This is to inform you that we have received preliminary approval of our FY2020-2021 Coastal Zone Management (CZM) grant-in-aid award. Subject to availability of funds, we intend to commit to the County of Maui, via a twelve (12)-month supplemental contract, a sum of \$447,706.00 for its participation in the FY2020-2021 work program. The budget is as follows:

The execution of the twelve-month contract extension has proven to be more efficient than execution of a single-year contract, beginning July 1, 2020. The twelve (12)-month supplemental contract will require the County to provide at least \$404,308.00 worth of matching non-federal funds or services-in-kind for FY2020-2021, and time sheets and other eligible documentation must be prepared and filed with us for credit.

# A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE OPERATING BUDGET FOR THE COUNTY OF MAUI FOR THE FISCAL YEAR JULY 1, 2020 TO JUNE 30, 2021

### BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI:

SECTION 1. This ordinance may be referred to as the "Fiscal Year 2021 Budget."
