


#### Location of "Holomua Junction"

- · Potable Water Planned.
- Price is \$1.4 million.
- Owner originally wanted \$2,983,163.







#### POSSIBLE USES:

- New and larger police station designed with the future of law enforcement on Moloka'i in mind, e.g. more officers, civilian staffing, police operations, programs, etc.
- Dormitory/barracks for police personnel.
- Room for training of police personnel.
- · Community room for classes and the Moloka'i EOC.
- · New designated landing zone for all of EMS air(Police, Fire, and Ambulance).
- · Returning Moloka'i Radio Dispatch under one roof.
- Storage for evidence(buildings and impound lot).
- Safer prisoner holding facilities (Sallie Port).
- Firing range (outdoor or modular indoor).
- Room for other county departments (Department of Motor Vehicles, Real Property Tax Office, etc.).

## Meeting the proposed Moloka'i Community Plan with this site

- 9.02.02 Continue working cooperatively with the Prosecuting Attorney and the Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) to enforce Substance Abuse laws.
- 9.02.03 Coordinate land acquisition, planning, design, and construction of a new Moloka'i Police Station at a location that meets the unique needs of the Molokai People. Out of the flood zone/hazard area and tsunami evacuation zone, and promotes practical and safe emergency response for the entire Moloka'i community.
- 9.02.06 Explore the possibility of collaborating with an animal rescue organization to establish an animal holding facility on Moloka'i.

- Out of the flood/inundation zone.
- Central location on the island.
- Five times larger than a previously looked at property in the Moloka'i Industrial Park.
- Property is flat with soil.
- Clear of large black rock.
- The cost has been negotiated with the landowner.
- Currently it's not in a location that is culturally sensitive.
- Economic engine for the Moloka'i community for jobs in construction with the possibility for many more diversified jobs in the future.



- The cost of Moloka'i construction can be higher than any place in the state possibly necessitating building in phases.
- Removal of structures or sell the buildings to recoup some costs.
- The property is not on county sewage; currently there are two septic tanks for the existing structures.
- Although it's moving five minutes out of Kaunakakai we must still have a plan for community presence.



- Funds have been allocated to purchase the property.
- Always including the Moloka'i community in the process.
- Being fiscally responsible and doing things right in the early planning and construction phases to avoid problems in the future.





- In Hawai'i, Pono means "living with a conscious decision to do the right thing in terms of self, others, and the environment."
- It's our unique culture which is also found in our state's motto: "Ua Mau ke Ea o ka Aina i ka Pono," or "the life of the land is perpetuated in righteousness."
- The new Molokai Police Station will be handled with Pono from start to finish.
