SUBJECT: AMENDMENT TO THE FISCAL YEAR 2020 BUDGET (OFFICE OF THE MAYOR, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM, ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION)

On behalf of the Office of Economic Development, I am transmitting the attached proposed bill for the purpose of deleting the proviso under the Economic Development Program, Grants and disbursements for Water and Environmental Resource Protection and Conservation, Environmental Protection that reads "Provided, that \$400,000 shall be for the containment and removal of miconia and other invasive species."

As stated in Committee Report 19-49, as amended, environmental protection is supported by several appropriations including "...for miconia and other invasive plants containment" which is more specific than the proviso in the budget ordinance that reads "containment and removal of miconia and other invasive species." The deletion of the proviso would eliminate the discrepancy in the intended use of the funds and allow the Office of Economic Development to grant the funds for axis deer management.
