QV's Preliminary Research Supporting Establishment of Maui County Department of Agriculture

Definitions (according to USDA Economic Research Service)

Direct Marketing (or Direct-to-Consumer Marketing): "Local food marketing arrangement in which producers sell agricultural products directly to the final consumers, such as sales to consumers through Farmers' markets, CSAs or farm stands."

Studies assessing economic impacts of local food systems

A handful of research studies from various geographies in the US show that local food sales result in greater regional sales, employment, and GDP.

1. Sacramento Region Case Study:

- For every dollar of sales, direct marketers in the Sacramento Region generated twice as much economic activity within the region compared to producers who were not involved in direct marketing.
- Direct marketers generated \$0.44 additional output within the Sacramento Region for every dollar of production compared to producers not engaged in direct marketing.
- "Greater economic impact of direct market producers [was] primarily attributable to the much larger percentage of their inputs being purchased within the region (89 percent versus 45 percent)."

2. Missouri and Nebraska Case Study:

- Local food producers added significantly greater contribution to GDP than conventional foods. Local foods had a greater multiplier effect of an additional 0.47 to 0.69 points, compared to conventional agricultural sales.
- There are even greater *indirect* employment and sales generated by local food systems.

3. West Virginia, Oklahoma, Iowa, and Mississippi Case Studies:

West Virginia: 34 farmers markets yielded a gross increase of 119 jobs, \$2.4M increase in output, \$700k increase in income



- **Oklahoma:** 21 farmers markets yielded **a** gross increase of 113 jobs, \$5.9M increase in output, \$2.2M increase in income
- lowa: 152 farmers markets yielded a gross increase of 576 jobs, \$59.4M increase in output, \$17.8M increase in income
- Mississippi: 26 farmers markets yielded a gross increase of 16 jobs, \$1.6M increase in output, \$200k increase in come

Environmental and health impacts of local food systems

- 4. While there is mixed data regarding the carbon footprint of local food systems, flying food for exports and imports do result in significant greenhouse gas emissions. Having a local food system in Maui County would significantly reduce emissions from transporting food.
 - In 2018, transportation was the #1 source of US greenhouse gases with a 28% share of greenhouse gas emissions, whereas agriculture ranked #5 with a 10% share of greenhouse gas emissions.

5. Richer, more diverse nutrition in locally produced and consumed fruits and veggies

Hawaii's leading causes of death in 2017 were heart disease, cancer, and stroke. Up to 80% of heart disease and stroke are preventable with a healthier diet and lifestyle. Having greater access to nutritious foods can help prevent such cardiovascular diseases that currently cost up to \$1B a day in the US.

Aloha,

My name is Michelle Kwik; I live in Haiku on Ag land and have spent the last 6 years growing mostly fruit and nut trees as well as raising chickens and a vegetable garden. I am a retired School Nurse, RN, BSN, PHN, M.Ed. School Nurse. It has been a lot of work trying to figure out trees that will do well where I live, how to care for them so they produce in the rain and with all of the wind, how to nourish the trees to grow in old pineapple fields that have been decimated, and how to build farm sheds and get them approved. Life would have been much easier with a little guidance from an Ag Department. I probably would have not have spent so much money on trees that do not work well here in Haiku for example mangos. There is so much to learn and since we have so many micro-climates people really need the guidance and support of an Ag Department.

One of the reasons I bought into Ag land is because I am passionate about food security and I believe especially on Maui we need to make sure we can produce our own food since we are in the middle of the Pacific. Covid 19/20 has shown us what happens to the economy without tourism. If we had food growing we would not need so much of our economy based on tourism; we could feed ourselves without the large food bills from importing all of our food. Also, due to having all people on this planet slow down we can see our environment healing; we need to make this part of our norm. We can not return to devastating our environment. All life on this planet depends on what our next steps are. There is a probability that more viruses can occur that are harsh on our bodies due to our environmental toxic behaviors and greed. Animals are at risk to have crazy mutated viruses and that places us at risk. Even if the virus came from one of the conspiracy theories out there, it does not matter, it can happen again and it probably will. The biggest lesson we received from this virus is we need to slow down and heal the planet and provide all of our basic needs and not depend as much on money/tourism. Tourism must be monitored to keep the balance in check to make this place an amazing island to live and heal our bodies and the bodies/spirits of the people visiting here. People can come and do Ag projects, help heal this sacred land, and spend time in nature healing themselves.

It is crazy we do not already have an Ag Department on Maui that is funded even more than tourism. It is Hawaii, indigenous peoples always took care of the earth, the oceans, the animals, and each other. We need to start that tradition again. We need to do everything we can to return to balance and sustainability. At the school district I worked at in Encinitas California, we had 9,000 children 3-13 years of age. The Encinitas School District grew food at every school and they had one site just as a Farm for all of the schools and all of the students. Each class was to spend one week at the farm a school year, as part of the curriculum. If an Ag Department wants to educate students on sustainability there is curriculum written for all of the elementary grades already and it is available. Also, each school has an organic salad bar for students, teachers, and all staff to eat from. I think teachers have to pay a little more since they eat way more than the children. An Ag department can put together curriculum.

