- Used by emergency vehicles, County & State construction crews, ect...



Dual Use Creates Unsafe Conditions


- Passing in unsafe conditions







Not yielding to local drivers



 Managing tourism on Hana Highway requires a multi-prong approach




Turn Out Law Used in Other States

In these states drivers are taught their responsibility to other drivers to use turn outs

TURNOUT AREAS AND LANES

Special "turnout" areas are sometimes marked on two-lane roads. Drive into these areas to allow cars behind you to pass. Some two-lane roads have passing lanes. If you are driving slowly on a two-lane highway or road where passing is unsafe, and 5 or more vehicles are following, you **must** drive into the turnout areas or lanes to let the vehicles pass.

Typical Turn Out Law

 A turn out is a patch of pavement on the right side of the road where slow drivers can pull off the road to let faster drivers go by.

 Turn out law creates a legal duty to pull over and let drivers go by where there are a number of drivers that want to go by.

The Turn Out law is one tool meant to work in conjunction with other efforts:

- Visitor education before driving highway
- Better signage, parking and bathroom facilities

Our Law Modeled After Other States

Our Proposed Law:

Upon a two-lane roadway where passing is unsafe because of traffic in the opposite direction or other conditions, any vehicle proceeding upon the roadway, behind which five or more vehicles are formed in a line, shall turn off the roadway at the nearest place designated as a turnout by signs erected by the authority having jurisdiction over the roadway, or wherever sufficient area for a safe turnout exists, in order to permit the vehicles following it to proceed.
