Reflects decision-making with a balanced approach that gives consideration to as many policy viewpoints as possible;
- Preserves natural resources, the islands' identity, and cultural assets; and
- Expands housing opportunities for residents.

Your Economic Development and Budget Committee, having met on April 1, 2019, April 2, 2019, April 3, 2019, April 4, 2019 (reconvene), April 5, 2019, April 8, 2019, April 9, 2019, April 10, 2019, April 11, 2019, April 12, 2019, April 15, 2019, April 16, 2019, April 17, 2019, April 18, 2019, April 22, 2019, April 23, 2019, April 24, 2019, April 25, 2019, and April 29, 2019 (reconvene), makes reference to the following:

- 1. County Communication 19-61, from Council Chair Kelly T. King, relating to the matter of the proposed budget for Fiscal Year ("FY") 2020.
- 2. County Communication 19-158, from Mayor Michael P. Victorino, relating to the proposed FY 2020 Budget for the County of Maui. Included in the Mayor's transmittal are the following:

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a. A proposed bill entitled "A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE OPERATING BUDGET FOR THE COUNTY OF MAUI FOR THE FISCAL YEAR JULY 1, 2019 TO JUNE 30, 2020" ("Budget bill").

The purpose of the proposed bill is to appropriate estimated revenues for the operating and capital improvement budget. Incorporated within the proposed bill are:

- Appendix A, which lists Grants and Restricted Use Revenues in Part I and Special Purpose Revenues in Part II;
- Appendix B, which is the Schedule of Fees, Rates, Assessments, and Taxes;
- Appendix B-1, which lists the County's concessions, leases, and licenses by department; and
- Appendix C, which provides descriptions of Capital Improvement Projects.
- b. A proposed bill entitled "A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE CAPITAL PROGRAM FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 2020" ("Capital Program bill").

The purpose of the proposed bill is to set forth the Capital Program for FY 2020 through FY 2025. Incorporated within the proposed bill are:

• Appendix A-1, a report entitled "County of Maui Capital Improvement Projects Report (Excluding

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Department of Water Supply) As of 12/31/2018," which lists all pending capital improvement projects and appropriations, except for Water Fund projects, as of December 31, 2018;

- Appendix A-2, a report entitled "County of Maui, Statement of Appropriations and Expenditures, Capital Improvement Program by District, Fiscal Year Ending 6/30/2019 – as of 12/31/2018," which includes pending Water Fund capital improvement projects and appropriations as of December 31, 2018; and
- Appendix B, which is the proposed Capital Program for FY 2020 through FY 2025.
- A proposed bill entitled "A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE c. AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF SIXTY-FOUR SEVEN MILLION, SIX HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$64,607,000) AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING FUNDS TO PAY ALL OR A PART OF THE COST OF APPROPRIATIONS FOR PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS OF AND FOR THE COUNTY OF MAUI; FIXING THE FORM, DENOMINATIONS AND CERTAIN OTHER FEATURES OF SUCH BONDS AND PROVIDING FOR THEIR SALE: AUTHORIZING THE DIRECTOR OF FINANCE TO DETERMINE CERTAIN DETAILS OF THE BONDS; AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF A LIKE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF SUCH BONDS; AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF REFUNDING

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GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS OF THE COUNTY; AND PROVIDING FOR OTHER ACTIONS RELATED TO THE ISSUANCE, SALE AND DELIVERY OF SAID BONDS" ("Bond Authorization bill").

The purpose of the proposed bill is to authorize the issuance of \$64,607,000 in general obligation bonds for various capital improvement projects.

d. A proposed bill entitled "A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE DETERMINING THAT PART OF THE PROCEEDS OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI HERETOFORE ISSUED IS IN EXCESS OF THE AMOUNTS REQUIRED FOR THE PURPOSES FOR WHICH SUCH BONDS WERE INITIALLY ISSUED, OR MAY OR SHOULD NOT BE APPLIED TO THOSE PURPOSES, AND DIRECTING SUCH PROCEEDS TO OTHER PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS OR AUTHORIZED PURPOSES OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI" ("Lapsed Bond bill").

The purpose of the proposed bill is to reauthorize the use of \$382,411 in lapsed bond proceeds for the Department of Management, Wailuku-Kahului Community Plan Area, Government Facilities, New County Service Center project.

e. A proposed bill entitled "A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI TO ENTER INTO AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT FOR A LOAN FROM THE STATE OF HAWAII'S WATER POLLUTION CONTROL REVOLVING FUND FOR THE WEST MAUI RECYCLED WATER SYSTEM EXPANSION, FISCAL YEAR 2020 BUDGET ORDINANCE" ("Water Pollution Control Loan bill").

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The purpose of the proposed bill is to authorize the Mayor to enter into an intergovernmental agreement to finance the West Maui Recycled Water System Expansion project, with funds not to exceed \$9,578,290.

- f. Booklet entitled "Synopsis BUDGET PROPOSAL FY 2020";
- g. Booklet entitled "MAYOR'S BUDGET PROPOSED FY2020," including the Mayor's Budget Message ("Program Budget");
- h. A proposed resolution entitled "ADOPTING THE FUEL TAX RATES FOR THE COUNTY OF MAUI, EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2019."

The purpose of the proposed resolution is to adopt the fuel tax rates for the County of Maui, effective July 1, 2019, pursuant to Section 243-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS"), and Section 3.20.010, Maui County Code ("MCC"), for the following:

- (1) Gasoline & Diesel Oil, \$0.230 per gallon;
- (2) Biodiesel, \$0.120 per gallon;
- (3) Ethanol, \$0.115 per gallon;
- (4) Methanol, \$0.115 per gallon; and
- (5) Liquefied Petroleum Gas, \$0.115 per gallon.

Your Committee is in receipt of the following:

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- 1. Correspondence dated March 5, 2019, from the Department of the Corporation Counsel, transmitting a proposed bill entitled "A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 2.44.015, MAUI COUNTY CODE, RELATING TO SALARIES OF DEPUTIES CORPORATION COUNSEL AND DEPUTIES PROSECUTING ATTORNEY." The purpose of the proposed bill is to amend the salaries of the Deputies Corporation Counsel and Deputies Prosecuting Attorney, effective retroactive to January 1, 2019.
- 2. Correspondence dated April 4, 2019, from Council Chair Kelly T. King, transmitting the following:
  - a. A proposed resolution entitled "APPROVING THE PAY RANGES AND PAY LEVELS FOR OFFICE OF COUNCIL SERVICES STAFF." The purpose of the proposed resolution is to approve the pay ranges and pay levels for Office of Council Services staff.
  - b. A proposed bill entitled "A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO SALARIES OF EMPLOYEES OF THE LEGISLATIVE BRANCH." The purpose of the proposed bill is to amend Section 2.08.060, MCC, to adjust the pay ranges for employees of the Legislative Branch, effective July 1, 2019.

The purpose of the proposed resolution is to urge public-employee unions and public employers throughout the State of Hawai'i to

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- execute collective bargaining agreements that reflect the principle of pay equity.

Correspondence dated April 16, 2019, from the Chair of your Committee, transmitting a proposed resolution entitled "AUTHORIZING THE COUNCIL CHAIR TO CONTRACT FOR A PERFORMANCE AUDIT OF THE COUNTY'S OVERTIME CONTROLS." The purpose of the proposed resolution is to authorize the Council Chair to contract for a performance audit of the County's overtime controls.
- 5. Correspondence dated April 16, 2019, from Councilmember Shane M. Sinenci, transmitting a proposed bill entitled "ESTABLISHING A COST-RECOVERY POLICY FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF PLANNING." The purpose of the proposed bill is to establish a cost-recovery policy for the Department of Planning.
- 6. Correspondence dated April 16, 2019, from Mayor Michael P. Victorino, transmitting a proposed resolution entitled "APPROVING COST ITEMS FOR BARGAINING UNIT 11, INCLUDED EMPLOYEES." The purpose of the proposed resolution is to approve the cost items for Fire Fighters included within Bargaining Unit 11, for FY 2020 and FY 2021.
- 7. Correspondence dated April 16, 2019, from the Chair of your Committee, transmitting a proposed bill entitled "A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH THE EXPERIMENTAL AND DEMONSTRATION HOUSING PROJECTS FUND." The purpose of the proposed bill is to establish a revolving fund to support the development of experimental and demonstration housing projects.
- 8. Correspondence dated April 18, 2019, from the Chair of your Committee, transmitting a proposed resolution entitled

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"AUTHORIZING THE COUNCIL CHAIR TO CONTRACT FOR A FISCAL AND PERFORMANCE AUDIT OF THE MAUI REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY." The purpose of the proposed resolution is to authorize the Council Chair to contract for a fiscal and performance audit of the Maui Redevelopment Agency.

By correspondence dated April 18, 2019, the Department of the Corporation Counsel transmitted a revised proposed bill to establish the Experimental and Demonstration Housing Projects Fund, approved as to form and legality. The revised proposed bill further defines the income requirement for projects and incorporates examples of models of affordability in perpetuity and nonsubstantive revisions.

By correspondence dated April 23, 2019, the Department of the Corporation Counsel transmitted a revised proposed bill, entitled "A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 3, MAUI COUNTY CODE, TO ESTABLISH A COST-RECOVERY POLICY FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF PLANNING," incorporating the appropriate MCC reference in the title of the bill.

Your Committee notes seven public meetings were held throughout the County to receive public testimony on the Mayor's proposed FY 2020 Budget. The public meetings were held as follows:

- (1) April 1, 2019, Lanai;
- (2) April 4, 2019, Upcountry;
- (3) April 5, 2019, East Maui;
- (4) April 9, 2019, South Maui;
- (5) April 10, 2019, West Maui;

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- (6) April 11, 2019, Makawao-Haiku-Paia; and
- (7) April 15, 2019, Molokai.

Your Committee further notes the Council held a public hearing in Wailuku on the Mayor's proposed FY 2020 Budget, pursuant to Section 9-4, Revised Charter of the County of Maui (1983), as amended ("Charter"), on April 17, 2019.

Your Committee further notes the Council held a public hearing on real property tax rates, pursuant to Section 3.48.565, MCC, on April 24, 2019, and reconvened on May 10, 2019, to adopt a resolution fixing the real property tax rates for FY 2020.

Your Committee notes the Council held a public hearing on motor vehicle weight tax rates, pursuant to Section 249-13, HRS, and Section 3.24.030, MCC, on May 10, 2019.

Your Committee further notes the Council held a public hearing on fuel tax rates, pursuant to Section 243-5, HRS, and Section 3.20.010, MCC, on May 10, 2019.