Also, not many people realize the potential Ag loans out there and how to get them. An Ag department can help educate people on getting the loans and teach people how to create working successful farms in each of the diverse climatic areas. There are many mentors that can be helpful if there was a place to gather the info and disperse it to everyone. My dream is for all families to have Ag land if they want it, they can build tiny homes to start and grow food and pay the same on the loan as they would rent, approx. 1,600 a month for 2 acres, the land, and the farm infrastructure. I know a person who is doing it right now with an AG loan. An Ag Department can also help the county divide the farm land up so a large piece can be bought by the county and sold for a much cheaper price and split into lots for Ag development. We need to find and create avenues to do this for the people without trying to profit a bunch of companies and specific peoples pockets. It needs to be from the county to the citizens for the purpose of growing food, textiles, etc., processing goods and distributing.

We can even create a team of military youth whos only purpose is to care for the environment via restoring the reefs, replanting them, growing food organically, catching rainwater to drink, building small homes, putting in solar panels,

replanting forests with koa, sandalwood, whatever will grow well in each area. These youth can stay in some of the resorts. What a gift of giving and receiving. What youth would not want to come and stay in a resort area and create heaven on earth on Maui. There can even be an incentive program to work and receive 5 years of no payment on land with a 0 interest loan for 40 years. If we have an Ag Department who is given what they need they can even coordinate tourism into it. We need this right now so badly. It must be a sustainable department where they use organic methods so the reefs can regrow and the whales, dolphins, turtles, drinking water, food, and people can thrive and be safe. Public Testimony Regarding PROPOSED CHARTER AMENDMENTS (ESTABLISHING A DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE) (GET-10(15))

Aloha GET Committee Chair Molina and Members,

I am writing with enthusiastic support of the PROPOSED CHARTER AMENDMENTS (ESTABLISHING A DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE) (GET-10(15)) with possible amendments.

I want to be certain the title and scope of the amendments are accurately defined and understood to reflect what we are actually hoping to accomplish....a transformative transition to a more livable future that reflects our best values and ideals.

Please carefully consider an important change in the title. I suggest the Proposed Charter Amendments be titled "A Department of Regenerative Agriculture and Aquaculture".

Why include "Regenerative"?

In biology, **regeneration** is the process of renewal, restoration, and growth that makes genomes (microorganisms), cells, organisms, and

ecosystems resilient to natural fluctuations or events that cause disturbance or damage. Every species is capable of **regeneration**, from bacteria to humans.

What some currently describe as "conventional" agriculture is not actually conventional or regenerative. Traditional and regenerative practices over many centuries of human history are more accurately described as conventional. The inaccurately described "conventional" agriculture is, in fact, largely post World War II chemically based agriculture.

In stark contrast, traditional Hawaiian culture and practices were and are are "Regenerative" and restorative. Historically, pre contact Hawai'i was self sufficient in food. Self sufficiency regarding food is the basic recognition of need for this proposed charter amendment.

Why include "Aquaculture"?

Aquaculture involves the breeding, rearing, and harvesting of freshwater and marine species of fish, shellfish, and aquatic plants. Producers farm in all types of water environments, including ponds, rivers, lakes, oceans, and land-based, closed recirculating-water systems.

The recognition of "Aquaculture" in the amendment title recognizes, respects and honors Hawaiian Loko (fishponds) and Lo'i Kalo (taro patch). **Hawaiian Loko and Lo'i Kalo are a good example of aquaculture at its finest.** The restoration and renewal of Molokai Loko is an important, incredible and fortunate opportunity to recognize in the context of this proposal. Please consider Moloka'i 'Āina Momona (meaning land of abundance).

Again, I suggest the Proposed Charter Amendments be titled "A Department of Regenerative Agriculture and Aquaculture".

I also suggest the Maui County Council be authorized by law to confirm or reject the appointment of the appointed Department of Regenerative Agriculture and Aquaculture Director and Deputy Director.

These appointments are vitally important. The appointees should go through a public and constructive confirmation process.

Aloha Chair Molina and the GET Committee-

I am submitting testimony for the Ag Working Group on the proposed Charter Amendment GET-10(15) Establishing a Department of Agriculture.

We would first like to thank Councilmember Sinenci and his staff, and Jennifer Karaca for creating this proposed amendment. There are so many good ideas here! It is clear that there is support, energy and enthusiasm for enabling successful agriculture in Maui County. The Ag Working Group has been working with the administration to improve county processes related to agriculture, farmers and ranchers since 2013. We believe more formalized county support will help existing departments understand better how to ensure farmers and ranchers receive the benefits the county has legislated, thereby increasing the success of our farmers and ranchers and the well-being of our whole community.

