- I DO NOT SUPPORT allocating funds for the relocation of Pukoo Fire Station. Please remove it from budget for now until the Department has fulfilled its obligation to community discussion and any raised concerns have been addressed. Remove funding for now to allow for exploration of options, and meaningful and thorough conversations to be had between department and community to ensure the project site and scope is appropriate to character of community and culture. Culturally significant sites are known to exist in the vicinity of proposed project. I will not support this project if it is revealed that cultural sites will be destroyed.
- I do not support paving Mitchell Pauole parking lot, its fine how it is and this
 is in the SLR area.
- **I do not support** the new scale and scale house improvements at the landfill they have bigger issues up there like inadequate manpower.

SUPPORT:

- I support the 500k for the sea level rise/climate change plan.
- I support the property tax increases especially for STR's.

- I support increased operator positions for Molokai landfill

All the while our burial grounds and sand dunes are getting bulldozed for the sake of an improved sunset view.

In fact, this evening, I am off island to attend a mandatory partner gathering organized by a local foundation that recently made a five-year commitment to support MCAPP.

Additionally, this fiscal year, MCAPP has:

- Delivered proven sexual violence prevention education to 745 students in grades pre-K-12.
- Trained 71 faculty to spot warning signs and respond appropriately to disclosures of abuse.
- Launched Lamakū, a mentoring program that empowers teens to become advocates. Lamakū targets 8th, 9th, and 10th grade students and currently has 12 members.

According to surveys:

- 99% of Molokai Middle School participants agreed they were more motivated to show respect in relationships
- 100% of pre-school and elementary participants identified a safety circle, and gave accurate examples of good and bad touches, good and bad secrets
- 96% of faculty agreed that they were more prepared to spot warning signs and respond appropriately if a student discloses that they were sexually violated.

With the Molokai Sexual Violence Prevention Community Action Team, MCAPP staff is organizing the second annual Keiki Fest happening this Saturday, April 20th, here in Mitchell Pauole Center. In honor of Sexual Assault Awareness Month and Child Abuse Prevention Month, the event emphasizes the uplifting aspects of violence prevention, gathering the community to celebrate the worth and accomplishments of Molokai's children, youth and teens. We hope everyone here today from the Molokai community will attend for food, games, giveaways, contests, and education, all free of charge.

We do our best to address the sensitive topic of sexual abuse in a welcoming and sensitive way. Nonetheless, it is important to remember that prevention efforts address a hidden public health epidemic that is related to many of Molokai's more visible challenges. On average, nationally 1 in 4 girls and 1 in 6 boys experiences sexual abuse before the age of 18, 80% of perpetrators are someone the victim knows and trusts, and 30% of perpetrators are themselves under the age of 18. Sexual abuse in childhood has been linked to future substance abuse, suicide, depression, anxiety, incarceration, obesity, autoimmune disease, thyroid disease, reduced lifespan, and reduced economic security.

With a dedicated and creative staff, MCAPP is a lean and committed organization that works to make a big impact with limited resources. Financial support from Maui County is critical to ensuring that this important work continues. Dear Council Members,

My name is Matt Yamashita. I am a founding board member of Molokai Child Abuse Prevention Pathways (MCAPP) 501(c)3. I am a multi-generation Molokai resident born and raised, father of 3, entrepreneur, and previously served 2 full terms (6 years) as a board member at the Molokai Community Health Center. I know our Molokai community well and I also understand the condition of our people's health and where our greatest needs are.

It is no secret that Molokai experiences a higher than normal rate of substance abuse, domestic abuse, and suicide. Sadly, sexual violence is often the catalyst for these conditions. If we address the long hidden issue of sexual abuse prevalence on Molokai, we can begin to address the source, the very core, of many of the painful issues that so many families suffer from here.

Thanks to the work that MCAPP has done since 2012, we are ahead of the curve in addressing this problem. MCAPP has spent the past 7 years designing and implementing innovative, far reaching school (K-12) and community based prevention programs. These efforts have garnered the support of principals, teachers, police officers, counselors, parents, and clergy. We are teaching youth how to recognize and report sexual abuse, how to talk about it and who to talk about it with, and also how to express feelings and desires in healthy and appropriate ways, so that they do not perpetuate unhealthy patterns.

In 2018 we were awarded Maui County funding to help bolster our programs in 2019. Maui County's support is being used to enhance and continue our vital work in 2019. Our board and staff has been working overtime to pursue grants and other sources of funding and we have been successful. However, we will need Maui County's ongoing support to ensure the seamless continuation and expansion of our efforts in 2020.

Our organization deserves County funding because it has far reaching impacts on the health of our community. Our staff works directly with MPD in addressing and curbing incidences of sexual violence. They also work hand in hand with other social service providers. We go above and beyond our classroom-based prevention work by integrating our support/presence into

And we do all of this in a streamlined, economical manner that maximizes available resources thanks to our small team of incredibly resourceful and dedicated staff.

I urge you to please keep MCAPP in the County budget for 2020. Without the County's support we will very likely have to downsize our services when, in fact, we need to be expanding them.



Mahalo Council members for your time and ensuring the voice of the Molokai community is heard through this meeting. My name is U'ilani Kiaha and I am the Program Coordinator of Molokai Child Abuse Prevention Pathways (MCAPP). Paula Morelli (the founding MCAPP executive director, now a board member of MCAPP, and currently the Hawaii Program Director for the Consuelo Foundation, in Honolulu, Hawaii.) stated,

"In 2009, Consuelo Foundation conducted statewide research that determined that childhood sexual violence has intergenerationally undermined the wellbeing of its diverse citizens including the host culture Native Hawaiians. Over the last 6 years, the Consuelo Foundation invested in establishing MCAPP to secure the wellbeing of future generations with prevention education in order to establish and sustain a culture of safety on Molokai."

Our mission is to keep children safe and support 'ohana wellbeing by preventing sexual abuse, envisioning a Molokai where happy, healthy, children and families is everyone's kuleana. I have come into an organization who has worked with the schools and the community to prevent sexual violence through education. Kevin "Kealoha" Hooper and Andrea "Titi" Hernandez and other workers from the molokai community which includes practicum students from the UH Manoa Distance Learning under Myron B. Thompson School of Social Work worked hard to help MCAPP create and provide safety. As they have laid a foundation of sexual violence prevention education on Molokai, I am able to continue the work in the schools and with the new Lamaku Mentorship Program. Since becoming part of this team, I have seen a change with the middle school students I work with. They are understanding and can see how the protective skills they are learning can help themselves, help their peers, help their families, and their community. We are currently doing an awareness week (like a spirit week) where the students in Lamaku encourage their peers to be aware of sexual violence and themes on creating a culture of safety. Today's theme is, "It's never a victim's fault." Teaching students if sexual violence happens to them it's no their fault and if it happens to a friend, helping that friend know that it's not their fault and that you believe them create a culture of safety.



Maui County has increased the refuse pick up fees. Since I'm paying more for the same service, I support the refuse collection. The boys do a good job.






