I was born in the Olowalu Teachers Cottage and that building still stands to this day as a private, renovated residence. I am named after the Maile of Mt Lihau. I inherited my property from William Keahonui Hoopii, a former schoolteacher and principal at Olowalu School. Historically the property I live on was the former home of Chiefess Kalola, sister to King Kahekili. Kalola lived with her husband, Kaopuiki, the primary cause of the historic Olowalu Massacre. Two parcels away is where her servants resided. My kupuna originated from Olowalu, Ukumehame and Lahaina.

I tell you all this because in true Hawaiian tradition and culture, one must provide sufficient information about oneself before he/she receives authority and jurisdiction to speak on behalf of his/her community. In other words, I am compelled to prove my relationship to the ahupuaa of Olowalu before I can rightfully express my opinion regarding it.