We are truly sorry we have not had the opportunity to discuss this more within our group and with the other groups we represent – Maui County Farm Bureau, Farmers Union, Maui Cattlemens Association, Maui Coffee Association, Kula Community Association, and others.

The Ag Working Group has submitted several proposed amendments to Councilmember Sinenci which we think will help support the existing language and create the sort of department we think will most help our existing and future agriculture businesses and our whole Maui community.

These amendments would enable us to support the proposed charter amendment. We are hoping for the opportunity to continue to work on the Charter Amendment language.

These are the amendments we would like to see:

Proposed Amendments for Ag Dept Charter Amendment Resolution submitted by the Ag Working Group to Shane Sinenci, Gina Flammer and Jennifer Karaca, June 21, 2020

1. Require the director to have agriculture experience. Change the paragraph describing the Director qualifications to:

"The director of the department of agriculture shall be appointed by the mayor with the approval of the council, and may be removed by the mayor with the approval of the council. The director of the agriculture department must have a minimum of five years of experience in the field of agriculture, at least three of which shall have been in an administrative capacity, either in public service, private business, or both.

The director and deputy director must have a bachelor's degree or master's degree in operations management, project management, public administration, agriculture, sustainability, or a related field, or a combination of education and work experience substantially equivalent to such a bachelor's degree."

2. We believe certain positions would be most helpful to the agriculture community in working with the county administration, and would like the language to be specific about critical staff positions. **Section 8-18.1. Organization** would be changed to read:

"There is a department of agriculture consisting of a director, deputy director, and necessary staff <u>including but not limited to an advocate/ombudsperson</u>, <u>inspectors</u>, and <u>grant writers</u>; organized to fulfill the department's powers, duties, and functions through the establishment of necessary and appropriate divisions and other means."

3. Change the wording in the Powers, Duties and Functions section to eliminate overlaps with other agencies. It could read: 1. Establish divisions within the department to provide, perform, and coordinate actions, propose and implement policies in the county to minimize barriers and incentivize growth in the agricultural sector in collaboration and consultation with existing agricultural support agencies including NRCS, FSA, DOA, CTAHR, Maui School Garden network and all Maui school agriculture programs, MISC, NASS, and relevant county agencies (Planning, Water, etc.).

This is also addressed in the following change in the description of the powers,

This is also addressed in the following change in the description of the powers, duties and functions of the department.

4. Simplify the language to allow greater flexibility for the department to be established and grow to achieve the aspirations in the current version and in the presentation from Jennifer Karaca at the EACP meeting presentation. Pattern the description after other department descriptions in the Charter. More specifics can be defined in the County Code.

Here's how it would read:

"Section 8-18.3. Powers, Duties, and Functions.

The director of agriculture must:

- 1. Implement the Policies, Goals and Actions related to Agriculture described in the Maui Island Plan, including but not limited to:
 - a. Build the economic resiliency of the county's communities by increasing opportunities in the agricultural sector.
 - b. Promote healthy ecosystems and implement programs that ensure the sustainable utilization of major natural resources, such as land, water, air, minerals, forests, fisheries, wild flora and fauna, and waste streams.
 - c. Support ordinances, programs, and policies that promote the countywide availability of affordable agricultural-zoned land and water for farmers

and ranchers, agricultural workforce housing, agricultural equipment, and processing and distribution facilities.

- 2. In coordination with the mayor and director of finance, secure federal, state, and private funding and provide grants and grant writing services to agricultural related businesses in the County.
- 3. Organize programs and opportunities to provide on-site assistance to farmers and ranchers.
- 4. Serve as the County's liaison to the agricultural sector.
- 5. Enable a successful agricultural sector through advocacy and assistance in complying with County, state, and federal regulations and permitting requirements.
- 6. Develop and implement programs to diversify and expand sustainable forms of agriculture. Collaborate and consult with existing agricultural support agencies including NRCS, FSA, DOA, CTAHR, Maui School Garden network and school agriculture programs, MISC, NASS, MPD and relevant county agencies.
- 7. Perform agricultural property inspections as county departments require.
- 8. Support programs that position the county's agricultural products as premium export products.
- 9. Advise the council and other agencies on policies and practices relating to contracts, procurement, and transportation that help reduce the need to import agricultural products and expand opportunities to export agricultural products.
- 10. Report to the mayor and council annually on the County's overall performance in meeting agriculture objectives and any barriers that could be addressed by ordinance.
- 11. Perform other duties and functions as assigned by the mayor or managing director."
- 5. To help more voters support the amendment, change the wording of the ballot question to:

"Shall the Charter be amended, effective July 1, 2022 to establish a Department of Agriculture to <u>support</u> a <u>viable</u> regional agricultural system for Maui County by strengthening community preparedness <u>to avoid</u> food shortages, building the resiliency of our island communities by increasing economic opportunities in the agricultural sector <u>providing access</u> to more locally grown produce and promoting healthy <u>farms</u> and ranches through <u>soil regeneration</u> and <u>best practices?</u>"