Your Committee extensively reviewed the proposed FY 2020 Budget from April 1, 2019 to April 18, 2019. Decision-making on the proposed FY 2020 Budget began on April 22, 2019, and was completed on April 29, 2019.

### **GENERAL**

Your Committee approached the FY 2020 Budget session with a spirit of collaboration. "Wisdom and balance in decision making" is a core principle of Maui County, as stated in the Countywide Policy Plan. Your Committee strove to reach this ideal by considering the top priorities and

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concerns of your Committee's members while working in good faith to address them in the budget.

Your Committee considered fixed costs proposed by the Mayor for which no objections were voiced as being worthy of inclusion in the FY 2020 Budget. Those fixed costs largely address the County's core services that recur from year to year. Your Committee focused much of its energy on discretionary costs and how best to address pressing community needs by prioritizing appropriations.

The Mayor's proposed budget estimated revenues of \$780,769,839 for FY 2020. Of that amount, \$648,073,663 was appropriated for operations, and \$132,696,176 was appropriated for capital improvement projects.

Your Committee's recommendation for the FY 2020 Budget increased the Mayor's proposed budget by \$42,820,696, or approximately 5.5 percent, to \$823,590,535. Your Committee increased operating appropriations by \$22,677,046, to \$670,750,709, and increased capital improvement project appropriations by \$20,143,650, to \$152,839,826.

Your Committee notes the Countywide Policy Plan, in a policy statement, directs the County to "invest in infrastructure, facilities, and programs that foster economic diversification." In addition, your Committee makes reference to Maui County's vision, as also stated in the Countywide Policy Plan, which includes the following statement:

The needs of each individual, the needs of the whole community, and the needs of our natural and cultural assets will be brought into balance to reflect the high value we place on both our natural environment and our people.

Your Committee notes the General Budget Provisions contained in the Budget bill provide binding policy statements and principles to implement the FY 2020 Budget. The Mayor proposed amendments to

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Section 18 of the General Budget Provisions that, according to the Department of the Corporation Counsel, were recommended by the County's bond counsel for consistency with the County's current practices. The Mayor also proposed removing the requirement of a quarterly report of Countywide capital improvement projects for FY 2020 only, that includes a breakdown of all expenditures made the preceding quarter and a brief description of each expenditure. The Budget Director said the information contained in the quarterly report would be made more meaningful and a status update on projects would be included. Your Committee concurred with the Mayor's revisions to Section 18.

The following is a summary of your Committee's recommendations as they relate to revenues and expenditures.

#### REVENUES

On April 18, 2019, the County Clerk received the certification by the Director of Finance of the net taxable real property within the County of Maui, pursuant to Sections 3.48.135 and 3.48.580, MCC. The certification was distributed to your Committee on April 18, 2019. The Director of Finance certified that for FY 2020, the net taxable real property valuation is \$51,168,455,375, and is expected to generate revenues of \$340,446,483. The certification takes into account the circuit breaker tax credit and the Mayor's proposed minimum tax, and assumes the tax rates proposed by the Mayor are adopted by the Council. The certified net real property tax revenues exceeded the Mayor's proposed FY 2020 Budget estimates by \$3,253,930.

Your Committee notes the Mayor proposed increases to four of the real property tax rates, as follows:

• Commercial, from \$7.25 to \$7.39;

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- Industrial, from \$7.45 to \$7.48;
- Hotel and Resort, from \$9.37 to \$9.60; and
- Short Term Rental, from \$9.28 to \$9.55.

The Mayor also proposed that the Time Share real property tax rate be decreased from \$15.41 to \$13.93, and that rates for the remaining classifications of Residential, Apartment, Agricultural, Conservation, Homeowner, and Commercialized Residential remain the same.

Your Committee recommended the FY 2020 real property tax rates, expressed as rates per \$1,000 of net taxable valuation, be adjusted for all classifications except Apartment, which remained the same, at \$6.31. Your Committee recommended a rate reduction for Agricultural from \$6.00 to \$5.94, and for Time Share from \$15.41 to \$14.40. Your Committee also recommended modest increases in the rates for Residential, Commercial, Industrial, Conservation, Homeowner, and Commercialized Residential. Finally, your Committee recommended the Short Term Rental and the Hotel and Resort classifications be increased to \$10.75 and \$11.00, respectively.

Your Committee considered a proposed bill to increase the real property tax home exemption from \$200,000 to \$400,000. However, your Committee noted that the proposed change to the home exemption could not be implemented effective July 1, 2019, because real property tax bills have already been issued. Your Committee recommended the matter of the home exemption, pursuant to Section 3.48.450, MCC, be referred to the appropriate standing committee.

Your Committee notes the Mayor's proposed budget anticipated receipt of \$23,484,000 in transient accommodations taxes ("TAT"). That amount is equal to 22.8 percent, or Maui County's share, of \$103,000,000

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in TAT allocated to the counties, and is the same amount received in TAT revenues for FY 2019.

Your Committee supported the Mayor's proposed increases to sewer rates to promote the self-sufficiency of the Sewer Fund. Your Committee also agreed with all of the Mayor's proposed rate increases for refuse collection, except the proposed increase from \$3 to \$5 for residential refuse hauling at the Central Maui Landfill. Your Committee struck a compromise in recommending that rate be set at \$4, while noting the reduction would result in a shortfall of \$117,000 in the Solid Waste Fund.

Your Committee recommended the duplicate driver's license fee be increased from \$10 to \$15. Your Committee discussed the additional revenue that would be generated by the fee and its ability to help to offset additional Limited Term Appointment positions requested by the Department of Finance. The Department said it anticipates increased demand in duplicate licenses because of the requirement that, beginning October 1, 2020, the United States Department of Homeland Security will only accept REAL ID-compliant credentials for air travel.

Your Committee noted numerous complaints are received throughout the year from constituents concerned with the condition of County roads. Your Committee discussed the need for additional resources to be devoted to roadway improvements throughout the County and the limitations of Highway Fund revenues. Your Committee recommended the motor vehicle weight tax be increased by two-tenths of a cent per pound for all motor vehicles. Your Committee also recommended penalties for delinquent motor vehicle tax payments be doubled.

Your Committee notes the FY 2020 Budget no longer recognizes a golf course special fund because the fund was repealed by Ordinance 4952 (2018), effective July 1, 2019, with all encumbrances and any remaining balance to be transferred to the General Fund. Your Committee also notes the Council and the Department of Parks and Recreation have worked

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collaboratively on mechanisms to improve the quality and operations of Waiehu Municipal Golf Course, Maui County's only public course.

Your Committee supported increases to playing fees for non-Maui County residents to assist with the cost of continued improvements to and maintenance of the course. Your Committee recommended playing fees for non-Maui County Hawaii residents be increased from \$23 to \$35 for weekdays, and from \$28 to \$40 for weekends and holidays. For non-residents, your Committee recommended playing fees be increased from \$58 to \$63 for weekdays, and from \$63 to \$75 for weekends and holidays. Your Committee declined to increase playing fees for Maui County residents.

Your Committee supported a 25-percent increase to Department of Planning fees. Upon receipt of responses from the Department, which referenced a 2009 Fee Study and Cost Recovery Plan prepared by Matrix Consulting Group, your Committee reasoned the resource cost of various application reviews and processing far exceeds the current charges imposed. According to the Department, the 2009 Study determined 19 percent of the cost to process permits was recovered by fees. The Department further stated that, since then, processing costs have increased, and the percentage recovery has decreased. Your Committee recommended the increase in fees as a step toward recovering a larger portion of the Department's costs. Your Committee also supported the revised proposed bill to establish a cost-recovery policy for the Department, with the goal of avoiding overreliance on General Fund revenue for Department operations.

Your Committee notes the Mayor proposed a biodiesel tax of 12 cents per gallon, where currently there is none, to offset the increasing costs of road maintenance and improvements. Your Committee debated whether to impose a tax on biodiesel. Your Committee emphasized the need to continue its support of renewable energy, and reasoned that such support should be paramount to a desire to have all drivers share the cost of road use. By way of compromise, your Committee recommended

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biodiesel (B100) remain untaxed, while blended biodiesel (other than B100) be taxed at the same rate as ethanol, methanol, and liquefied petroleum gas, at 11.5 cents per gallon. No other changes to fuel taxes were proposed.

Your Committee deferred a recommendation on the proposed fuel tax resolution, pending the public hearing scheduled for May 10, 2019.

Your Committee also discussed the highway improvement fees previously authorized for electric vehicles and hybrid vehicles, and whether the fees are counter to the policy of supporting renewable energy. Your Committee recommended the matter be referred to the appropriate standing committee for consideration.

Your Committee agreed with the Mayor's proposed establishment of a \$1 one-way fare for all fixed routes for passengers who are at least 55 years old, passengers with disabilities, or passengers who are Medicare cardholders. Currently, the lowest Maui Bus fare is \$2.

Your Committee also supported increasing the fee for advertising inside County transit buses from \$25 to \$50 per card per month and recommended the matter be referred to the appropriate standing committee for consideration.

The Mayor proposed modest increases to all water rates and water meter service charges for general water consumers and agricultural consumers, except for the agricultural rates for usage exceeding 15,000 gallons per month. Your Committee concurred.

Your Committee also recommended the penalty for violations of water use restrictions during periods of water shortage be increased from \$500 to \$750 per violation.

The Mayor's proposed budget anticipated receiving \$68,728,319 in grant revenue from Federal, State, and private sources.

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Your Committee supported the revised proposed bill to establish a new revolving fund for the development of experimental and demonstration housing projects. The fund will be used for the provision, protection, and expansion of experimental and demonstration housing projects, including the rehabilitation of existing structures, land purchase, or other acquisition of land or property entitlements, planning, design, and construction. According to the revised proposed bill, the projects must provide housing for households with a gross family income of 80 percent or less of the area median income. Your Committee further revised the proposed bill to remove the appropriation of a minimum of one-half of 1 percent of certified real property tax revenues to the fund for FY 2020 Your Committee recommended \$1,000,000 be through FY 2025. appropriated to the fund for FY 2020, and incorporated the fund into Appendix A, Part II. Your Committee also referred the matter to the appropriate standing committee for further discussion.

Your Committee notes two special funds previously established by the Council, the County Parks Special Revolving Fund and the Special Management Area Revolving Fund, were not reflected in the Mayor's proposed budget.

By Ordinance 4437 (2017), the Council established a County Parks Special Revolving Fund. The Budget Director said the balance of the fund is zero to date, with no revenues anticipated for FY 2020. She said the Department of Parks and Recreation is drafting administrative rules relating to concessions, sponsorships, and donations, and once rules are adopted, a request for proposals for revenue-generating opportunities will be issued. Your Committee incorporated the fund into Appendix A, Part II, with a zero balance.

