The Department of Transportation (MDOT) hereby transmit the following responses following the Economic Development Budget Committee meeting on Wednesday, April 15, 2020 at 9 a.m.:

Question: Did the department receive any direct stimulus funds? Outside of the CARES ACT?

Response: The department was notified by Hawaii Department of Transportation through

the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) that CARES ACT funds are being

allocated for public transportation.

Question: Regarding: MEO Bus Replacement Grant, what are the plans for the

decommissioning of the buses? (TP)

Response: Once vehicles are deemed unsafe and not drivable, they are stripped of essential

parts and then recycled. No vehicles are sold or donated.

Question: Regarding: MEO Bus Replacement Grant, what are the discussions with MEO

about cutting the fleet replacements? (MM)

Response: The department has been keeping MEO informed with regards to the potential

postponement of their MEO Bus Replacement Grant request. They are aware of

this recommendation.

Question: What is the department doing to meet COVID-19 requirements for Route

adjustments? Equipment adjustments? (RH)

Response: The department has been reviewing and evaluating the various transportation

services. At this point in time, due to the extreme decrease in ridership caused by the Mayor's Public Health Emergency Rules, the department has suspended the following routes for the Maui Bus Fixed Route program and the Maui Bus

Commuter program.

Maui Bus Fixed Route Program:

- Wailuku Reverse Route #2
- Kahului Reverse Route #6
- Kihei Villager Route #15
- Ka'anapali Islander Route #25

Maui Bus Commuter Program:

- Commuter Route #3 Uhaul to Kapalua
- Commuter Route Kihei to Kapalua

- Suspended the Makawao portion of the Commuter Route from Makawao to Kapalua, bus now departs from Uhaul to Kapalua
- Suspended the Haiku portion of the Commuter Route from Haiku to Kapalua, bus now departs from Uhaul to Kapalua

The Maui Bus ADA Paratransit and Human Services Transportation Programs have also seen a decrease in ridership as those are more "on-demand" type service as well as many of the programs riders are attending have been shut down due to COVID-19.

Where possible, the department has notified the contractors to utilize different size buses on the various programs based on the demand. As an example, for the commuter service, it was a requirement to provide motor coach type buses on each route, however, with certain runs being lighter than others, smaller buses have been placed on those routes.

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Question: Provide an update on the CARES Act Funding for the Department of

Transportation. (KRF)

Response: The department was notified that CARES Act funding was being allocated for the

County of Maui for Public Transportation usage. The amount is \$7,864,323.00. The department is working closely with the Hawaii Department of Transportation (HDOT) and the Budget office on its uses. The County is working on the grant application and will need to get approval by the HDOT in order to use the funds. Three percent has been allocated for HDOT for admin fees. Once HDOT give approval, grant revenues from FY2020 will be utilized to access those

funds.

The following expenses are being proposed: enhanced cleaning of the buses, personal protective equipment costs, administrative leave for transit workers, driver protection shields for the public transit buses and supplemental loss revenues for the current fiscal year. Additional continuing expenses are being estimated for FY2021.
