- Decreased snow cover and melting earlier

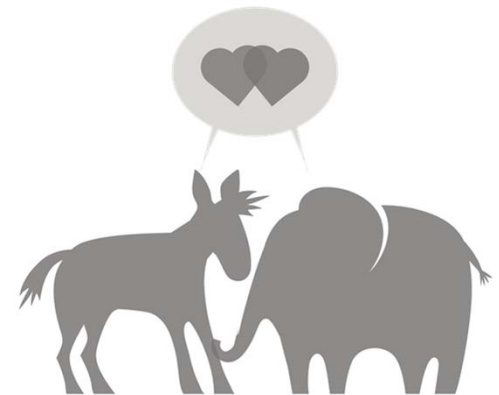

Bipartisan

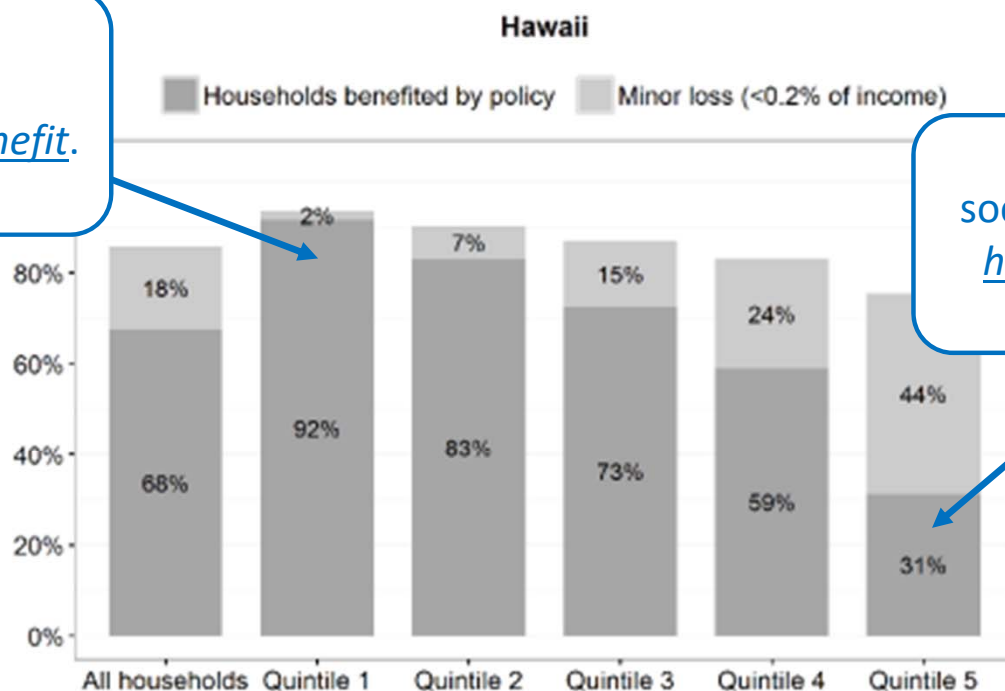

Energy Innovation AND Carbon Dividend Act

Those lower on the socioeconomic ladder benefit.



Those high on the socioeconomic ladder have higher CO₂ footprint, but losses are minor.

Energy Innovation AND Carbon Dividend Act

How it works

Very limited adjustments: NO rollback on regulations based on other pollutants, auto mileage standards, water quality and more. Prevents additional regulations on CO2 emissions as long emission targets are being met. EPA regulatory authority over emissions is restored if not met in 10 years.