In addition, your Committee added the Special Management Area Revolving Fund set forth in Chapter 3.49, MCC, to Appendix A, Part II. The Planning Director estimated approximately \$165,000 per year in fees

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and \$250,000 in fines, for a total of \$415,000 for FY 2020. The anticipated FY 2020 revenue and total balances are reflected in the appendix.

Your Committee recommended that Appendix A, Part II, the Schedule of Revolving and Special Funds for FY 2020, and Appendix B, the Schedule of Revenues - Fees, Rates, Assessments, and Taxes, be revised to incorporate your Committee's suggested changes.

### **EXPENDITURES**

Over the course of its meetings, your Committee heard testimony from hundreds of Lanai, Maui, and Molokai residents providing well-informed and passionate suggestions on priorities for spending taxpayer dollars.

As a basis for the formation of local government, your Committee recognizes the need to "confirm the equal worth and dignity of every individual" of Maui County, as stated in Charter Section 1-1.

Your Committee further recognizes a core theme of the Countywide Policy Plan is to "Expand Housing Opportunities for Residents."

In accordance with public testimony, the County Charter, and the Countywide Policy Plan, your Committee prioritized the reduction of homelessness and the expansion of housing opportunities for residents.

The Charter mandates a minimum of 2 percent of real property tax revenues be appropriated to the Affordable Housing Fund. Your Committee doubled the appropriation to 4 percent, for a total of \$14,321,450 for FY 2020. Your Committee supported a \$2,000,000 appropriation to the First-Time Homebuyers Program, and noted it would be more appropriate for the funding to be moved from the Affordable Housing Fund to the Department of Housing and Human Concerns'

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Housing Program. As noted previously, your Committee also established and appropriated \$1,000,000 for an Experimental and Demonstration Housing Projects Fund.

Your Committee recommended appropriating \$2,184,417 for programs serving residents of Maui County who are homeless, including specific appropriations for the following:

- \$250,000 for homeless programs that collaborate with the community;
- \$200,000 for acquisition of a mobile hygiene unit for Central Maui; and
- \$50,000 for homeless programs on Molokai.

Your Committee also recommended appropriating:

- \$1,400,000 for affordable rental housing programs;
- \$450,000 for professional services for a parcel study to identify potential affordable housing sites; and
- \$150,000 to Hale Mahaolu for a homeowners and housing counseling program.

Your Committee supported new appropriations from the Affordable Housing Fund as follows:

- \$850,000 for Hale Mahaolu Ewalu Phase II for the construction of 22 rental units to be rented at 60 percent or below the area median income;
- \$442,040 for Ka Hale A Ke Ola Westside staircase project;

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- \$199,213 for Ka Hale A Ke Ola Renewal Project Phase III to rehabilitate a building at its facility to support residents at 50 percent or below the area median income; and
- \$250,000 for pre-construction costs, including planning and design, for the County-owned lots at the Fairways at Maui Lani to serve as affordable housing.

Your Committee declined to support the Mayor's proposed Kai Mauka Ike Nui Apartments project in West Maui for acquisition and pre-development site costs to produce 84 total rental units. Your Committee expressed a desire to more fully vet the project and recommended the matter be referred to the appropriate standing committee.

Your Committee also referred several matters for consideration to your Affordable Housing Committee, including the possible creation of a housing authority, affordable housing-related ordinance reviews, and the establishment of an Individual Development Account program to promote housing opportunities and homeownership throughout the County.

Maui County continues to lead other Hawaii counties in funding for social services programs, and for FY 2020 your Committee recommended the following:

- \$1,739,993 to the Boys & Girls Clubs of Maui, which includes \$500,000 for the Paukukalo Clubhouse;
- \$959,711 for food, shelter, and safety grants;
- \$1,475,126 for substance abuse prevention and treatment programs;

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- \$861,739 for services to the frail and elderly;
- \$400,000 to Maui Food Bank;
- \$358,440 to Maui Adult Day Care;
- \$192,337 to Mental Health Kokua;
- \$300,000 to Hale Makua, which includes \$200,000 for master planning of the Kahului facility and surrounding area; and
- \$103,000 to Hale Mahaolu for personal care grants.

Your Committee provided \$8,767,655 in funding for cultural and economic development programs, including:

- \$100,000 for Festivals of Aloha;
- \$250,000 for technology in business promotion to develop additional economic drivers in the County;
- \$1,342,360 to Maui Arts and Cultural Center to promote culture and arts programs in the community and schools, and continue its capital improvement program;
- \$3,000,000 to the Maui County Visitors Association, doing business as Maui Visitors and Convention Bureau, which includes promoting visitor management and education;
- \$1,170,000 to Maui Economic Development Board; and
- \$1,260,000 for the promotion of culture and economic development across the County.

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Your Committee increased funding for agricultural promotion from \$840,000 in the FY 2019 Budget to \$1,205,000 in the FY 2020 Budget, noting the importance of preserving agriculture as a lead industry in the County. This funding includes:

- \$270,000 for all four Maui County chapters of Hawaii Farmers Union United's Farm Apprentice Mentoring program;
- \$100,000 for University of Hawaii College of Tropical Agriculture and Human Resources; and
- \$350,000 for Maui County Farm Bureau.

Your Committee supported environmental protection through:

- \$2,550,000 in appropriations for coqui frog eradication;
- \$2,400,000 for watershed protection and management;
- \$660,000 for miconia and other invasive plants containment; and
- \$1,663,000 for other environmental protection grants.

Your Committee also appropriated \$600,000 for visitor-related costs, to include educating visitors on the impacts of illegal transient vacation rentals, Hana Highway safety, and coral reef protection.

Your Committee again confirmed the worth and dignity of every person by applying that value to County employees. Noting the Council had adopted Resolution 14-36 over five years ago, which recognized April 8, 2014 as Equal Pay Day in Maui County, your Committee supported the adoption of a proposed resolution encouraging public-employee unions and public employers throughout the State to implement pay equity principles.

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Your Committee weighed concerns with increasing costs associated with the County workforce against demands for fairness and service improvements.

Your Committee recommended 32 positions be added to and 3 positions be defunded from the Mayor's proposed budget. Your Committee received testimony stating the last time Ocean Safety Officer expansion positions were added at Hookipa Beach Park was over 15 years ago. Your Committee added the equivalent of 11 Ocean Safety Officer positions to expand coverage at beach parks and coastal areas, thereby investing in resident and visitor safety.

Your Committee also added five positions in the Department of Public Works, Highway Fund, to enhance pavement preservation work by providing for dedicated crews. Your Committee added eight Limited Term Appointment positions at the Division of Motor Vehicles and Licensing to address the anticipated increase in demands for government-issued identification cards, enhance service times, and decrease overtime costs. Your Committee added a position and funding for a new County archaeologist in the Department of Management to address perceived deficiencies in archaeological reviews and recommendations throughout the County.

Your Committee added three positions in the Department of Environmental Management, Solid Waste Division, for trash pickup and green waste services on Molokai that are currently being handled by the Department of Public Works and a private contractor, respectively. Your Committee also added a Limited Term Appointment position for the Wastewater Division at the wastewater reclamation facility on Molokai to allow for training opportunities in anticipation of a staff retirement. Your Committee noted succession planning is particularly vital in smaller rural communities. Finally, your Committee defunded three Liquor Control Officer positions based on audit recommendations for the Department.

### ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND BUDGET COMMITTEE

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Your Committee notes the Mayor transmitted a proposed resolution to approve cost items for Bargaining Unit 11 Included Employees for FY 2020 and FY 2021. By the arbitration decision, cost items for Firefighters covered by the Bargaining Unit for FY 2020 total \$1,491,030. Your Committee discussed the proposed cost items and incorporated them into the FY 2020 Budget bill. During its deliberations, your Committee was also informed of cost items totaling \$230,000 for Bargaining Unit 1 for FY 2020, and incorporated those costs into the proposed Budget bill.

Your Committee expressed concern that the rising cost of overtime compensation, also known as premium pay, appears to be exceeding the overall budget's growth. Your Committee recommended the adoption of a proposed resolution to contract for a performance audit of the County's overtime controls, and recommended the matter relating to overtime controls for premium pay be referred to the appropriate standing committee.

In considering capital improvement appropriations, your Committee concurred with the Mayor's proposed projects to be funded by State Revolving Loan funds and Lapsed Bond proceeds. Your Committee recommended passage of the proposed Water Pollution Control Loan bill to authorize \$9,578,290 in State Revolving Loan funds for the West Maui Recycled Water System Expansion project (CBS-1124) and the proposed Lapsed Bond bill for \$382,411 for the New County Service Center (CBS-2324).

Your Committee agreed addressing issues of shoreline retreat and sea level rise have become more critical with each passing year. Your Committee supported a proposed \$700,000 study under the Department of Public Works, in conjunction with the University of Hawaii, for an assessment of County of Maui coastal roads for effects of climate change, sea level rise, and shoreline erosion. Your Committee also included a \$500,000 appropriation in the Office of Council Services budget for Phase I of a Countywide Master Plan for Shoreline Retreat, starting with Molokai.

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Your Committee further acknowledged a continuing need to explore alternative sites for the Kahului Wastewater Reclamation Facility, which is vulnerable because of its coastal location in the tsunami inundation zone and anticipated sea level rise. Your Committee appropriated \$400,000 for a Wailuku/Kahului Wastewater Reclamation Facility Expansion Plan Study and \$200,000 for a Central Maui Regional Wastewater Reclamation Facility Study.

With a further nod to climate change, your Committee recommended a \$9,500,000 appropriation for the Acquisition of Real Property from Wailuku Water Company, LLC, but withheld the bond authorization for the project. Your Committee supported protecting the watershed and significant cultural and historical lands.

The anticipated FY 2020 balance in the Open Space, Natural Resources, Cultural Resources, and Scenic Views Preservation Fund is \$8,853,809. In addition to appropriations previously authorized, your Committee supported appropriations for land acquisition, planning, and stewardship projects throughout the County, consistent with the purposes set forth in Charter Section 9-19, as follows:

- \$750,000 for a grant to Ke Ao Hali`i for land and acquisition costs at Mokae, Maui, identified for real property tax purposes as tax map key (2) 1-4-010:004;
- \$1,500,000 for land and acquisition costs at Makaalae, Maui, identified for real property tax purposes as tax map keys (2) 1-4-012:002, and (2) 1-4-010:030, 032, 034, and 014;
- \$50,000 for land appraisal and related costs for the Kulanihakoi Greenway Park at Kenolio Road, Kihei, identified as tax map keys (2) 3-9-001:162, (2) 3-9-001:164, and (2) 3-9-062:019 (por.);

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- \$50,000 for a 50-acre park site in the West Maui Community Plan Area;
- \$140,000 for a Hamakualoa coastal open space preserve master plan study; and
- \$150,000 for pre-acquisition costs of a portion of Maliko Gulch near the shoreline.

