STATION FUEL TANK REPLACEMENT

On behalf of the Department of Police, I am transmitting the attached proposed bills to amend the Fiscal Year 2020 Budget, Appendix C, and Bond Authorization for the purpose of adding an appropriation for the Wailuku Police Station Fuel Tank Replacement project.

Because of the nature of the project, the Department hired a consultant to address the requirements of the Environmental Protection Agency in developing the specifications of the project. Bids were opened on November 12, 2019, with the lowest bid at \$450,500. A copy of the bid result is attached for your reference.

The project was appropriated in FY 2019 for \$250,000 from the General Fund of which \$81,289 was expended for a consultant. The remaining appropriation of approximately \$168,000 lapsed on December 31, 2019. The Department is requesting an appropriation in the Fiscal Year 2020 Budget in order to proceed with the project.

A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 4985, BILL NO. 34 (2019), RELATING TO THE ISSUANCE OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI ISSUANCE, SALE AND DELIVERY OF SAID BONDS (DEPARTMENT OF POLICE – WAILUKU POLICE STATION FUEL TANK REPLACEMENT)

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI:

SECTION 1. Ordinance No. 4985, Bill No. 34 (2019), is amended by amending Section 1 to read as follows:

"SECTION 1. Authorization of General Obligation Bonds. Pursuant to Chapter 47, Hawaii Revised Statutes, as amended, and particularly Part I thereof, there are hereby authorized to be issued and sold from time to time general obligation bonds of the County of Maui, State of Hawaii (the "County") in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed [\$52,277,700] \$52,728,200 (the "Bonds"), the proceeds derived from the sale of which shall be used to pay all or part of the cost of appropriations for the public improvements of the County described in Section 2 hereof."

SECTION 2. Ordinance No. 4985, Bill No. 34 (2019), is amended by amending Section 2 to read as follows:

"SECTION 2. <u>Disposition of Bond Proceeds</u>. All or any portion of the proceeds derived from the sale of the Bonds or any notes issued in anticipation of the Bonds shall be used to pay all or part of the cost of any of the public improvements listed below in accordance with appropriations contained in the Fiscal Year 2020 Budget, including amendments and supplements thereto, duly approved by the Council of the County (the "Council") for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2020 (the "Fiscal Year 2020 Budget"); provided, however, that pursuant to Section 47-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the part of such proceeds which are in excess of the amounts required for the purposes for which the Bonds are initially issued from time to time, or which may not be applied to such purposes, or which the Council deems should not be applied to such

purposes, may be applied to finance such other public improvements of the County as the Council shall, by ordinance approved by an affirmative vote of two-thirds of all of its members, determine; and provided further that the actual use and application of the proceeds of Bonds issued pursuant to this ordinance shall not in any way affect the validity or legality of such Bonds. No proceeds of the Bonds shall be applied to any public improvement listed in this section unless and until there shall be a valid appropriation of general obligation bond proceeds in effect for such public improvement. The public improvements provided for or to be provided for in the Fiscal Year 2020 Budget, to be financed with proceeds from the sale of the Bonds, are as follows:
