Finding a nice, clean, SAFE place to live is tough, but finding all that an affordable cost is basically unheard of.

40% of jobs in Hawaii pay below living wage, and that is just unacceptable. The lack of affordable housing for people in the service industry is totally noticeable throughout our community, young and old. In order to continue living close to our families, friends, and jobs, we need to start thinking of and building affordable housing for the working class. Lahaina is a perfect, central location that makes riding a bike, walking, or taking a bus to work extremely convenient. Which in hand, would clear up traffic a bit, free up parking spaces for customers and locals, and also be beneficial to our environment!

It's terribly disheartening and discouraging as a young woman to be struggling to find affordable safe housing in my hometown.