Your Committee recommended \$1,882,411 be appropriated for the New County Service Center project (CBS-2324) to prepare for occupancy in Summer 2020. This appropriation includes funding for utility connections and fees, equipment and installation costs, and office space buildout costs. Your Committee discussed identifying an appropriate tenant mix and utilizing the 1¾ acres of County-owned available land at the site for further development. The potential opportunities identified by your Committee included:

- a 21st Century emergency operations center;
- the Department of Water Supply, to be closer to its baseyard;
- community meeting space;
- Federal service and grant programs, such as the Community Development Block Grant program, and Housing Choice Voucher Section 8 Program; and
- sod farming (where the County is required to do ground stabilization), to provide sod for the County's athletic fields and parks.

Your Committee discussed delays in performance of the contract entered into with Anaergia Services LLC's subsidiary, Maui Resource

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Recovery Facility, LLC. Your Committee debated the extent to which those delays may be contributing to the need for the County to bear the cost of expanding the Central Maui Landfill ("CML") at this time. Your Committee expressed a desire to explore those possible impacts prior to authorizing bond funding totaling \$13,850,000 for four CML capital improvement projects proposed by the Mayor. Your Committee did, however, recommend the appropriations remain in the FY 2020 budget, while lowering from \$1,000,000 to \$200,000 the appropriation for the CML Land Purchase project (CBS-3567). Your Committee recommended the project be referred to the appropriate standing committee for consideration to allow further discussion on the proposed land purchase to continue.

Your Committee appropriated \$5,405,000 for countywide equipment, which includes:

- \$1,850,000 to the Department of Environmental Management for dozers and trucks;
- \$2,005,000 to the Department of Fire and Public Safety for pumper trucks and wildland fire apparatus; and
- \$1,550,000 to the Department of Public Works for a dozer and pavement preservation equipment.

Your Committee prioritized infrastructure improvements to address pedestrian safety and Americans with Disabilities Act ("ADA") compliance issues. To promote pedestrian safety, your Committee supported:

- \$420,000 for a Countywide Traffic Calming Program;
- \$1,135,000 for Countywide Safety Improvements; and

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• \$2,500,000 for sidewalk improvements along South Kihei Road and Ohukai Road, and \$745,000 for Countywide Sidewalk Improvements.

To support ADA compliance, your Committee recommended appropriations of:

- \$500,000 for Countywide Parks Improvements; and
- \$50,000 for ADA access to Hana Ball Park.

Your Committee supported the following major capital improvement projects:

- \$3,500,000 for the Lanai Youth Center and Skate Park;
- \$1,820,000 for a new Molokai Police Station to be located outside the flood and tsunami evacuation zone (bond authorization withheld);
- \$455,000 for the Pukoo Fire Station Relocation (bond authorization withheld);
- \$2,500,000 for the Lower Main Street sewer upgrade in Wailuku;
- \$500,000 for the Kahului Fire Station Apparatus Shelter (bond authorization withheld);
- \$1,000,000 for Upcountry sewer system upgrades (bond authorization withheld);
- \$13,500,000 for the West Maui Recycled Water System Expansion project;

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- \$5,650,000 for the West Maui Reliable Capacity project;
- \$7,500,000 for the Kihei-Makena Sewer Expansion project (bond authorization withheld);
- \$1,000,000 for the North South Collector Road;
- \$7,781,000 for Kaupakalua Road pavement reconstruction;
- \$4,050,000 for bridge replacements in East Maui; and
- \$1,770,000 for Hana parks projects.

Your Committee saw a need for reinvesting in County infrastructure to promote economic development throughout the County. Your Committee focused on fiscal responsibility by withholding the bond authorization for certain capital improvement projects to allow the various departments to further develop their project plans before being funded.

Your Committee recommended referral of various matters to your standing committees as noted in this report's recommendations paragraph, without objection.

Your Committee voted 9-0 to recommend passage on first reading of the revised proposed bill to establish the Experimental and Demonstration Housing Projects Fund, the proposed bill relating to salaries of Deputies Corporation Counsel and Deputies Prosecuting Attorney, and the revised proposed bill establishing a cost-recovery policy for the Department of Planning. Your Committee also voted 9-0 to recommend adoption of the proposed resolution urging public-employee unions and public employers throughout the State to implement the principle of pay equity, and the proposed resolution relating to a performance audit of the County's overtime controls. Committee Chair Rawlins-Fernandez, Vice-Chair King,

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and members Hokama, Kama, Lee, Molina, Paltin, Sinenci, and Sugimura voted "aye."

Your Committee voted 8-1 to recommend passage on first reading of the proposed bill relating to salaries of employees of the Legislative Branch, and adoption of the proposed resolution approving the pay ranges and pay levels for Office of Council Services staff. Committee Chair Rawlins-Fernandez, Vice-Chair King, and members Kama, Lee, Molina, Paltin, Sinenci, and Sugimura voted "aye." Committee member Hokama voted "no."

Your Committee voted 7-1 to recommend passage on first reading of the proposed Water Pollution Control Loan bill, the revised proposed Bond Authorization bill, the proposed Lapsed Bond bill, the revised proposed Capital Program bill, and the revised proposed Budget bill; and filing of County Communications 19-61 and 19-158. Committee Chair Rawlins-Fernandez, Vice-Chair King, and members Kama, Lee, Molina, Paltin, and Sugimura voted "aye." Committee member Hokama voted "no." Committee member Sinenci was excused.

Your Committee is in receipt of a revised proposed Budget bill, a revised proposed Capital Program bill, and a revised proposed Bond Authorization bill, approved as to form and legality by the Department of the Corporation Counsel, incorporating your Committee's recommended revisions as well as nonsubstantive revisions.

Your Committee notes that, pursuant to Section 47-5, HRS, an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the Council's membership is required to approve the alternate uses of the lapsed bond proceeds set forth in the Lapsed Bond bill.

# A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH THE EXPERIMENTAL AND DEMONSTRATION HOUSING PROJECTS FUND

#### BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI:

SECTION 1. The purpose of this ordinance is to establish a revolving fund to support the development of experimental and demonstration housing projects.

SECTION 2. Chapter 16.28, Maui County Code, is amended by adding new sections to be appropriately designated and to read as follows:

"16.28.050 Fund established. There is established and created a fund to be known as the experimental and demonstration housing projects fund.

- **16.28.060 Fund deposits.** A. The following may be deposited into the fund:
  - 1. All revenue received by the County from any application fee for the submission and processing of plans and specifications under this chapter.
    - 2. Any council appropriations to the fund.
  - 3. All cash donations to the County for experimental and demonstration housing projects.
  - 4. All proceeds from the sale of County-owned experimental and demonstration housing projects.
  - 5. All proceeds from the repayment of loans, including both principal and interest payments, made under this chapter.
- B. Any balance remaining in the experimental and demonstration housing projects fund at the end of the fiscal year will not lapse, but will remain in the fund accumulating from year to year.

- 16.28.070 Fund uses. A. The revenues unencumbered balance in the experimental and demonstration housing projects fund will be used for the provision, protection, and expansion of experimental and demonstration housing projects, including the rehabilitation of existing structures, land purchase or other acquisition of land or property entitlements, planning, design, and construction. The projects must provide housing for households with a gross annual family income of 80 percent or less of the area median income as established by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development, or as adjusted by the department, for Hana, Lanai, and Molokai. The projects must directly advance the objective of providing affordable housing in perpetuity, under the director's supervision. Models of affordability in perpetuity include, but are not limited to: managed appreciation formulas that insulate the housing from market rate appreciation; shared equity formulas; and projects that are owned by a community land trust.
- B. The revenues and unencumbered balance in the experimental and demonstration housing projects fund may not be used for any purpose except those defined in this chapter.
- C. On an annual basis, no more than 3 percent of the experimental and demonstration housing projects fund will be used for administrative expenses.
- D. The council may make appropriations from the experimental and demonstration housing projects fund for the following purposes:
  - <u>1.</u> <u>To acquire interests in real property for the uses</u> set forth above.
  - 2. To provide grants or loans to any nonprofit organization that complies with section 501(c) of the internal revenue code and any other requirement under federal, state, and county law regulating the conduct of charitable or nonprofit organizations, provided that the purpose of any grant or loan must be consistent with the proposed uses set forth above.
- <u>16.28.080 Grant or loan requirements.</u> A. A grant or loan agreement for distribution of funds under this chapter must contain the following conditions and restrictions:
  - 1. Title to any real property must be held in perpetuity by the grantee or the borrower unless conveyed to the County or to a qualified nonprofit organization as approved by the council.
  - 2. The grantee or borrower must submit annual reports to the director documenting the project's progress.

- 3. The subject project must not be sold, exchanged, divested, or converted to other uses that are inconsistent with the purposes set forth in this chapter without the prior approval of the council by resolution.
- 4. If the grantee or borrower dissolves or is adjudicated bankrupt pursuant to any applicable federal statute, title to any real property that has been funded or improved by a grant or loan issued from the fund shall be conveyed to the County or to a qualified nonprofit organization as approved by the council.
- 5. The grantee or borrower may not distribute or redistribute grant or loan funds to other organizations without the council's prior approval by resolution.

#### B. Loans from the fund must:

- 1. Be secured by a first mortgage lien in favor of the County.
  - 2. Have a term set by the director.
- 3. Require the borrower to execute a promissory note in favor of the County.
- 4. <u>Include an interest rate set at 3 percent per annum.</u>
- <u>5.</u> <u>Be recorded with the bureau of conveyances or</u> the land court.
- C. In the event of a loan default or if the project is not serving the purposes as set forth in this chapter, the following may be required of the borrower:
  - 1. Forfeit the land or property to the County.
  - 2. Repay the loan with applicable interest.

# <u>16.28.090 Criteria for selection of grant or loan</u> proposals. A. Grant or loan proposals submitted must include:

- 1. A detailed description of the proposed project and an outline of the income categories the project will serve.
- 2. A brief overview of a long-term management plan for the proposed project.
- 3. A description of all efforts to leverage or match funding from non-county sources for the subject project.
- B. Grant or loan proposals must demonstrate that the subject project has the potential to facilitate the research and development of ideas that would reduce the cost of housing in the state."

