

REQUESTING RELEASE OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BOND FUNDS FOR IMPORTANT AGRICULTURAL LANDS (IAL) REPORT, COUNTY OF MAUI PROJECT NO. PD-20-02, AUTHROIZED BY ACT 40, SLH 2019, ITEM 30-K22

This letter is a request for the release of \$125,000 in general obligation bond funds for the subject Project.

This request consists of: the release of \$125,000 for a Maui County IAL Report to include technical studies, community engagement, identification of proposed incentives and preliminary proposed mapping. The Report will focus on the Agricultural lands within the islands of Maui, and if funding is sufficient, the islands of Molokai and Lanai. (See Attached: Project Location Map).

The Report will consist of two primary components: Recommendations for incentives for the designation and use of IAL. And the analysis for the recommendation of identification of specific lands for IAL designation.

Incentives are intended to promote agricultural viability, sustained growth of the agricultural industry and long-term agricultural use, and protection of these productive agricultural lands. The analysis and identification of proposed IAL will provide information and locations of lands that are capable of producing sustained high agricultural yields when treated and managed according to accepted farming and ranching methods and technology. The Report will also identify potential delineated blocks of productive agricultural land and areas of agricultural activity for protection from the encroachment of or transition to nonagricultural uses.

2. Additional information and comments:

The people of Hawai'i have a substantial interest in the health and sustainability of agriculture as an industry in the State. There is a compelling State interest in conserving the State's agricultural land resource base and assuring the long-term availability of agricultural lands for agricultural use to achieve the purposes of conserving and protecting agricultural lands, promoting diversified agriculture, increasing agricultural self-sufficiency and food security, and assuring the availability of agriculturally suitable lands.

Pursuant to Act 183, SLH 2005, each of the counties is required to develop maps of potential lands to be considered for designation as important agricultural lands in consultation and cooperation with land owners, the Department of Agriculture, agricultural interest groups, and other relevant organizations and stakeholders. Act 183 also requires each of the counties to develop incentive programs for areas designated as IAL.

The completion of an IAL Report for Maui County which includes a robust community engagement process, technical analysis, and engagement with relevant organizations and governmental entities, in order to recommend necessary incentives and designated IAL areas will establish a guiding document to serve as a decision-making tool for the community, agricultural land owners, the Maui County Council and the State Land Use Commission for the implementation of requirements for performance outlined in Act 183, SLH 2005.

The County of Maui has appropriated \$125,000 for IAL identification and mapping Fiscal Year 2020 budget (See Attached: County of Maui FY 2020 Budget Ordinance No. 4988 Excerpts, Item 12.a.(1)(iii)). The County of Maui has also recognized the anticipated receipt of \$125,000 from the State of Hawai'i for this Project in the Fiscal Year 2020 budget within Item 12.a(1)(iii) of the County of Maui FY 2020 Budget Ordinance No. 4988.

The Project is anticipated to bid in March of 2020.



A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE OPERATING BUDGET FOR THE COUNTY OF MAUI FOR THE FISCAL YEAR JULY 1, 2019 TO JUNE 30, 2020

SECTION 1. This ordinance may be referred to as the "Fiscal Year 2020 Budget."
