APPROVING FOR INCLUSION IN THE 2021 HAWAII STATE ASSOCIATION OF COUNTIES LEGISLATIVE PACKAGE A STATE BILL RELATING TO TOBACCO PRODUCTS

WHEREAS, tobacco use continues to be a public health problem in Hawaii, causing approximately 1,400 deaths per year among adults and costs approximately \$526,000,000 in direct health care expenditures and \$387,300,000 in lost productivity in the State; and

WHEREAS, in response to the heavy burden of tobacco, Hawaii has enacted many tobacco control policies including clean indoor air ordinances and raising the age of sale of tobacco products from 18 to 21; and

WHEREAS, many of these initiatives were led by the counties and were later adopted at the state level, extending these protections statewide and ultimately saving the state \$1 billion in healthcare costs over 10 years; and

WHEREAS, in 2006, the legislature expressely allowed local jurisdictions to pass smoking ordinances more stringent than state law under section 328J-15, Hawaii Revised Statutes; and

WHEREAS, counties have adopted and put into action some of the most innovative and effective tobacco control policies that served as catalysts for changing social norms about tobacco use, discouraged young people from initiating tobacco use, and encouraged adult tobacco users to quit; and

WHEREAS, while it is important to establish minimum protections statewide, local level policies are integral to tobacco control because they enable a targeted approach to reduce health disparities; now, therefore,

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TOBACCO PRODUCTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 328J-15, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 amended to read as follows: 2 3 "[+]§328J-15[+] County ordinances. (a) Nothing in this 4 chapter shall be construed to supersede or in any manner affect 5 a county smoking ordinance[+] and the authority of any county to 6 adopt and enforce additional ordinances or rules that regulate 7 the sale of cigarettes, tobacco products, and electronic smoking 8 devices; provided that the ordinance or rule is at least as 9 protective of the rights of nonsmokers as this chapter. 10 (b) Nothing in this chapter shall prohibit a county from 11 enacting ordinances or rules more stringent than this chapter. 12 SECTION 2. Section 328J-11.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 13 repealed. 14 ["[\$328J-11.5] Statewide concern. (a) Sales of eigarettes, 15 tobacco products, and electronic smoking devices are a statewide 16 concern. It is the intent of the legislature to regulate the 17 sale of eigarettes, tobacco products, and electronic smoking 18 devices in a uniform and exclusive manner.