A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 3, MAUI COUNTY CODE, TO ESTABLISH A COST-RECOVERY POLICY FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF PLANNING

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI:

SECTION 1. Title 3, Maui County Code, is amended to establish a new chapter to read as follows:

#### "Chapter 3.01

#### COST-RECOVERY POLICY FOR THE PLANNING DEPARTMENT

#### Sections:

3.01.010	Findings.
3.01.020	Policy.
3.01.030	Requirements

- **3.01.010 Findings.** A. The council finds the planning department historically recovers only approximately 6 percent of its total budget via fee revenue and only approximately 18 percent of the costs associated with providing fee-related services. The majority of the planning department's budget has been funded by the general fund. The council further finds planning departments in other municipalities have avoided overreliance on general fund revenue by implementing cost-recovery policies.
- B. The council finds the County does not have a procedure for analyzing the planning department's cost of providing services, and a comprehensive study has not been conducted in more than twenty-five years. The County does not have a method for updating its fees annually via consumer-price index or other factors.
- **3.01.020 Policy.** A cost-recovery policy will be implemented by the planning department after a comprehensive

study has been conducted and a subsequent fee schedule has been included in the annual budget ordinance.

- **3.01.030 Requirements.** A. Consistent with the recommendations of the "Final Report on the Fee Study and Cost Recovery Plan for the Department of Planning," prepared by Matrix Consulting Group, dated December 2, 2009, the planning director will conduct a comprehensive study necessary to form the basis of a cost-recovery policy for the planning department, with the study to be completed within one year of the effective date of the ordinance establishing this chapter.
- B. Within three months of the completion of the study required by subsection A, the planning director shall propose one or more ordinances to amend the annual budget ordinance by establishing a revised fee schedule and to amend this chapter by establishing a detailed cost-recovery policy for the planning department."

The corporation counsel and the prosecuting attorney shall have sole discretion to set the annual salary of each deputy in their respective departments within a range that is twenty percent greater or less than the allocated amount, provided that the annual salary of any deputy shall not exceed the salary of the first deputy corporation counsel or the first deputy prosecuting attorney, whichever is lower. The allocated amount for a deputy shall depend upon the number of full years that has elapsed since the deputy was admitted to the practice of law in any State or the District of Columbia, as of the beginning of the fiscal year, as follows:

SECTION 1. Request for Loan. The County of Maui, pursuant to Section 342D-83 through Section 342D-87, Hawaii Revised Statutes, has submitted an application for a State Water Pollution Control Revolving Fund Loan ("SRF loan") to the Director of the Department of Health, State of Hawaii, to finance the following project:

Under the terms and conditions anticipated with regard to each such SRF loan, the County shall repay, over a term of twenty years, the principal amount, which shall not exceed the amount of each such loan stated above, at a fixed rate of interest that shall not exceed the Bond Buyer's 20-year general obligation bond issue.

SECTION 2. <u>Council Authorization</u>. Pursuant to Section 2.20.020, Maui County Code, the Council of the County of Maui hereby authorizes the Mayor to enter into intergovernmental agreements, which would include the execution of all necessary documents between the State of Hawaii and the County of Maui relating to the SRF loan, to finance the construction of the Project, including a

pledge of the County's full faith and credit, including but not limited to the County's general taxing power, as security for repayment of the loan and payment of interest and loan fees, and a covenant to exercise the County's authority as needed. The repayment of principal, interest, and any loan fees shall be a first charge on the General Fund of the County.

SECTION 3. <u>Effective Date</u>. This ordinance shall take effect on July 1, 2019.

#### BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI:

SECTION 1. <u>Authorization of General Obligation Bonds</u>. Pursuant to Chapter 47, Hawaii Revised Statutes, as amended, and particularly Part I thereof, there are hereby authorized to be issued and sold from time to time general obligation bonds of the County of Maui, State of Hawaii (the "County") in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$50,939,000 (the "Bonds"), the proceeds derived from the sale of which shall be used to pay all or part of the cost of appropriations for the public improvements of the County described in Section 2 hereof.

SECTION 2. <u>Disposition of Bond Proceeds</u>. All or any portion of the proceeds derived from the sale of the Bonds or any notes issued in anticipation of the Bonds shall be used to pay all or part of the cost of any of the public improvements listed below in accordance with appropriations contained in the Fiscal Year 2020 Budget, including amendments and supplements thereto, duly approved by the Council of the County (the "Council") for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2020 (the "Fiscal Year 2020 Budget"); provided, however, that pursuant to Section 47-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the part of such proceeds which are in excess of the amounts required for the purposes for which the Bonds are initially issued from time to time, or which may not be applied to such purposes, or which the Council deems should not be applied to such purposes, may be applied to finance such other public improvements of the County as the Council shall, by ordinance approved by an affirmative vote of two-thirds of all of its members, determine; and provided further that the actual use and application of the proceeds of Bonds issued pursuant to this ordinance shall not in any way

affect the validity or legality of such Bonds. No proceeds of the Bonds shall be applied to any public improvement listed in this section unless and until there shall be a valid appropriation of general obligation bond proceeds in effect for such public improvement. The public improvements provided for or to be provided for in the Fiscal Year 2020 Budget, to be financed with proceeds from the sale of the Bonds, are as follows:

The cost of issuance of the Bonds or any series thereof, including without limitation, the initial fee of paying agents and registrars, the fees of financial consultants and bond counsel, the cost of preparation of any Official Statement relating to the Bonds, any notices of sale and forms of bid and the definitive Bonds, and the costs of publication of any notices of sale, may be paid from the proceeds of the Bonds or any series thereof and such costs shall be allocated pro rata to each of the foregoing projects financed from such proceeds.

SECTION 3. Details of Bonds. The Bonds authorized for issuance and sale in Section 1 hereof shall be issued and sold in their entirety at one time, as a separate issue or as part of an issue of general obligation bonds of the County, or from time to time in part in series, as shall be determined by the Director of Finance to be in the best interest of the County; provided, however, nothing herein shall prohibit or be deemed to prohibit the issuance and sale of all or part of the Bonds contemporaneously with the issuance and sale of other authorized general obligation bonds either as part of the same series or as separate series. The Bonds shall be issued in fully registered form without coupons and in the denomination of \$5,000 or any integral multiple thereof. The Bonds of a given series shall be numbered in any manner as the Director of Finance shall determine. The Director of Finance is hereby authorized to determine, in accordance with and subject to the provisions of the Constitution

of the State of Hawaii, Chapter 47, Hawaii Revised Statutes, as amended or other applicable law and this ordinance, the series designation of the Bonds; the date of the Bonds; the principal and interest payment dates of the Bonds and the record dates of holders of the Bonds entitled to receive such interest payments; the maturity dates of the Bonds; the amount of principal of the Bonds maturing on each maturity date; the place or places at which the Bonds may be paid or registered, which may include the office of the Director of Finance; whether the Bonds shall be in book-entry form; and whether or not the Bonds shall be subject to redemption prior to their stated maturities and, if subject to such prior redemption, the provisions for such prior redemption, the premiums (if any) payable upon such redemption and the respective periods in which such premiums are payable.

SECTION 4. Redemption of Bonds. If any Bond (or portion thereof in installments of \$5,000 or any integral multiple thereof) is to be redeemed, notice of redemption shall be given in such manner as the Director of Finance shall determine. If any Bond shall have been duly called for redemption and notice of such redemption duly given as aforesaid, and if moneys for the payment of such Bond at the then applicable redemption price and the interest accrued on the principal amount thereof to the date of redemption are made or duly provided for by the County, interest on such Bond shall cease to accrue and become payable from and after the date fixed for redemption.

SECTION 5. Registration, Exchange and Transfer of Bonds. At all times during which any Bond of any series remains outstanding and unpaid, the registrar for such series shall keep or cause to be kept at its designated office bond registration books for the registration, exchange and transfer of such series of Bonds. Upon presentation at its designated office for such purpose the registrar, under such reasonable provisions as it may prescribe, shall register, exchange or transfer, or cause to be registered, exchanged or transferred, on the bond registration books the Bonds of such series as hereinbefore set forth. The bond registration books shall at all times be open for inspection by the County or any duly authorized officer thereof.

Any Bond of any series may be exchanged at the designated office of the registrar for such series of Bonds for a like aggregate principal amount of such Bonds in other authorized principal sums of the same series, interest rate and maturity. Any Bond of any series may, in accordance with its terms, be transferred upon the bond registration books by the person in whose name it is registered, in person or by such person's duly authorized agent, upon surrender of such Bond to the registrar for such series for cancellation, accompanied by a written instrument of transfer duly executed by the registered owner in person or by such owner's duly authorized agent, in form satisfactory to the registrar.

All transfers or exchanges pursuant to this Section shall be made without expense to the holder of such Bonds, except as otherwise herein provided, and except that the registrar for such series of Bonds shall require the payment by the holder of the Bond requesting such transfer or exchange of any tax or other governmental charges required to be paid with respect to such transfer or exchange. All Bonds surrendered pursuant to this Section shall be canceled.

No transfer or exchange of Bonds shall be required to be made during the fifteen (15) days next preceding an interest payment date for such series of Bonds, nor during the forty-five (45) days next preceding the date fixed for redemption of such Bonds.

Whenever any Bond of a series shall be surrendered for transfer or exchange, the County shall execute and deliver at the designated office of the registrar for such series, and the registrar shall prepare and authenticate, and send by registered mail to the owner or new owner thereof at such owner's request, risk and expense, a new duly executed Bond or Bonds of the same series, interest rate and maturity and for the like aggregate principal sum registered on the bond registration books in such manner as the owner or transferee, as the case may be, may request.

SECTION 6. Execution and Form of Fully Registered Bonds. The Bonds shall bear the manual or facsimile signatures of the Director of Finance or the Deputy Director of Finance and the Mayor of the County and shall be sealed with the seal or a facsimile seal of the County. The Director of Finance may, at the Director's election, sign or direct the Deputy Director of Finance to sign such number of Bonds of any series as the Director of Finance shall determine and deliver such signed Bonds to the registrar for such series for safekeeping prior to the time such Bonds are actually issued, exchanged or transferred. Unless the Director of Finance is the registrar, the Director of Finance shall direct the registrar for the Bonds of a given series to authenticate such Bonds and no such Bond shall be valid or obligatory for any purpose unless and until the certificate of authentication endorsed on each Bond shall have been manually executed by any authorized officer of the registrar. It shall not be necessary that any Bonds which are manually signed by the Director of Finance, and for which the Director of Finance is the registrar, bear any such certificate of authentication. Upon the registration of any Bonds the registrar shall insert on such Bonds the date as of which such Bonds are registered.

Bonds may be printed, typewritten or otherwise produced. The form of the Bonds, the registrar's certificate of authentication and the instrument of assignment shall be substantially as follows with such appropriate insertions, variations, and omissions as are required with respect to a particular series of Bonds:

SECTION 7. Sale of Bonds. Without any further authorization from or action by the Council, but subject to the provisions hereof including in particular those limitations set forth in Section 3 and of applicable law, the Director of Finance is hereby authorized to issue and sell the Bonds at one time or from time to time in series at competitive sale or at negotiated sale in accordance with Section 47-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, as amended, in each

case at such price or prices and upon such terms and conditions as the Director of Finance shall approve and determine to be in the best interest of the County. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, with respect to the sale of the Bonds or of portions of the Bonds, the Director of Finance is hereby authorized to retain bond counsel, paying agents, registrars and financial and accounting consultants, upon such terms and conditions as the Director of Finance shall deem advisable and in the best interest of the County, to select the date for such sale, to publish and distribute a Notice of Sale or to enter into a contract for the sale of the Bonds or portions thereof, in each case in such form and containing such terms and conditions as the Director of Finance shall approve and deem advisable, to distribute an Official Statement and such other information relating to the Bonds as the Director of Finance may deem advisable, to receive bids for the sale of the Bonds or the portion thereof being offered and to award the sale of the Bonds or the portion thereof being offered to the bidder offering the lowest interest cost therefor, in accordance with the applicable Notice of Sale, if any; provided that the Director of Finance may reserve the right to reject any and all bids. Subject to the provisions of Section 3 hereof, without further action of the Council, the Bonds shall bear interest at the rates per annum as specified in the contract or contracts approved or in the bid or bids accepted.

The Director of Finance and all officials of the County are hereby authorized to take such action and execute such orders, receipts and other documents as may be necessary in order to effectuate the sale of the Bonds or any portion thereof, and, if any contract therefor be approved or any bid therefor be accepted, the preparation, execution and delivery thereof, in accordance with the provisions hereof and applicable law. Subsequent to the sale of the Bonds, the Director of Finance shall report the results of such sale to the Council by letter.

SECTION 8. <u>Authorization of Bond Anticipation Notes</u>. General obligation bond anticipation notes are hereby authorized for issuance and sale by the Director of Finance in anticipation of the issuance and sale of the general obligation bonds authorized herein. The issuance and details of the notes shall be governed by the provisions of Section 47-16, Hawaii Revised Statutes, as amended. Bonds in anticipation of which bond anticipation notes are issued pursuant to this section may be issued and sold in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance at any time within five years of the date of issuance of the first notes issued in anticipation of such Bonds.

The proceeds derived from the sale of any notes issued in anticipation of the Bonds shall be used to pay all or part of the cost of any appropriation for the various public improvements set forth in Section 2.

SECTION 9. <u>Security for the Bonds</u>. The full faith and credit of the County are hereby pledged to the payment of the principal of and interest on the Bonds and the principal and interest payments shall be a first charge on

the General Fund of the County. Pursuant to Chapter 47, Hawaii Revised Statutes, as amended, particularly Part I thereof, the County shall levy ad valorem taxes without limitation as to rate or amount on real property subject to taxation by the County, sufficient to pay principal of and interest on the Bonds as they become due. This ordinance shall constitute an agreement by the County with the holders of the Bonds authorized pursuant to this ordinance; provided that amendments may be made to this ordinance as may be necessary to correct errors, comply with the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, to otherwise protect the security for the bonds, or such other amendment that does not materially and adversely affect the interests of the holders of the Bonds.

SECTION 10. Tax Covenant and Approval of Issuance of Bonds as Tax-Exempt or Taxable Bonds. The Bonds (and any previously authorized but unissued general obligation bonds) (the "Authorized Bonds") are hereby authorized to be issued, in whole or in part, and in any combination, including one or more separate issues or series, as either tax-exempt bonds ("Tax-Exempt Bonds") or federally taxable bonds ("Taxable Bonds"). The Director of Finance shall determine and elect, based on the best interests of the County, which portions of the Authorized Bonds (including any previously authorized but unissued general obligation bonds) shall be designated and issued as Tax-Exempt Bonds or Taxable Bonds. Previously authorized but unissued general obligation bonds are hereby expressly authorized to be issued as Tax-Exempt Bonds or Taxable Bonds and in this regard any portion of any ordinance or resolution of the County in conflict with this Section is hereby amended.

For Authorized Bonds (including any previously authorized but unissued general obligation bonds) that are designated and issued as Tax-Exempt Bonds, the County hereby covenants and agrees to comply with the provisions of Sections 103 and 141-150 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended ("Code"), and the applicable Treasury Regulations if and to the extent required to maintain the exclusion from gross income of interest on the Tax-Exempt Bonds for federal income tax purposes for so long as any Tax-Exempt Bond shall be outstanding.

For Authorized Bonds (including any previously authorized but unissued general obligation bonds) that are designated and issued as Taxable Bonds, the interest on such Taxable Bonds shall not be excluded from gross income for federal income tax purposes.

SECTION 11. Reimbursement of expenditures. The County expects that it will pay certain capital expenditures in connection with the public improvements of the County described in Section 2 hereof prior to the issuance of the Bonds, and reasonably expects to reimburse such expenditures from the proceeds of such Bonds. The County hereby declares its official intent to use proceeds of the Bonds to reimburse itself for future expenditures in connection with such public improvements. This ordinance is adopted in part for

purposes of establishing compliance with the requirements of Section 1.150-2 of the Treasury Regulations.

This ordinance shall be reasonably available for inspection by the general public during normal business hours at the offices of the County Clerk, located at 200 South High Street, Wailuku, Maui, Hawaii, commencing within fifteen (15) days after the approval hereof by the Council.

SECTION 12. <u>CUSIP Identification Numbers</u>. The Director of Finance may authorize the printing of CUSIP identification numbers upon the Bonds. Such numbers and the printing thereof shall be subject in all respects to the provisions of Section 47-10, Hawaii Revised Statutes, as amended.

SECTION 13. Bond Insurance. If the original purchaser of the Bonds, or any portion thereof, shall procure insurance for the payment of the principal of and interest on such Bonds and desires that a statement with respect to such insurance shall be printed upon such Bonds, space shall be provided on the backs of the printed Bonds for the printing of such statement. The cost, if any, of the printing of any such statement upon the Bonds shall be at the expense of such original purchaser, and the County shall not have any liability with respect thereto. Should the procuring of such insurance or the printing of a statement of such insurance upon the back of the Bonds cause a delay either in the printing of the Bonds or in the delivery of and payment therefor, the County, after notifying the original purchaser of the same, shall proceed with the printing of such Bonds without a copy of such statement thereon, or shall proceed with the delivery of such Bonds without such insurance having been obtained, as the case may be, unless an agreement is reached between the County and the original purchaser of such Bonds extending the date of delivery of and payment for such Bonds. Neither the failure by the original purchaser of the Bonds to obtain any such insurance nor the failure to print on any Bonds a copy of a statement of insurance or any error with respect thereto shall constitute cause for failure or refusal by the original purchaser of the bonds to accept delivery of and pay for such Bonds. If any such insurance on the Bonds shall be obtained by the original purchaser of such Bonds, (a) such insurance shall not constitute a part of the contract by and with the County evidenced by a particular Bond or constitute a part of the proceedings providing for the issuance thereof, and (b) no liability or responsibility shall attach to the County or any officer or agent thereof in any way by reason of any such insurance, including, without limiting the foregoing, with respect to the procuring, maintenance, enforcement or collection thereof. Without limiting the effect of the provisions of the preceding sentence, the County shall be under no obligation to take or refrain from taking any action by reason of the existence of such insurance or any of the provisions thereof, even though the taking or refraining from taking of such action may result in or be cause for cancellation or cessation of such insurance.

SECTION 14. Refunding Bonds. Pursuant to Chapter 47, Hawaii Revised Statutes, as amended, and particularly Section 47-17, there are hereby authorized for issuance and sale at one time or from time to time general obligation refunding bonds of the County (the "Refunding Bonds") in one or more series for the purpose of refunding in advance of their maturity all or part of any outstanding general obligation bonds of the County, loans, notes or other instruments of indebtedness secured by the full faith and credit of the County, as the Director of Finance shall determine to be in the best interest of the County, and to pay all costs incurred in the issuance thereof and the refunding of such outstanding bonds, loans, notes or other instruments of indebtedness, and shall be in any amount necessary for such purposes. The proceeds of the Refunding Bonds of any particular series shall be applied to the payment of the principal of, and redemption premium, if any, and interest on the bonds, loans, notes or other instruments of indebtedness, to be refunded and to the payment of all costs incurred in the issuance of such Refunding Bonds and the interest accrued on the Refunding Bonds to the date of delivery thereof and payment therefor, all as determined by the Director of Finance. Such Refunding Bonds shall be issued as Bonds under this ordinance.

SECTION 15. <u>Effect of Section Headings</u>. The headings or titles of the several Sections hereof shall be solely for convenience of reference and shall not affect the meaning, construction, interpretation or effect of this ordinance.

SECTION 16. Repeal of Inconsistent Ordinance and Resolution. Any ordinance or resolution of the County, or any portion thereof, in conflict or inconsistent with this ordinance is hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict or inconsistency.

SECTION 17. Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect on July 1, 2019.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI:

SECTION 1. The Council of the County of Maui hereby finds and determines that: (i) the County of Maui (the "County") has heretofore issued its general obligation bonds (the "Bonds") pursuant to Ordinance Nos. 4228, 4331 and 4454 (the "Ordinances"); (ii) certain of the purposes for which the Bonds were issued as set forth in the Ordinances have been completed or will be completed at a cost which is less than the amount of Bonds proceeds appropriated therefor, resulting in \$382,411 in excess of the amounts required for the purposes provided in the Ordinances; (iii) there is a total of \$382,411 of the proceeds of the Bonds issued pursuant to the Ordinances which are in excess of the amounts required for the purposes provided in the Ordinances or which shall not be applied to purposes provided in the Ordinances; (iv) pursuant to Section 47-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS"), and the Ordinances, the amount of the proceeds of the Bonds which are in excess of the amounts required for the purposes provided in the Ordinances and the amounts of the proceeds of the Bonds which shall not be applied for the purposes provided in the Ordinances may be applied to finance such other public improvements of the County as the Council of the County shall, by ordinance approved by an affirmative vote of twothirds of all of its members, determine; (v) the Fiscal Year 2020 Budget for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2020 (the "Fiscal Year 2020 Budget"), includes appropriations for public improvements to be financed from the proceeds of general obligation bonds; and (vi) it is in the best interests of the County to apply the proceeds of the Bonds issued pursuant to the Ordinances which are in excess of, or shall not be applied to, purposes provided in the Ordinances to pay the cost of appropriations for the public improvements set forth herein.

SECTION 2. Pursuant to Section 47-5, HRS, and the Ordinances, the Council of the County of Maui hereby determines that \$382,411 of the proceeds of the general obligation bonds of the County issued pursuant to the Ordinances is in excess of the amounts required for the purposes provided in the Ordinances for which such bonds were issued, and such amount shall be reallocated to finance the appropriation made for the following capital improvement projects in the Fiscal Year 2020 Budget, to wit:

#### A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE CAPITAL PROGRAM FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 2020

#### BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI:

SECTION 1. This ordinance may be referred to as the "Fiscal Year 2020 Capital Program."

SECTION 2. <u>Pending Capital Improvement Projects.</u> The Capital Improvement Projects Report as of March 31, 2019, is set forth in Appendices A-1 and A-2 (attached hereto and made a part hereof).

SECTION 3. <u>Proposed Capital Program for Fiscal Years 2020 through 2025.</u> The proposed Capital Program for Fiscal Years 2020 through 2025 is set forth in Appendix B (attached hereto and made a part hereof).

SECTION 4. If any provision of this ordinance, or the application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid provision or applications, and to this end, the provisions of this ordinance are severable.

SECTION 5. This ordinance shall take effect on July 1, 2019.

#### **GENERAL BUDGET PROVISIONS**

SECTION 5. **E/Ps and LTAs.** An "E/P" or equivalent personnel is the decimal equivalent of a full-time position. A full-time position is equal to 2,080 scheduled hours of work during the fiscal year. All positions are computed as an equivalent of 2,080 scheduled hours of work; 1.0 E/P equals 2,080 hours. This method of computing the number of authorized personnel in a department or program shall not be construed to grant to an incumbent in a position any rights beyond those provided by law or collective-bargaining agreement. All positions shall be identified by an E/P designation. Disbursement shall be limited to the total number of E/Ps identified in a program appropriation. Any transfer of E/Ps from one program to another shall be approved by ordinance.

"LTA" or Limited Term Appointment means an appointment that is made from an eligible list or through a non-competitive promotion, transfer, or demotion for a specified temporary period.

SECTION 6. **Salaries and premium pay.** Appropriations for salaries and premium pay may be disbursed within the pertinent office, department, agency, or program for the following:

- (A) a temporary position to functionally replace a permanent employee who is on long-term leave or who has been temporarily assigned to replace a permanent employee who is on long-term leave; provided that disbursement shall be limited in duration to the leave of the permanent employee who is on long-term leave; and
- (B) trainee positions for which there is an existing or anticipated vacancy and for which hiring and replacing is critical to continued operations, provided that funds are available.
- SECTION 7. **A, B, and C accounts.** Unless otherwise provided herein, appropriations for each program may be disbursed for the following categories of use:
  - (A) salaries, premium pay, or reallocation pay;
  - (B) operations or services; and
  - (C) equipment;

provided that the disbursement is within the program and category of use for which it was appropriated.

Disbursement for salaries, premium pay, and reallocation pay shall include temporary assignment pay, overtime pay, night differential pay, hazardous pay, standby pay, emergency call back pay, reallocations, and reclassifications. Funds shall not be disbursed for reallocations and reclassifications that involve a change in supervisory duties and responsibilities until the County Council receives written notice setting forth:

- (A) an explanation of the reasons for the change; and
- (B) organizational charts showing the existing organization and the proposed organization of the department.

The County Council shall be notified of any reallocation or reclassification when a position is transferred from the blue-collar compensation plan, white-collar non-professional compensation plan, white-collar professional compensation plan, uniformed fire compensation plan, or uniformed police compensation plan to a different compensation plan. An explanation of any temporary assignment, temporary transfer, and temporary allocation that is expected to be in effect for more than 30 days shall be provided to the County Council. Receipt of written notice by the County Clerk shall constitute receipt by the County Council. Any amounts appropriated as County matching funds may be encumbered and disbursed for operations, services, or equipment.

Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this section, appropriations may be disbursed by a department to reimburse another department for work performed.

SECTION 8. **General obligation bonds.** General obligation bonds appropriated in this ordinance need not be authorized contemporaneously with this ordinance to be included as estimated revenues. Any increase or decrease in revenues or any increase or decrease in appropriations to any department or program, any transfer of funds from one department to another, or any transfer of funds within a department shall be made in accordance with law.

SECTION 9. County and State laws. All provisions of law contained in the Maui County Code and Hawaii Revised Statutes that affect the expenditure of the revenues from the rates, fees, assessments, and taxes herein adopted are incorporated herein and made a part hereof. All provisions of law limiting the expenditure of fund revenues are incorporated herein and made a part hereof.

SECTION 10. **Capital improvement projects.** Funding for capital improvement projects is appropriated as described in Appendix C.

#### SECTION 11. Grant revenues.

- (A) The grant revenues, which include revenues from grants and revenues with restricted uses, set forth in Part I of Appendix A are expected to be derived by the County from Federal, State, or private sources during Fiscal Year 2020. These grant revenues are appropriated in the amounts set forth in Part I of Appendix A to the programs and uses identified therein; provided, that disbursement is conditioned on:
  - (1) receipt of a notification of grant award from the grantor, or receipt of notification from the grantor that the grant award will be forthcoming and that the County is authorized to incur costs pursuant to the grant award; and
  - (2) written notice to the County Council, to which a copy of the notification from the grantor is attached.

When a specific amount from a grant is appropriated for a specific position, the individual in that position shall be paid only the amount so specified during this fiscal year and no more, notwithstanding that the terms or rules and regulations of the grant may allow additional pay for the position. Unless specifically authorized, grant revenues shall not be used for salaries and personnel services for a County position.

- (B) Subject to the requirements of this section, the Mayor is hereby authorized to execute any documents to receive and expend the funds for the grants and programs identified in Part I of Appendix A.
- (C) Grant revenues derived during Fiscal Year 2020 that are not included in Part I of Appendix A shall be subject to Sections 12 and 13, as may be appropriate.
- SECTION 12. Additional grant revenues. Whenever the County is notified that grant revenues are available from Federal or State sources for programs other than those identified in Part I of Appendix A, the County Council may authorize the acceptance of the revenues by adding the revenues to Part I of Appendix A. The following procedure shall apply:
- (A) These grant revenues are deemed appropriated upon enactment of an ordinance adding the estimated revenues to Part I of Appendix A; provided, that disbursement is conditioned on:
  - (1) receipt of a notification of grant award from the grantor, or receipt of notification from the grantor that the grant award will be forthcoming and that the County is authorized to incur costs pursuant to the grant award; and

- (2) written notice to the County Council, to which a copy of the notification from the grantor is attached.
- (B) Subject to the requirements of this section, the Mayor is authorized to execute any documents to receive and expend the funds for the programs identified in the grant award.
- SECTION 13. **Donations.** Whenever the County receives donations of money from private sources not provided for in Part I of Appendix A, the County Council may approve its acceptance and authorize its expenditure in accordance with Chapter 3.56, Maui County Code.
- SECTION 14. **Special purpose revenues.** The special purpose revenues set forth in Part II of Appendix A are expected to be on hand as of June 30, 2019, or derived by the County during Fiscal Year 2020, from the programs or activities described in the Revised Charter of the County of Maui (1983), as amended, Maui County Code, or Hawaii Revised Statutes at the references set forth under A through Y therein. The balance remaining in each of the revolving or special funds as of June 30, 2019, is reappropriated to the particular fund. Revenues derived from the particular program or activities during the fiscal year shall be deposited into the applicable special purpose revenue fund. Expenditures from a fund shall be through appropriations set forth in Part II of Appendix A
- SECTION 15. Fees, rates, assessments, and taxes. The fees, rates, assessments, and taxes in Appendix B are adopted.
- SECTION 16. **Schedule of concessions, leases, and licenses.** The schedule of concessions, leases, and licenses in Appendix B-1 is adopted.
- SECTION 17. **Estimated funds.** The several amounts listed below are declared to be the estimated encumbered County funds as of June 30, 2019 and unencumbered County funds on hand as of July 1, 2019. The estimated amounts set forth in this section are shown in accordance with Section 9-3 of the Revised Charter of the County of Maui (1983), as amended. The actual amounts of any encumbered and unencumbered funds that the County will have on hand as of June 30, 2019, will be set forth in the Comprehensive Annual Financial Report.

Encumbered funds \$164,396,051 Unencumbered funds (carryover/savings) \$46,216,915

SECTION 18. For the purpose of this section, "County fund" excludes pension or retirement funds, funds under the control of any independent board or commission, funds set aside for the redemption of bonds or the payment of interest thereon, park

dedication funds, or special purpose funds. In the event there are monies in any County fund that, in the judgment of the Director of Finance, are in excess of the amounts necessary for the immediate requirements of the respective funds, and where in the iudgment of the Director of Finance, such action will not impede the necessary or desirable financial operation of the County, the Director of Finance may make temporary transfers or loans therefrom without interest to the Bond Fund or the Housing Interim Financing and Buy-Back Revolving Fund. The amount of such temporary transfers or loans shall not exceed the amount of general obligation bonds, state loans or notes authorized but not issued. At any time, the aggregate amount of such transfers and loans that shall be unreimbursed shall not exceed \$55,000,000. Monies transferred or loaned shall be expended only for appropriations from the Bond Fund or the Housing Interim Financing and Buy-Back Revolving Fund, which appropriations are specified to be financed from the sale of general obligation bonds or notes. Proceeds from the sale of general obligation bonds, notes or state loans shall be used to reimburse the fund from which transfers or loans are made. The expenditures of such transfers or loans The fund from which transfers or loans are made shall be reimbursed from time to time and in whole or in part, as determined by the Director of Finance, and shall be reimbursed from the proceeds of the sale of general obligation bonds, notes, or state loans, when and as issued. Within 30 days after the date each transfer or loan is made, the Director of Finance shall provide the following information to the County Council: (1) the amount of each transfer or loan made to date and the accumulated total; (2) the budgetary bonding authorization for each transfer or loan made to date; and (3) the time schedule for the sale of proposed general obligation bonds, notes or state loans proposed for reimbursement or repayment of each transfer or loan made to date. Proceeds of tax-exempt general obligation bonds, state loans or notes may be applied to reimburse or repay a transfer or loan that was used to fund public improvement costs paid before the issuance date thereof, so long as such expenditure was (i) not made prior to sixty (60) days before the County's adoption of a declaration of official intent to finance the public improvement or the approval by ordinance authorizing the project(s) to be funded with general obligation bonds, notes or state loans, (ii) not made more than eighteen (18) months prior to the issuance date thereof or the date the public improvement funded by the transfer or loan was placed-in-service, whichever is later. and (iii) not made more than three (3) years prior to the issuance date thereof, unless such cost is attributable to a "preliminary expenditure." For this purpose, preliminary expenditure means architectural, engineering, surveying, soil testing and similar costs incurred prior to the commencement of construction or rehabilitation of the public improvement funded by the transfer or loan, but does not include land acquisition, site preparation and similar costs incident to the commencement of acquisition, construction or rehabilitation of the public improvement funded by the transfer or loan. Preliminary expenditures funded with proceeds of tax-exempt general obligation bonds or notes may not exceed 20% of the issue of tax-exempt general obligation bonds or notes. The Budget Director shall consult with the Director of Finance from time to time as to the

timing and eligibility of accrued expenditures eligible for reimbursement by tax-exempt general obligation bonds or notes. The Budget Director will annually provide the Director of Finance with a list of capital expenditures to be financed from the proceeds of tax-exempt general obligation bonds, notes or state loans prior to their final inclusion in the annual budget of the County. Nothing herein will preclude the County from reimbursing temporary transfers or loans from taxable bonds or notes.

At the close of each quarter, the Director of Finance shall submit to the County Council a Combined Statement of Cash Receipts and Disbursements showing for each month for each individual fund the cash balance at the start of the accounting period, the cash receipts and disbursements during the period, and the cash balance at the end of the period. Within forty-five (45) days after the close of each quarter, the Director of Finance shall submit a separate report showing the accumulated balance of any fund or account which exceeds \$100,000, and which would be available for appropriation upon certification by the Mayor.

SECTION 19. **Establishment of accounts.** The Director of Finance is authorized to establish appropriate individual and separate accounts for receipts and expenditures except as otherwise provided herein. The Director of Finance is authorized to establish accounts for items of receipt and expenditures for the departments, agencies, or divisions as required by law to establish accounting and financial procedures under utility and other enterprise fund accounting.

SECTION 20. Transfer of appropriations from countywide costs to a department. The Director of Finance is authorized to transfer appropriations from programs under countywide costs to a department if:

- (A) generally accepted accounting principles require the transfer to properly reflect the financial accounting of the department;
- (B) the total appropriation transferred shall not exceed the appropriation of the respective program in countywide costs; and
- (C) the County Council is notified of the transfer with an explanation of the action. Receipt of written notice by the County Clerk shall constitute receipt by the County Council.

SECTION 21. **Penalties.** Whoever intentionally or knowingly violates this ordinance shall, upon conviction, be fined not more than \$1,000 or imprisoned not more than 30 days, or both.

SECTION 22. **Self-insurance coverage adjustment.** If a court of competent jurisdiction holds any appropriation in this ordinance invalid, the appropriation for the County's self-insurance coverage shall be adjusted to the extent necessary to maintain the equality of estimated revenues, proposed expenditures, and total appropriations, as required by Section 9-5 of the Revised Charter of the County of Maui (1983), as amended.

SECTION 23. **Severability.** If a court of competent jurisdiction holds any appropriation in this ordinance invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or applications of the ordinance that can be given effect without the invalid provision or application.

SECTION 24. **Effective date.** This ordinance shall take effect on July 1, 2019. APPROVED AS TO FORM AND LEGALITY:

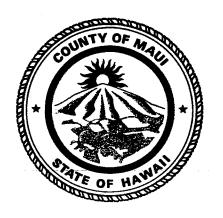

There is a minimum real property tax of \$400 per year except for tracts leased under Section 207 of the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act, those portions of real property designated as kuleana land and granted an exemption pursuant to MCC 3.48.554, MCC 3.48.475, and any parcel used for farming taro where the assessed value times the current Agricultural rate is less than the minimum real property tax. Homes or portions thereof granted an exemption under MCC 3.48.475 are to be levied a real property tax of \$150 per year. Remnant parcels granted an exemption under MCC 3.48.552 are to be levied a real property tax of \$150 per year.

3108 Public Service Company Tax

Prior to final subdivision approval or issuance of a building permit for a development subject to this chapter, the department shall require the developer to enter into a residential workforce housing agreement. The agreement shall set forth the method by which the developer satisfies the requirements of this chapter. The requirements may be satisfied by one or a combination of the following, which shall be determined by the director of housing and human concerns and stated in the agreement:
  - Offer for sale, single-family dwelling units, two-family dwelling units, or multi-family dwelling units as residential workforce housing within the community plan area:

  - In lieu of directly selling or renting units pursuant to subsections (B)(1) or (B)(2) the developer may convey such units to a qualified housing provider subject to department approval pursuant to section 2.96.150; or
  - 4. In lieu of providing residential workforce housing units, the residential workforce housing requirement may be satisfied by payment of a fee, by providing improved land, or by providing unimproved land in accordance with the following:
    - a. The in-lieu fee per residential workforce housing unit required by this chapter shall be equal to the difference in unit costs for a three-bedroom, single-family dwelling unit, at one hundred percent and a threebedroom, single-family dwelling unit at one hundred sixty percent of median income, for a family of four, pursuant to HUD affordable sales price guidelines, or as adjusted by the development for Hana, Lanai, and Molokai.
    - b. Any dedication of improved or unimproved land inlieu of residential workforce housing units shall be subject to the approval of the director of housing and human concerns and the council by resolution.
  - 5. Application of residential workforce housing credits issued pursuant to Maui County Code.
- C. Income group distribution.
  - 1. Unless an exemption is granted by the director, the percentage of ownership units within each income group shall be as follows:
    - a. Thirty percent of the ownership units shall be for "below-moderate income" residents.
    - b. Fifty percent of the ownership units shall be for "moderate income" residents.
    - c. Twenty percent of the ownership units shall be for "above-moderate income" residents.
  - Unless an exemption is granted by the director, the percentage of rental units within each income group shall be as follows:
    - a. One-third of the rental units shall be for "very low income" and "low income" residents.

C = Carryover savings (prior fiscal year) in excess of 20% as provided in Section 281-17.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes

EGS = Estimated Gross Sales (prior fiscal year)

Any licensee who fails to pay the percentage fee by the due date shall be assessed a late charge of 5% per month on the balance due until such fees are paid in full. The 5% late charge shall be a flat fee (not be prorated) that will be charged for any portion of the month payment is due.

Any licensee who failed to file the gross sales of liquor report by the due date, shall be assessed the percentage fee equal to the highest percentage fee due and payable by the licensee of the same class or the highest percentage fee due and payable by any licensee if there is no licensee in the same class.

URGING PUBLIC-EMPLOYEE UNIONS AND PUBLIC EMPLOYERS THROUGHOUT THE STATE OF HAWAI'I TO IMPLEMENT THE PRINCIPLE OF PAY EQUITY

WHEREAS, the Council has long recognized there is gender-based pay inequity in society at large and in government specifically; and

WHEREAS, Section 6(d) of the Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938 (29 U.S.C. 206(d)(1)) prohibits discrimination in compensation for equal work on the basis of sex; and

WHEREAS, Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (42 U.S.C. 2000e et seq.) prohibits discrimination in compensation because of race, color, religion, national origin, or sex; and

WHEREAS, the wage gap collectively costs women employed full-time in the United States more than \$840,000,000,000 in annual lost wages, meaning families have less money to spend on goods and services that help drive economic growth; and

WHEREAS, on March 25, 2014, the Council adopted Resolution 14-36, entitled "RECOGNIZING APRIL 8 2014 AS EQUAL PAY DAY IN MAUI COUNTY," which stated that "clerical staff employed by the County are predominantly women, laborers employed by the County are predominantly men, and the starting pay for clerk and clerical positions is less than the starting pay for laborer positions"; and

WHEREAS, at the Council meeting, then-Councilmember Michael P. Victorino addressed women in the gallery who had testified in support of the resolution and said, "We are going to say that we do recognize your value and that you do deserve equal pay;" and

WHEREAS, on December 22, 2015, then-Budget Director Sandy Baz transmitted to the Council a bill to increase the starting salaries of County employees in Bargaining Unit 03, predominantly composed of women, to be closer to the starting salaries of County employees in majority-men Bargaining Unit 01; and

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WHEREAS, on July 15, 2016, the Council rejected the bill by filing the Budget Director's correspondence; and

WHEREAS, Budget and Finance Committee Report 16-107, which recommended the filing, stated:

Your Committee noted the Mayor created a Clerk Repricing Committee three years ago comprised of clerks, secretaries, and administrative staff from various County departments to address the issue of equal pay for equal worth.

Your Committee noted the County's clerical positions are predominantly held by females and laborer positions are predominantly held by males. A minimum two years of clerical experience is needed for an entry-level clerk, yet the annual starting wage for a clerk is approximately \$15,500 below that of an entry-level laborer requiring no previous experience.

. .

Your Committee further noted salary discussions should be made at the bargaining table, in light of Bargaining Unit 03 being a large unit encompassing white collar, non-supervisory positions, including clerical, secretarial, and administrative positions from the counties and the State.

. . . Furthermore, the equal pay issue is a statewide matter, and is not limited to Maui County; and

WHEREAS, on October 25, 2018, Mr. Baz again submitted to the Council a bill to address the disparity in starting pay between Bargaining Units 01 and 03; and

WHEREAS, the Council did not schedule the new bill before the expiration of the 2017-2019 term; and

WHEREAS, all future collective-bargaining agreements applicable to local and State government employees in Hawai'i should reflect the principle of pay equity; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the County of Maui:

1. That it urges public-employee unions and public employers throughout the State of Hawai'i to execute

#### AUTHORIZING THE COUNCIL CHAIR TO CONTRACT FOR A PERFORMANCE AUDIT OF THE COUNTY'S OVERTIME CONTROLS

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 3-6 of the Revised Charter of the County of Maui (1983), as amended ("Charter"), the Council has the authority to conduct investigations of the operation of any department or function of the County and any subject upon which the Council may legislate; and

WHEREAS, overtime compensation, also known as premium pay, is a significant expense for the County; and

WHEREAS, the cost for overtime compensation appears to be rising at a pace that exceeds the overall budget's growth; and

WHEREAS, rising overtime costs could be based on inefficient management of human resources, insufficient staffing, or other factors; and

WHEREAS, as the County's budget authority and policymaker, the Council bears ultimate responsibility for evaluating and responding to the causes of rising overtime compensation in its role of managing the County's finances and other resources; and

WHEREAS, a performance audit of the County's overtime controls would therefore assist the Council in fulfilling its responsibilities under the Charter; now, therefore,

### BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the County of Maui:

- 1. That it hereby authorizes the Council Chair to contract for a performance audit of the County's overtime controls; and
